TRUMP APPLAUDS ASTRONAUTS LAUNCH INTO SPACE FROM U.S. SOIL

Several years ago at a Media Research Center event, we had the good fortune to meet and have our picture taken with the former Navy Seal hero who killed Osama bin Laden. Now, **Rob O'Neill** has had a wonderful message for the protesters and rioters following the tragic death of George Floyd at the knee of a Minneapolis policeman. Former Minneapolis policeman Derek Chauvin, whose knee on the neck caused the death of George Floyd, leading to nationwide protests and vandalism, reportedly had 18 prior complaints filed against him with the Police Department's Office of Internal Affairs. He also was one of more than a dozen officers accused of killing civilians. The state's then top prosecutor declined to press charges against any of the officers but did routinely seek longer-than-recommended sentences for smaller offenses, such as vandalism. That former prosecutor? Oh, yes, it's now-Senator Amy Klobuchar.

After a nine-year wait – including a three-day weather delay – Elon Musk's SpaceX company successfully launched two American astronauts into space from U.S. soil on May 30, as thousands cheered on the ground at and near the Kennedy Space Center in Cape Canaveral, Florida.



Nine minutes after liftoff, the Falcon 9 rocket's first-stage booster landed, as designed, on a barge a few hundred miles off the Florida coast, and three minutes after that, the Crew Dragon capsule successfully separated from the rocket's upper stage for the 19-hour flight to the International Space Station. The launch site, Pad 39A, was the site for the last U.S.-based crewed mission —

the final space shuttle program in 2011.

President Trump, who flew from Washington for a first-hand look at the take-off, led the cheering, telling the assembled crowd on the ground that this is "a new era for U.S. spaceflight and exploration," and a "great and exciting day for all America and space." Praising the partnership between SpaceX and NASA – which meant the United States no longer has to depend on paying Russia millions of dollars to transport our astronauts to the orbiting International Space Station (ISS) – the President said it has resulted in dramatic cost savings for our space ambitions.

Highlighting other space accomplishments by his administration, Trump referred to the re-establishment of the National Space Council after being disbanded in 1993, and the creation of the Space Force – the first new branch of the U.S. military in more than 70 years. He also said NASA is "the greatest space agency of its kind anywhere in the world and will get greater and greater for years to come," promising to go back to the moon, and then on to Mars. The President also credited Musk, the SpaceX CEO and founder, as "the real hero – who truly embodies the American ethos of big thinking and risk taking."

Trump and **Vice President Mike Pence** were accompanied on their Air Force One flight by a number of government officials, including **Florida Congressman Bill Posey**, whose 8th District includes Cape Canaveral. **Florida Governor Ron DeSantis** also was on hand, as were current and former astronauts.



Following their overnight flight on the SpaceX Crew Dragon capsule, NASA Astronauts **Bob Behnken** and **Doug Hurley** docked at the ISS and were greeted by current occupants **Astronaut Chris Cassidy** and Cosmonauts Anatoly Ivanishin and Ivan Vagner. Before returning home, the newcomers can now stay and work in space for up to 110 days.

The \$150 billion ISS orbits about 250 miles above the Earth. It is larger in size than a football field and weighs more than 900,000 pounds.

ELECTION QUALIFYING IN BREVARD COUNTY

As the qualifying period to be placed on the Brevard County ballot ended on June 12, three Republican constitutional officers to automatically won re-election for another four years as they had no opposition.

It will be the fourth consecutive term for **Property Appraiser Dana Blickley, Tax Collector Lisa Cullen** and **Supervisor of Elections Lori Scott**. While they all faced initial opposition in 2008, their subsequent re-elections were all unanimous.

In the race to succeed retiring **Clerk of Courts Scott Ellis**, the branch manager of the clerk's Viera office – Republican **Rachel Sadoff** – was automatically elected when another candidate for the position failed to qualify to be on the ballot. Sadoff, who becomes the county's first female clerk of courts, said one of her first priorities will be continuing the efficiency and accuracy of the clerk's office, and introducing a new case management system."

Two of the four Republican members of the Florida State Legislature will face party opponents in the August 18 Primary Election. In District 52, **Representative Thad Altman** is being challenged by **Matt Nye**, the national chairman of the Republican Liberty Caucus; and in District 53, **Representative Randy Fine**'s Republican opponent is businesswoman **Marcelle Adkins**.

One of the five Republicans on the Brevard County Commission has a primary opponent this year — **District 3 Commissioner John Tobia** is being challenged by the Republican Mayor of Melbourne —**Kathy Meehan**.

