The day before his departure, Trump delivered a 19-minute televised address to the American people, saying it was "an honor beyond description" to serve as President, and he believes "the best is yet to come."

(Extended excerpts of Trump's remarks follow this article.)

The evening of the 2020 election, on November 3, Trump was



ahead in the vote count in the so-called battleground states, indicating that he was well on the way to re-election. But in the middle of the night, thousands of mail-in ballots appeared, and the tide turned. Even though the President earned 74 million votes — more than any presidential candidate in history, vote counts in those battleground states rose Biden's count to 82 million — even more than Barack Obama had in his victorious terms.

Trump's team declared it was fraud, and even though his attorneys had affidavits from poll workers who said they saw examples of votes being double counted or not counted at all, and that electronic voting machines changed votes from Trump to Biden, all of the charges were rejected by several courts.

On January 6, as the electoral votes were counted, Trump still would not concede the election, and massive numbers of his supporters gathered in Washington to rally in his support. According to unitedvoice.com, protesters in the crowd entered the Capitol building, and several deaths took place. Democrats immediately blamed the violence on the president stirring up the crowd, but the website pointed out that the incident seemed fishy from the beginning. Then, videos circulating on social media seemed to confirm suspicions.

Many Trump supporters believe Antifa agitators dressed like them in order to gaslight the public into believing Conservatives were attacking the Capitol. In a video recording posted on Twitter, a young, unnamed man is seen saying he just left the protest at the Capitol and has a "big bruise" on his leg. He said he had a "difficult time pulling off the act that [he] was paid to do." The man went on to "confess" that he was paid to "pretend to protest." He refused to say who gave him the money, but said it was an "organized effort."

The media played scenes of rioting in Washington over and over, unlike what they did last summer when Antifa and BLM were burning down American cities, and Congress used those riots to punt on its responsibility to "defend and protect" the Constitution. It refused to look at the irregularities and constitutional violations in the battleground states, and it ignored the ballot harvesting that happened with COVID as the excuse.

According to WND.com, Congress certified the Electoral College vote for Biden in the middle of the night, just like how

Jesus was convicted by the Jewish high priests in the middle of the night, just like five states committed election fraud last November 3-4 in the middle of the night.

Washingtonwatch.org said, "What we're witnessing right now is the single biggest attempted coup of a sitting President that America has ever seen. President Donald J. Trump has been targeted for removal NOT by the American people, but by the Fake News media, Big Tech, and the Swamp Rats that are infesting Washington."

In congressional testimony, Ohio's **Jim Jordan** said the Republicans who objected to the Electoral College vote were only doing something Democrats have done before, such as when they objected to the 2016 vote for Trump. Jordan said Democrats cannot accept that Republicans are ever right on anything. "Democrats can raise bail for rioters and looters this summer, but somehow when Republicans condemn all the violence – the violence this summer, the violence last week – somehow we're wrong?," he asked.

Florida Congressman Bill Posey, a staunch Trump supporter, was one of 13 Florida House members who opposed certifying the results of the Electoral College, but when that effort failed, he struck a more conciliatory tone, congratulating the victors and calling on both parties to work together going forward, saying "we will continue to have disagreement about policies and direction, but at the end of the day we are all fellow Americans and we must respect each other and work for the greater good of the American people."

The Democrat Congress – led by House Speaker Nancy Pelosi – then used the rioting excuse, blamed on the President, to impeach him a second time. The House voted 232-197, with ten RINOs joining the impeachment call. They are House Republican Conference Chair Liz Cheney of Wyoming, Anthony Gonzalez of Ohio, Jaime Herrera Beutler and Dan Newhouse of Washington State, John Katko of New York, Adam Kinzinger of Illinois, Peter Meijer and Fred Upton of Michigan, Tom Rice of South Carolina, and David Valadao of California.

Arkansas Republican Senator Tom Cotton said of the next step that the Senate lacks constitutional authority to hold an impeachment trial for the President once he leaves office. "The Founders designed the impeachment process as a way to remove officeholders from public office — not an inquest against private citizens," he said.