THE 10 MOST DESTRUCTIVE AMERICANS OF THE LAST 80 YEARS

"Today, America is a bitterly divided, poorly educated, and morally fragile society with so-called mainstream politicians pushing cynical identity politics, socialism, and open borders. The president of the United States has been threatened with impeachment because the other side doesn't like him. The once reasonably unbiased American media has

Here's my list of the 10 most destructive Americans of the last 80 years:

- 10) Mark Felt Deputy director of the FBI, aka "Deep Throat" during the Watergate scandal. This was the first public instance of a senior FBI official directly interfering in America's political affairs. He was the forerunner of James Comey, Peter Strzok, Lisa Page, and Andrew McCabe.

- who was fatally pinned to the ground by the neck on Memorial Day leading to riots in the streets was caused by President Trump "trafficking" in racial hatred.
- --St. Louis prosecutor Kim Gardner, a protégé of Left-wing billionaire anarchist George Soros, for quickly releasing back onto the streets every single one of the looters and rioters who were arrested during the mayhem in the city while a retired black police captain was murdered, three other police officers were shot and wounded, businesses were burned to the ground, and firefighters were assaulted and blocked from doing their job. - --NBC reporter Tom Costello, for referring to the fire set at St. John's Church across from the White House as an example of "some vandalism." Is his work at NBC an example of "some chitchat"?
- --Washington, DC, Democrat Mayor Muriel Bowser, for evicting from their Washington hotel rooms, 200 members of the Utah National Guard, who came to help stem the racial riots breaking out in the nation's capital. Utah Senator Mike Lee called her decision "shameful, petty and discrediting."
- --Michigan State University's student government the Associated Students of MSU is sharing content defending looting, claiming it is "one of the most righteous anti-white supremacist tactics available." Another article claims that white supremacy, capitalism and government "work together to violently repress people who defend Black life." ASMSU operates on a \$2 million budget and consists of college-educated representatives and others appointed by racial, ethnic and social groups.
- --Jennifer Ray, an associate professor of photo media at Wichita State University, who expressed being "horrified and disgusted" in a letter to a newspaper, that First Daughter Ivanka Trump had been invited to participate in the school's graduation ceremony. Ivanka had filmed a virtual address to the graduates, but the letter from the loony associate professor was enough for the school's president to say she would no longer be part of the ceremony "in light of the social justice issues brought forth by George Floyd's death."
- --"New York Slimes Magazine" writer Nikole Hannah-Jones, for claiming in the wake of nation-wide protests, violence and looting following the Minneapolis death of George Floyd that "destroying property which can be replaced is not violence. I think any reasonable person would say we shouldn't be destroying other people's property. But these are not reasonable times."
- --"New York Slimes" publisher A. G. Sulzberger, for forcing the resignation of Editorial Page Editor James Bennet, who ran an

op-ed in the newspaper written by Arkansas Republican Senator Tom Cotton, in which he said rioters have plunged many American cities into anarchy, with looting that has nothing to do with George Floyd's death, and that an "overwhelming show of force" is needed to "restore order to our streets." The publisher at first agreed with Bennet that the paper is obligated to readers to show them counter-arguments, but later turned around and agreed with other employees who called the op-ed "irresponsible" and that it jeopardized their ability to work safely and effectively.

--And "Philthydelphia Inquirer" Publisher Lisa Hughes, for forcing long-time Executive Editor Stan Wischnowski to resign from the newspaper for the "crime" of approving the headline "Buildings Matter, Too" on a column about looting and vandalism in the city during protests of George Floyd's death in Minneapolis. The article expressed worry that the damaged buildings could "leave a gaping hole in the heart of Philadelphia." But after black staff members angrily condemned the headline, the publisher said in a memo to staff that it was "offensive and inappropriate" and that the newspaper needed "a more diverse workforce."

--Domenick DeMuro, a Philadelphia elections judge and Democrat Party ward chairman, who pleaded guilty in federal court to stuffing ballot boxes in favor of Democrat candidates in elections in 2014, 2015 and 2016, while collecting thousands of dollars in cash to make the changes. When sentenced, he faces up to 15 years in prison.

--University of Illinois English Professor Catherine Prendergast, for referring to Trump supporters as "Nazis," and advocating for an election cycle where whites are "not allowed to vote."