Trump, after finally acknowledging his defeat, did say there would be an "orderly transition on January 20", but that he will skip the inauguration of President-elect Joe Biden, and officially take Air Force One to Florida before the noon expiration of his term of office. There was a 21-gun salute for him at Joint Base Andrews outside Washington, DC.

Since he was still President upon departure, Trump did have with him the nuclear "football" – the heavy briefcase that's always with the president, who can use it to control America's nuclear weapons. Traditionally, it is handed off by the outgoing commander in chief to the incoming president at the

inauguration, but since Trump did not attend the inauguration, a different scenario played out.

A military aide who carries the "football" remained physically close to the president. Another military aide with a second nuclear football handed that one over to Biden once he was sworn in, and the military aide with Trump brought the first one – now deactivated – back to Washington.

TRUMP DELIVERS FAREWELL ADDRESS

President Donald Trump, in televised remarks delivered to the American people on his last day in office, thanked them for the honor and privilege of serving them, and said that even though he is leaving, "I go from this majestic place with a loyal and joyful heart, an optimistic spirit, and a supreme confidence that for our country and for our children, the best is yet to come."



He reminisced about accomplishments his administration was able to achieve during his four years in office and stressed that his agenda "was not about right or left, it wasn't about Republican or Democrat, but about the good of a nation, and that means the whole nation."

Following are extensive excerpts of his address:

(Begin excerpts)

To serve as your President has been an honor beyond description. Thank you for this extraordinary privilege. And that's what it is – a great privilege and a great honor. We must never forget that while Americans will always have our disagreements, we are a nation of incredible, decent, faithful, and peace-loving citizens who all want our country to thrive and flourish and be very, very successful and good. We are a truly magnificent nation....

Together with millions of hardworking patriots across this land, we built the greatest political movement in the history of our country. We also built the greatest economy in the history of the world. It was about "America First" because we all wanted to make America great again. We restored the principle that a nation exists to serve its citizens. Our agenda was not about right or left, it wasn't about Republican or Democrat, but about the good of a nation, and that means the whole nation....

We passed the largest package of tax cuts and reforms in American history. We slashed more job-killing regulations than any administration had ever done before. We fixed our broken trade deals, withdrew from the horrible Trans-Pacific Partnership and the impossible Paris Climate Accord, renegotiated the one-sided South Korea deal, and we replaced NAFTA with the groundbreaking USMCA – that's Mexico and Canada – a deal that's worked out very, very well.

Also, and very importantly, we imposed historic and monumental tariffs on China; made a great new deal with China. But before the ink was even dry, we and the whole world got hit with the China virus. Our trade relationship was rapidly changing, billions and billions of dollars were pouring into the U.S., but the virus forced us to go in a different direction....

When our nation was hit with the terrible pandemic, we produced not one, but two vaccines with record-breaking speed, and more will quickly follow. They said it couldn't be done but we did it. They call it a "medical miracle," and that's what they're calling it right now: a "medical miracle." Another administration would have taken 3, 4, 5, maybe even up to 10 years to develop a vaccine. We did in nine months. We grieve for every life lost, and we pledge in their memory to wipe out this horrible pandemic once and for all.

When the virus took its brutal toll on the world's economy, we launched the fastest economic recovery our country has ever seen. We passed nearly \$4 trillion in economic relief, saved or supported over 50 million jobs, and slashed the unemployment rate in half. These are numbers that our country has never seen before. We created choice and transparency in healthcare, stood up to big pharma in so many ways, but especially in our effort to get favored-nations clauses added, which will give us the lowest prescription drug prices anywhere in the world....

For years, the American people pleaded with Washington to finally secure the nation's borders. I am pleased to say we answered that plea and achieved the most secure border in U.S. history. We have given our brave border agents and heroic ICE officers the tools they need to do their jobs better than they have ever done before, and to enforce our laws and keep America safe.

We proudly leave the next administration with the strongest and most robust border security measures ever put into place. This includes historic agreements with Mexico, Guatemala, Honduras, and El Salvador, along with more than 450 miles of powerful new wall. We restored American strength at home and American leadership abroad. The world respects us again. Please don't lose that respect....

And perhaps most importantly of all, with nearly \$3 trillion, we fully rebuilt the American military – all made in the USA. We launched the first new branch of the United States Armed Forces in 75 years: the Space Force. And last spring, I stood at Kennedy Space Center in Florida and watched as American astronauts returned to space on American rockets for the first time in many, many years.

We revitalized our alliances and rallied the nations of the world to stand up to China like never before. We obliterated the ISIS caliphate and ended the wretched life of its founder and leader, al Baghdadi. We stood up to the oppressive Iranian regime and killed the world's top terrorist, Iranian butcher Qasem Soleimani. We recognized Jerusalem as the capital of Israel and recognized Israeli sovereignty over the Golan Heights.

As a result of our bold diplomacy and principled realism, we achieved a series of historic peace deals in the Middle East. Nobody believed it could happen. The Abraham Accords opened the doors to a future of peace and harmony, not violence and bloodshed. It is the dawn of a new Middle East, and we are bringing our soldiers home....

As President, my top priority, my constant concern, has always been the best interests of American workers and American families. I did not seek the easiest course; by far, it was actually the most difficult. I did not seek the path that would get the least criticism. I took on the tough battles, the hardest fights, the most difficult choices because that's what you elected me to do. Your needs were my first and last unyielding focus.

This, I hope, will be our greatest legacy: Together, we put the American people back in charge of our country. We restored self-government. We restored the idea that in America no one is forgotten, because everyone matters, and everyone has a voice. We fought for the principle that every citizen is entitled to equal dignity, equal treatment, and equal rights because we are all made equal by God. Everyone is entitled to be treated with respect, to have their voice heard, and to have their government listen. You are loyal to your country, and my administration was always loyal to you....

Now, as I leave the White House, I have been reflecting on the dangers that threaten the priceless inheritance we all share. As the world's most powerful nation, America faces constant threats and challenges from abroad. But the greatest danger we face is a loss of confidence in ourselves, a loss of confidence in our national greatness. A nation is only as strong as its spirit. We are only as dynamic as our pride. We are only as vibrant as the faith that beats in the hearts of our people. No nation can long thrive that loses faith in its own values, history, and heroes, for these are the very sources of our unity and our vitality....

As I think back on the past four years, one image rises in my mind above all others. Whenever I traveled all along the motorcade route, there were thousands and thousands of people. They came out with their families so that they could stand as we passed, and proudly wave our great American flag. It never failed to deeply move me. I knew that they did not just come out to show their support of me; they came out to show me their support and love for our country. This is a republic of proud citizens who are united by our common conviction that America is the greatest nation in all of history. We are, and must always be, a land of hope, of light, and of

glory to all the world. This is the precious inheritance that we must safeguard at every single turn....

I want you to know that the movement we started is only just beginning. There's never been anything like it. The belief that a nation must serve its citizens will not dwindle but instead only grow stronger by the day. As long as the American people hold in their hearts deep and devoted love of country, then there is nothing that this nation cannot achieve. Our communities will flourish. Our people will be prosperous. Our traditions will be cherished. Our faith will be strong. And our future will be brighter than ever before.

I go from this majestic place with a loyal and joyful heart, an optimistic spirit, and a supreme confidence that for our country and for our children, the best is yet to come. Thank you, and farewell. God bless you. God bless the United States of America.

SPECIAL GEORGIA SENATE ELECTION By Designer Frank Montelione

While President Trump's effort to change the outcome of the November 2020 election was taking place a special election for two Senatorial seats was being



conducted in Georgia. **Kelly Loeffler** and **David Purdue** were attempting to maintain their seats in the Senate.

To bolster their campaign **President Trump** conducted a rally ostensibly in rural Dalton in Whitfield County, Georgia, a Republican stronghold. However, he immediately began with the statement "There's no way we lost Georgia...That was a rigged election". He urged the crowd to "swamp" the polls. The crowd responded with "Fight For Trump".

Throughout the speech he continued to speak of the "stolen election". While it is a bitter disappointment the Georgia Presidential Election was recounted three times. The results were always the same. There were a few corrections to the count but not enough to change the outcome.