--Columbia University professor Jeffrey Lax, who also serves as deputy chair of the school's Political Science department, for calling on social media a conservative college student – one who attends a community college instead of his university – a "neo-Nazi murderer lover" and told him to "drop dead." The student, Gabriel Montalvo, who never even met Lax, said the attack followed his defense of the President's handling of the coronavirus pandemic. The student then responded, "Professors and higher education establishments should be examples of the exchange of civil discussion, not cyber harassment and perverting a historic tragedy to push an agenda."

--Loony New York Governor Andrew Cuomo, for forcing nursing homes to admit coronavirus patients into their facilities, but then outrageously blaming them for the resulting spread of the disease that led to additional deaths.

--North Carolina Democrat Governor Roy Cooper, for telling the Republican Party that it would have to "scale down" its August scheduled national nominating convention in Charlotte over coronavirus transmission concerns, and then joining a densely packed protest march outside the governor's mansion in Raleigh, removing a facial mask while walking through the crowd.

--Dr. Robert Levin, health director for Ventura County, California, for announcing that his department would forcibly

remove people infected with the coronavirus from their own homes and put into "into other kinds of housing that we have available," if they could not sufficiently isolate from family members in their homes. But later, under fire, Levin said he "didn't mean what he said."

--The owners of Sacramento radio station Sports 1140 KHTK, for firing Grant Napear, the voice of the Sacramento Kings since 1988, for the "unpardonable sin" of responding to a Black Lives Matter tweet by saying that "All Lives Matter...Every Single One!!"

--"The View" co-host Sunny Hostin, for demanding on air that former kneeling NFL quarterback Colin Kaepernick be rehired with back pay, but also that he be given the Nobel Peace Prize. Guess that qualifies her for the "Dingbat of the Year" Award.

THIS AND THAT

REPUBLICAN NATIONAL CONVENTION. At press time, things were still a bit up in the air over the location of the Republican National Convention, which had been scheduled for August 24-27 in Charlotte. But after North Carolina Governor Roy Cooper said he would limit the number of attendees due to the coronavirus, **President Trump** said he would deliver his acceptance speech in Jacksonville, Florida instead. The early portions of the convention might still take place in Charlotte, though.

MAYHEM IN AMERICA. As many thousands of protesters, rioters, looters, building burners, and shooters terrorized cities all across America following the death of African-American George Floyd at the knee of a Minneapolis police officer on May 25, authorities now have fired and arrested four policemen. Derek Chauvin, who arrested Floyd on suspicion of using a counterfeit \$20 bill, and then kept his knee on the suspect's neck for nearly nine minutes leading to death by asphyxiation, is charged with second degree murder and second-degree manslaughter. The other three officers – Thomas Lane, J. Alexander Keung, and Tou Thao – who watched the incident without intervening, were charged with aiding and abetting the incident.



DESANTIS STATEMENT ON **PROTESTS, LOOTING.** Following days of nation-wide protests and lootings in wake of the tragic death of George Floyd in Minnesota at the knee of a fired-and arrested Minneapolis police officer, **Florida Governor Ron DeSantis** issued the following statement on June 1 regarding the Sunshine State: "Florida has zero-tolerance for violence.

rioting and looting. George Floyd's murder was appalling, and the Minnesota perpetrators need to be brought to justice, but this cannot be used as a pretext for violence in our Florida communities. I am in constant contact with state and local leaders, the Florida Department of Law Enforcement, the Florida National Guard and the Florida Highway Patrol. We have devoted significant resources, including the mobilization of 700 Florida National Guard soldiers who are specially trained to support law enforcement. I have also worked with FHP to coordinate more than 1,300 sworn Florida Highway Patrol troopers to support local law enforcement efforts. We will continue to do everything necessary to keep residents safe"....Starting June 5, DeSantis began Phase Two of reopening Florida from the coronavirus pandemic, with bars, pubs, casinos, movie theaters, auditoriums, bowling alleys, arcades, tanning salons and tattoo parlors joining the list of businesses allowed to reopen after shutting their doors in mid-March. Capacity was capped at 50 percent, and businesses must enforce social distancing guidelines and be diligent about cleaning surfaces.