As for the Special Senatorial Election, there were problems.

In the county I live in, we use Dominion machines. When early voting began, I waited a week before voting. Georgia is an open primary state. Therefore there is no party affiliation on your voter identification card. You are required to produce a photo I.D. A voter must fill out a form at the polling site stating the voter's name, address, and date of birth. That form is then taken to poll workers who, using Dominion computers, input your information and produce a "key" to use. It took 10 minutes of confusion between two poll workers to finally find my voter information and produce a key for me. In some counties Dominion machines crashed or were down.

Even with the issues of these machines, the Dominion system produces a paper ballot which the voter scans into another machine in order to officially cast their ballot. There is a paper

trail. In the counties that the machines crashed, voters were given provisional ballots to cast so that everyone who wanted to vote did.

So, what happened? Democrats voted in record numbers partly spurred on by President Trump's derogatory remarks about the Governor and Attorney General, the phone calls made and the continuing mantra of a stolen election, while some notable Trump supporters – including Sidney Powell, a former member of the president's legal team, and high-profile Georgia attorney Lin Wood – have encouraged Georgia Republicans to boycott the January 5 elections and in many areas they did exactly that.

The President's rally had the opposite effect of what was expected in Whitfield County. Republican voting was less than expected.

The Republican Party of Georgia is largely invisible. There is no one manning the office. There is no one answering the phones. Leave a message and no one calls back. Simple things such as signs were nowhere to be found. Few phone calls were made, no effort to register voters. Candidates had no one at large polling sites. There were very few mailings. Contributing to the loss was lackluster voter turnout in reliably red counties.

The Republican Party was out worked and out maneuvered by the Democrat Party, whose workers were highly active throughout the campaign. There were Democrat volunteers with bullhorns rallying people to their candidates. Volunteers knocked on doors. Absentee Ballot request were mail to everyone who pulled a Democrat ticked in the November elections. Volunteers were everywhere registering new voters.

President Trump's visit to the north Georgia Republican strongholds had the effect of depressing Republican voters while energizing Democrat voters.

The Republican Party organization in Georgia is in shambles. Even now those in power in the Party are still shell shocked as to what happened. The State Party needs to take a step back and begin reorganizing or Georgia will remain Blue long into the future.

195 thousand registered Republicans in Brevard which means we have more than 55,000 more Republicans than Democrats.

The annual meeting of the RPOF (Republican Party of Florida) took place in Orlando January 15 and 16 and included the election of Officers and Caucus Chairs. All of the current

RPOF officers were re-elected. Mike Thomas was elected Vice Chair of the Congressional District 8 caucus, and I was re-elected as Vice Chair of all the County Chairs in Florida.

Governor Ron DeSantis, Senator Marco Rubio, Lieutenant Governor Jeanette Nunez, Attorney General Ashley Moody, and Chief Financial Officer Jimmy Patronis all attended the meeting, along with several Florida Congressmen.

The New Year's "winners" are:

We're going to scrutinize, double-check, investigate with the same skepticism we'd approach a Trump tweet. Want to ensure the world's biggest business media brand approaches you as a potential funnel of disinformation? Then hire away."
- --Michael Beller, who was fired as the Public Broadcasting System's principal counsel, after Project Veritas recorded him on video saying it was "great" the coronavirus was spreading in red states and could affect Trump voters, and that the federal government should take children away from people who voted for the President and put them in "re-education camps."
- --Shelby County, Tennessee school officials, for placing the principal of Cordova High School, Barton Thorne, on administrative leave, for telling students during morning announcements they should be aware of free speech censorship happening on social media platforms. He told the students, "I'm not going to tell you what to think, I just want to help you think."
- --Washington State Representative Jesse Johnson, for proposing legislation in the state to prohibit law enforcement officers from using unleased K9s, tear gas, armored vehicles, helicopters, machine guns, chokeholds, and neck restraints in pursuit of suspects of a crime.
- --Alex Stamos, director of Stanford University's Internet Observatory, for stating in a CNN interview that he was "not sure we need" cable providers to offer viewers such "conservative influencers" as Newsmax TV and One America News Network.
- --The Minnesota Department of Education, for proposing new school standards that would banish lessons about World War I and II, the Holocaust, the Civil and Revolutionary Wars, George Washington and Thomas Jefferson, replacing those significant history topics with the study of "systemic racism," awareness of the LGBTQ+ community, and how the disenfranchisement of freed blacks during Reconstruction connects today to "persistent discrimination and inequity."

THIS AND THAT

PRESIDENTIAL PARDONS AND COMMUTATIONS.

On January 20, just hours before leaving office, **President Trump** issued a wave of more than 130 presidential pardons, including ones to former **White House Chief Strategist Steve Bannon**, who had been charged with embezzling funds raised to build the southern wall; rap star Lil' Wayne and

Kodak Blue, convicted for weapons charges; Jared Kushner friend Ken Kurson; Death Row records co-founder Michael Harris; former Arizona Congressman Rick Renzi; former California Congressman Randy Cunningham; and former Detroit Mayor Kwame Kilpatrick... Earlier in the month, pardoned former Republican Trump California **Representative Duncan Hunter**, who pleaded guilty in 2019 to misusing campaign funds; former Republican New York Representative Chris Collins, who pleaded guilty to conspiracy to commit securities fraud and lying to the FBI in 2019; former campaign aide George Papadopoulos, who was charged as part of Special Counsel Robert Mueller's Russian investigation; Paul Manafort, who served as the chairman of Trump's 2016 campaign and was convicted on bank fraud and tax charges; longtime Trump associate Roger Stone, whose conviction related to investigation of Russian interference was commuted earlier in the year; Charles Kushner, the father of Trump's son-in-law and senior adviser Jared Kushner, who pleaded guilty in 2004 to charges of tax evasion and retaliating against a federal witness; former Michigan Congressman Mark Siljander, convicted for failing to register under the Foreign Agents Registration Act; former Ron Paul campaign staffers **Jesse Benton** and **John Tate**, both convicted in 2016 for their roles in a scheme to funnel \$73,000 to an Iowa state legislator in return for the legislator's support in the 2012 Iowa caucuses; and former police officer Stephanie Mohr, the first female canine handler in Prince George's County, Maryland, who served ten years in prison for releasing her K-9 partner on a burglary suspect in 1995, resulting in a bite wound requiring ten stitches. On "humanitarian and compassionate grounds," the President commuted the 10-year sentence for misuse of charitable funds, of former Texas Congressman **Steve Stockman**, who has pre-existing health conditions that put him at risk for the coronavirus.

FOX NEWS CHANNEL. "Elections have consequences" is a phrase that also hold true for the news media. Fox News' ratings this month took a hammering — finishing a week's viewing in third place behind MSNBC and CNN, which is the first time that's happened in 20 years. Many Trump supporters turned away from Fox believing the network undermined the President during the election. Examples included hostility by moderator Chris Wallace toward Trump in a September 29 debate and Fox's premature call on election night of Arizona for Democrat Joe Biden. This is the channel the President used to consider his favorite.

HISPANIC HERITAGE MONTH. Florida celebrates Hispanic Heritage Month every fall, and on December 8, First Lady Casey DeSantis announced the three state-wide winners of a student essay contest, including one from Brevard County. This year's theme was "Celebrating Untold Stories and Contributions of Hispanic Americans in Florida," and the winning essay by Jackson Breeden, who attends Holy Trinity Episcopal Academy, highlighted how Florida's first female Hispanic American member of the U.S. Coast Guard and first female St. Augustine lightkeeper, paved the way in a position typically not held by women at that point in history. He earned a four-year Florida College Plan

scholarship provided by the Florida Prepaid College Foundation. Reporting results of the event, **Debbie Mayfield** said, "As we look back on the events of 2020, I would like to thank you for the opportunity to serve as your State Senator. I feel truly blessed to have the honor to represent all of the citizens who make District 17 home."