FLORIDA LEGISLATIVE BILLS. In early June, Florida Governor Ron DeSantis signed the following bills passed by the State Legislature: 1) providing the state's 11,000 college athletes the opportunity to receive compensation from the use of their name, image and likeness; 2) changing the boundary line for property located partially in Indian River County and partly in St. Lucie County; 3) plans for the design and construction of permanent Staging Areas for Emergencies (SAFE) as part of Florida's Turnpike System to facilitate prompt emergency assistance in response to a declared state of emergency; 4) creation of the Florida Office of Broadband within the Department of Economic Opportunity, to lead efforts for highspeed internet installation within or adjacent to multi-use corridors of regional economic significance, including rural areas; 5) Incentives for veterans and military members to adopt children from the state's child-welfare system, expanding a program that provides incentives to state employees to adopt children. DeSantis said he has specifically put off accepting or looking at the Legislature's budget measures because of what has been happening in the state due to the coronavirus. "I wanted to see how all this went," he said. "It wouldn't have been appropriate for me to have signed the budget knowing we're going to have, you know, these uncharted waters."

THE GATEWAY PUNDIT. The conservative website The Gateway Pundit issued this report following a protest demonstration in Virginia: "The young Democrats attempted to destroy a Confederate Monument in Portsmouth, Virginia. When they knocked over one of the statues it landed on a fellow

protester critically injuring the man. A witness said the protester's skull was showing and he as convulsing on the ground. The black protester actually coded twice having his head smashed by the statue and had convulsions. The man was sent to Norfolk General as what they call an Alpha Trauma Alert. Folks, this is what happens when you try to use anarchy and chaos as a means of bringing about social change. We live in a free country where folks have the right to air grievances by protesting peacefully. Do this. Present your case and your cause. Build websites, write blog posts, pen books, make art. Anything it takes to educate people. Put it on display during your peaceful protests. This will win hearts and minds. It really will. Violence like this isn't going to solve any issues. It's going to create whole new ones. This man may sustain permanent brain damage due to the injury he received. How many others will have to suffer the same fate before these angry mobs stop for a minute and think clearly and rationally about what they are doing? How many black businesses have to burn to the ground in the fight for equality? Chaos and anarchy must stop. Law and order must reign. However, changes must be made to our system to ensure that individuals are all treated equally under the law. That cannot be accomplished with violence. Here's to hoping common sense and peace come forward and that we are able to resolve these riots without further injury to anyone."

U.S. SENATE CONFIRMATIONS. In a unanimous 98-0 vote on June 9, the U.S. Senate confirmed U.S. Air Force General Charles Brown as the next Chief of Staff, to replace General **David Goldfein**, who is expected to retire later this summer. The Air Force said Brown's swearing-in ceremony will be held August 6....On June 4, the Senate voted 53-38 to confirm media executive **Michael Pack** as the new CEO of the U.S. Agency for Global Media, which oversees the Voice of America (where this Editor worked many years ago). VOA is mandated to fairly present U.S. policy and discussion. Pack's background includes positions with the National Public Radio and with the Broadcasting Board of Governors (the old name for the U.S. Agency for Global Media)....On May 21, it voted 49-44 along party lines to confirm Republican Texas Congressman John **Ratcliffe** as the next Director of National Intelligence, a position that had been filled temporarily by U.S. Ambassador to Germany Richard Grenell after Dan Coats stepped down from the DNI position.

MEMORIAL DAY ATTITUDES. What a difference a Party makes. In honor of Memorial Day on May 25, Republican President Donald Trump first visited Arlington National Cemetery, where he silently honored the nation's war dead, and saluted a wreath at the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier. The President then traveled to Baltimore's historic Fort McHenry – where Francis Scott Key penned "The Star Spangled Banner" – and spoke about the resolve of Americans amid the coronavirus pandemic, saying: "Together we will vanquish the virus and America will rise from this crisis to new and even greater heights. No obstacle, no challenge, and no threat is a match for the sheer determination of the American people." And then there are the Democrats. Objecting to the visit, Baltimore's Mayor Bernard Young said Trump "should have stayed home and set a positive example, and not pursued nonessential travel." Not to be

outdone, the Dems' unsuccessful presidential candidate in 2016 – former Secretary of State and New York Senator Hillary Clinton – said she was "missing our Chappaqua Memorial Day parade" – which was canceled due to the coronavirus –but was "feeling grateful to leaders like New York Governor Andrew Cuomo for making responsible decisions to keep people safe." She not only ignored that Cuomo's state executive order forcing coronavirus patients into nursing homes led to the deaths of thousands, the tone-deaf Clinton also failed to honor our military members who sacrificed their lives for our freedom.