BIG TECH COMPANIES. After Facebook, Google, and other Big Tech companies censored President Trump and other conservatives, more than 30 conservative leaders, including the Media Research Center's Brent Bozell, issued a joint statement saving the Big Tech action was "an all-out assault on our republic" and "an existential threat to democracy." The statement added, "Free speech was controlled like this in East Germany and the Soviet Union. This should not be happening in America." It was, the conservative leaders said, "time to stand up and demand the breakup of these big tech monopolies." Noting that "Freedom has never been threatened like this before," they added, "We live our lives online, especially now, during the pandemic. The entire conservative movement will be canceled by the left and their thugs if we let them. They will turn the screws on conservatives if we don't defend our rights."



PARLER. John Matze created Parler as an alternative to the progressive social media sites. This was established as a place for chat and social sharing open to everyone, including

conservatives. A CNET report said the Parler app was downloaded more than 11 million times since its launch in 2018, including 997,000 times just during the time from January 6 to 10. But Google and Apple removed the Parler app from their stores, and Amazon Web Services suspended the site from its servers, after claiming Parler failed to monitor posts for violent content. They also negatively portrayed Matze – leading to insults in the mainstream media and even death threats. Meanwhile, Parler partially relaunched after registering its domain and server with Epik, an internet solutions company that also hosts Twitter alternative Gab. And Parler and its attorneys have filed an antitrust law suit against Amazon for its unfair monopoly.

I AM WOMAN – HEAR ME.... SHOOT. "National Review" reports that in 2008, when Alaska Governor Sarah Palin ran for vice president, some people expressed surprise that with all of her state and family responsibilities, she still found time to go moose hunting. But the magazine said not only have women in the Pacific Northwest been hunting for centuries, but it was also true even longer back in other parts of the world. Scientists in the Andes recently found a 9,000-year-old skeleton clad in hunting gear, and lab studies showed it had been a woman. Investigation of previous skeletal hunters found at least 11 more that were women. Calling the discovery "a breakthrough," paleontologists also expressed surprise to find so many women hunting. "National Review"

opined, "Those scientists have obviously never spent much time hanging around their local gun shop."

HOMELESSNESS. Each of the five states in the United States with the worst homelessness problem is governed by a "Democrat trifecta," says the Media Research Center's blog editor Craig Bannister, in which a Democrat governor has the luxury of both a State Senate and House controlled by his or her party. New York leads the pack, with 47.3 homeless persons per ten thousand population. Bannister says this is based on analysis of data from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development's 2019 Annual Homeless Assessment Report to Congress. Second on the list is Hawaii, which has a total homeless population of 45.3 per ten thousand; third is California with 38.2; fourth is Oregon, with 37.5, and Washington ranks fifth with 22.6.

LET'S SAVE AMERICA TRUMP TRIBUTE. Activist

author **Trevor Loudon** and Patriot Church Pastor **John Vacchiano** addressed the Ronald Reagan Clubs' "Let's Save America" tribute to **President Donald Trump** in Cocoa on January 20. Asking the audience to join him in prayer not only for Trump but for

our nation as well,

Vacchiano said that since originally the tribute had been planned as a reelection victory, "We had hoped to be having a celebration, but this is just a temporary setback." He added that he still had faith for the future. The Patriot Church, located in Sebastian, Florida, he said, "exists

to expose the lies and deceptions of our present day culture and proclaim the truth in regard to our Founding Fathers, patriotism, the Declaration of Independence, the U.S. Constitution, Judeo-Christian values, and the like." Loudon, author of the book "The Enemies Within - Communists, Socialists, and Progressives in the U.S. Congress," said that while Leftists continue to push for the separation of Church and State, it was the Founding Fathers in the earliest days of our country who believed they were meant to go together. He stated that President Trump agreed, and "fought for this country every day." Now, Loudon added, "We need people who will fight for what is right." Many former and present government officials and members of Congress are Marxists, Loudon said, "We are in a communist takeover or on the verge of it." No background checks ever take place on congressmen and women, he said, because the Left even controls the FBI, and it wouldn't dare go against them. Loudon said Communist China had the support of several politicians and is working in many states, adding that its plan for the election was to stop Trump and discourage others, and determine the world balance of power. "We are at war with China, but not militarily," Loudon said, adding that this included the use of counterfeit goods coming into the country, as well as the "deliberate spread" of the coronavirus. "Trump was the only

one to stand up to the scam," he said. Expressing concern over the Republican Party itself, he said it would either have to purge its leadership or face the creation of a new party. Returning to the reason for the event, Loudon said, "We are here to appreciate the greatest President since George Washington. Winning Florida in the 2020 election gave us hope to carry the Trump legacy forward."