U.S. SUPREME COURT. On June 15, the U.S. Supreme Court ruled 6-3 that federal sex-based civil rights law protects workers from discrimination on the basis of sexual orientation and gender identity, meaning workers will now be protected in the 29 states that do not have laws protecting all LGBTQ employees. In dissent, Justice Samuel Alito wrote, "There is only one word for what the court has done today: legislation," charging that the majority was guilty of doing what judges rightly have been condemned for doing from the bench over the years: saying the law is what they – politically – think it should be, not what the law states....By a 5-4 vote on May 29, the court rejected an appeal by the South Bay United Pentecostal Church in Chula Vista, California to state limits on attendance at worship services imposed to contain the spread of the coronavirus. The church said limits on how many people can attend their services violate constitutional guarantees of religious freedom, but Chief Justice **John Roberts** joined the four liberals on the court in opposition.

FLORIDA SUPREME COURT. Florida Governor Ron DeSantis on May 26 named attorney John Couriel and 15th Judicial Circuit Court Judge Renatha Francis to fill two vacancies on the Florida Supreme Court. Jamaica-born Renatha will be the first Caribbean-American to serve on the state's high court. They were chosen from a pool of nine nominees selected by the court's Judicial Nominating Commission, and will replace Robert Luck and Barbara Lagoa, who were elevated by President Trump to the 11th U.S. Circuit Court of Appeals. Couriel and Francis will face a merit retention vote on the November 2022 ballot.

FREE SPEECH ALLIANCE. Responding to President **Trump**'s executive order addressing social media platforms' bias against conservatives, the 50-member Free Speech Alliance (FSA) on June 3 released a statement setting out four principles that the social media platforms - FaceBook, Twitter and Google/YouTube – need to adopt. The principles are: 1) Provide Transparency – detailed information so everyone can see if liberal groups and users are being treated the same as those on the right; 2) Provide Clarity on 'Hate Speech' - a common concern among social media companies, but no two firms define it the same way; 3) Provide Equal Footing for Conservatives top social media firms have chosen to work with dishonest groups actively opposed to the conservative movement; and 4) Mirror the First Amendment - tech giants should afford their users nothing less than the free speech and free exercise of religion embodied in the First Amendment as interpreted by the U.S. Supreme Court. Since its inception, the FSA has been declaring that social media companies have layered on new rules, added restrictions, employed biased "fact-checkers," and created

a leftist oversight board. Just a few of the conservative leaders of organizations comprising the FSA are the Media Research Center's **Brent Bozell**, the Leadership Institute's **Morton Blackwell**, the Tea Party Patriots Action's **Jenny Beth Martin**, FreedomWorks' **Adam Brandon**, Citizens United's **David Bossie**, Liberty Counsel's **Matthew Staver**, ACT! For America's **Brigitte Gabriel**, the Center for Military Readiness' **Elaine Donnelly**, and the Heartland Institute's **James Taylor**.

BREVARD FEDERATED REPUBLICAN WOMEN. Discussing the 2020 Florida State Legislative Session with the Brevard Federated Republican Women on June 3, **District 51**

State Representative Tyler Sirois said he was proud of the success of one of his proposed bills — allowing pharmacists in the state to test for the flu or strep throat without a patient having to see a doctor first. The measure passed, and Florida Governor Ron DeSantis signed it, he said, but the next step for the legislature next session will be to pass a measure that will allow these pharmacists to actually get



paid by insurance companies for these tests. Sirois also said he was proud to support another successful bill in the legislature – giving classroom credit for military preparedness to high school students in the Junior ROTC program. Thanking the BFRW members for allowing him to serve in the legislature, Sirois said his interest to do so, plus his interest in history, comes from a deep love for our country. The frustrations everyone has over the coronavirus pandemic, he said, is understandable, but we have a responsibility for their safety. Regarding the death in Minneapolis of black American George Floyd, he said, "It is tragic. There is no way to sugarcoat it," and added that the Florida Legislature "has done a lot of criminal justice reform, but needs to do more." He added that he looks forward to working on that. "For better or worse," Sirois said, "it is our system of justice in the United States." Asked why Democrats "do such a poor job" in Congress and the Legislature, Sirois responded with a smile, "How much time do we have?"