BREVARD SHERIFF WAYNE IVEY. Addressing an overflow crowd in Merritt Island, Florida, for an hour and three-quarters on January 14, Brevard County Sheriff Wayne Ivey said that following the 2020 election, moving forward "without bricks being thrown," three things are needed: 1) stabilize the U.S. Supreme Court, 2) the



"swamp" needs to be drained, and 3) stop caring what the media says, since it is "a cancer to our society." Stating that he took an oath to uphold the U.S. and Florida Constitutions, Ivey said he will not violate the law regarding their support for the Second Amendment, and as far as the Left's call for gun control is concerned, "they are not coming here to take guns away." He added that other sheriffs across the state need to take the same position. Leaders are needed to protect the Constitution – which separates us from everybody else – Ivey said. He said Republicans need to be a united party, especially since the media "is trying to divide and conquer us." The sheriff urged audience members to not "waste their time" and stay off social media, including arguing on Facebook. "Focus on what we are doing, Focus on what we can change," he said. "We have got to start recruiting younger people before they get brainwashed," Ivey added, "teach them patriotism and love of country. Get back to being parents." Looking ahead, he said it was necessary to focus on all elections, not just the presidential one. "We take great pride," the sheriff concluded, "in being the party of law and order."



REPUBLICAN LIBERTY CAUCUS OF CENTRAL EAST FLORIDA AND THE HERITAGE ISLE REPUBLICAN CLUB. Republican Liberty Caucus of Florida Chairman Bob White, meeting with the Republican Liberty Caucus of Central East Florida (RLC-CEF) on January 4, talked about the members who traveled with him to Georgia to knock on

doors and make phone calls on behalf of the Republican Senate candidates. He also spoke there – as well as to the Heritage Isle Republican Club (HIRC) on January 7 – on his organization's position on a number of proposed bills that will be before the Florida State Legislature when that body begins its 60-day session in Tallahassee on March 2. There will be interim committee meetings in February, White said, and several RLC-CEF members will be traveling there to meet with legislators. He said the national Republican Liberty Caucus is the Conscience of the Republican Party, and it believes in individual rights, limited government, and free markets. As strong supporters of the Second Amendment,

White said, the caucus will be supporting bills that have been introduced to remove the requirement for Florida citizens that a license to carry a concealed firearm is required to carry such a firearm; to repeal gun control measures currently requiring a three-day waiting period for gun purchases and the minimum age of 21 to purchase one; and to repeal the law that bans the sale of firearms and ammunition during a declared local emergency. He said they oppose proposed legislation that would require background checks for the sale or transfer of ammunition; that would require private sales of firearms between citizens to transfer the weapon to a licensed dealer to run a background check before completing the transaction; and would require gun owners to use a locked container or a trigger lock even if the gun owner is carrying or has the weapon nearby. White said they support bills to reform a governor's use of emergency orders to shut down businesses and to remove the authority of the State Health Officer to order vaccinations upon declaration of a public health emergency. In the area of Taxes and Budget, he said they support repeal of a 2014 measure that authorizes distribution of state sales and use tax revenue to fund professional sports franchise facilities; and they oppose a requirement for retailers with no physical presence in the state to collect state sales tax on items delivered to purchasers in Florida. Among other proposed bills they support, White said, are repealing the use of red-light cameras; allowing bars and restaurants to sell take-out alcoholic beverages during the coronavirus pandemic; and requiring all counties and municipalities in Florida to adopt local government comprehensive plans that guide future growth and development....On January 9, White issued a lengthy statement about the January 6 assault at the U.S. Capitol, saying it "begs the question, exactly who were these criminals that attacked our capital and our institutions of government" He said he fears that we have lost the moral high ground, but not because of anything that we have done. "I think back to the early days of the Tea Party and the 912 movements," White said. "Our protests and our demonstrations were and have always been peaceful and emanated from the best of our human emotions. We stood for the Constitution and for the Rule of Law. We stood for Liberty and Freedom." Now let's begin, he said, "with an unequivocal condemnation of the violent assault on our nation's Capital. Let's demand that justice be served and that those that perpetrated these heinous acts be prosecuted to the fullest extent of the law. And let's find out exactly who they are. We may well find that they were infiltrators to our movement determined to undermine us and destroy us from within. But make no mistake; they must be held accountable regardless of who they are and what their motivations were." In order to take back the moral high ground, White said, "We continue to stand and fight for the Constitution and the Rule of Law, for Liberty, and for Freedom! What else is there for those of us that love our country? Did you think this would be easy; that the battle would be won in short order and we would all then go back to our quiet lives spent harmoniously with family and friends? Never a chance in Hell! We are in this for the long haul! This is the fight of our lives for the rest of our lives! Walk away if you don't have the stomach for it. For the rest of you ... See you on the battlefield!"

different colored candle to light, and Febro spoke about what each color meant for the responsibilities for each officer position...Speaking at the meeting, BFRW



member Marilyn Olshansky said she and her husband



participated in a door-knocking effort to get out the Republican vote for the early voting in Georgia for the two U.S. Senate seats. The four-day event, she said, was organized by the Republican Jewish Coalition, and it included about 30 participants, some from as far away as California. Olshansky said that while their reception at homes in less wealthy

neighborhoods was good, in the pricier neighborhoods, "we saw many ground signs listing leftist groups the occupants supported." Some homes did fly the American flag, which she said she took as meaning the occupants were likely Republicans. "I hope that some point, the GOP will study and address how the Democrats have managed to bully and intimidate by associating their brand with intellect, benevolence and virtue, and the Republican brand with the opposite. This is imperative!," Olshansky said.

And this is before even considering the possibility that the U.S. Senate, now under de facto Democratic leadership, may well ditch the

legislative filibuster, opening up a Pandora's box of powergrabbing possibilities that could irrevocably transform the republic - chiefly 'packing' the Supreme Court and lower courts, and statehood for Puerto Rico and the District of Columbia. At first blush, it is difficult to sugarcoat such a would-be dystopia. There is, it seems, no limit to what a Democratic controlled House-Senate-White House trifecta might be able to accomplish. But the reality, once we step back and soberly assess our predicament, is more nuanced; there is a path forward for a conservative revival by the time of either the 2022 midterm elections or the 2024 presidential election. In terms of the federal government, conservatives still nominally control the Supreme Court and post-Trump, the majority of the crucial circuit courts of appeals. Democrats may try to 'pack' these courts if they nuke the filibuster, but unless and until they do so, the judiciary – however unreliable Republican-nominated judges often are - will still often redound to conservatives' interests and forestall much of the Biden administration's worst impulses. It is thus incumbent upon well-positioned bastions of conservative legal clout, centered around Texas's Office of the Solicitor General, to aggressively litigate and seek recourse in the courts. In terms of state governments, Republicans still retain a majority (30) of unified state legislatures. Indeed, nearly half of all states (23) have both a Republican governor and a unified Republican state legislature. These red states can and ought to serve as hubs for conservatives' own quasi-'resistance' over the next four years....Next, conservatives must do the hard work of actually building up the digital and corporate infrastructure to push back in earnest against Big Tech, 'woke' capital and the broader 'cancel culture' threat to the American way of life. The recent collusive efforts by Amazon, Apple and Google to systematically black out Parler, the pro-free speech Twitter alternative, reveal the short-sightedness of those liberals and libertarians who, for years, merely told conservatives concerned about online censorship to 'build your own Google'....Finally, exiled conservatives must continue to build a constructive, substantive conservative agenda that is politically appealing and can actually win at the ballot box....There is plenty to lament right now. 