REPUBLICAN LIBERTY CAUCUS OF CENTRAL EAST FLORIDA. For the first time since the Coronavirus pandemic broke out, members of the Republican Liberty Caucus of Central East Florida met on June 1, with RLC-CEF Chair Bob White, RLC National Chair Matt Nye and Brevard County

Clerk of Courts Scott Ellis participating in a panel discussion on issues involving the county. All three agreed that the pandemic lockdown was unnecessary. White expressed opposition to the idea of contact tracing of individuals' whereabouts; Nye said that economically, "we shot ourselves in the head;" and Ellis accused Dr. Anthony Fauci, head of the U.S. National Institute of Allergy and Infectious Diseases, of plotting to "destroy Republicans" with his advice to the President. White added that during the last State Legislative Session, when the RLC sent thousands of post cards to key members of the Senate in opposition of proposed anti-Second Amendment legislation, the effort was effective in eliminating the most egregious parts of the bill. Comparing Florida's balanced budget to New York's bloated one that fails to cover all the state's expenses, he said that Blue States "need to reduce their budgets" and not expect citizens in Red States to bail them out through additional taxes....Listing upcoming events, White said the RLC, joined by the Trump Club of Brevard, will sponsor a Space Coast Hob Nob and Straw Poll on July 3 at the Hilton Rialto in Melbourne from 11:30 am to 4:30 pm, to which candidates for office will be invited. On August 17 at the Police Hall of Fame in Titusville, White will be joined by Brevard Sheriff Wayne Ivey, Shooting Straight radio host Royce Bartlett, attorney Kendra Parris, and WMMB radio host Bill Mick in presenting the North Brevard Second Amendment Gun Rights Forum. The annual RLC Constitution Day Dinner will be held September 13 at the Hilton Rialto in Melbourne. Cliff Maloney, Jr., the national president of Young Americans for Liberty, will be the keynote speaker.

"The Supreme Court has extended employment protections to gay, lesbian and transgender employees, and tossed out landmark border control and gun rights cases, all seen

as massive setbacks for U.S. conservatives. Many Republicans have long held that despite the liberal bias of the media and the left-wing activism dominating the streets, their real power came from their hold over the U.S. judicial branch....Justice Neil Gorsuch and fellow conservative John Roberts sided with the court's four liberal justices to extend workplace discrimination protections to gay, lesbian, and transgender employees in a surprise 6-3 decision. The six justices ruled that the 1964 Civil Rights Act's prohibition of discrimination based on 'sex' extends to sexual orientation as well. Gorsuch's opinion was clear: nobody may be fired for 'traits or actions' that would not be

'questioned in members of a different sex.' LGBT advocates cheered the decision, and one would think that most conservatives would accept a simple ban on unjust dismissals. However, dissenting Justice Samuel Alito argued that the decision could have far-reaching consequences. Alito argued that by conflating 'sex' with 'sexual orientation and gender identity' in an employment statute, similar laws surrounding issues of 'sex' will be interpreted the same. Transgender people, he wrote, will now 'be able to argue that they are entitled to use' bathrooms and locker rooms reserved for one gender. Likewise, he argued that religious schools and universities may no longer be able to legally segregate dorm rooms, healthcare providers may be forced to cover sex-reassignment surgery, and employers and teachers may be punished for addressing their employees and students by incorrect pronouns. Democrats have thus far failed to pass the Equality Act, a piece of legislation that would grant these provisions.... The Right's losses weren't limited to the LGBT decision. The court also chose to toss out a dozen gun rights cases, which sought to overturn a slew of state-level firearms restrictions, including magazine capacity limits and handgun carry bans. Furthermore, the court threw out the Trump administration's case against California's 'Sanctuary State' laws that forbid local authorities from assisting federal immigration authorities. Trump has previously called these laws 'deadly and unconstitutional,' and claimed that the Golden State 'provides safe harbor to some of the most vicious and violent offenders on Earth. 'Altogether, the Supreme Court dealt Trump a devastating three-punch combination. Religious freedom, gun rights, and strict immigration control are cornerstones of Republican orthodoxy, and the LGBT ruling's basis on the Civil Rights Act makes it politically impossible to argue against, considering the 'Black Lives Matter' protests consuming the U.S. at present."

"Defunding police is yet another proposed solution based on a false narrative that will only make life worse for blacks in America, contends the former, four-time elected sheriff of multi-racial Milwaukee County. 'The biggest losers in all this will be poor black people in crime-ridden ghettos.

The police are the only thing standing between them and violent criminal predators,' said David Clarke in an interview with WND. 'You'd have to loathe black people to do that to them.' Clarke, 63, said the proposal advocated by the Black Lives Matter movement, which has quickly gained traction among Democrat leaders in cities such as Los Angeles, New York and Minneapolis, 'isn't a serious public policy proposal, it's buffoonery. Police departments are already underfunded, why

not just turn policing into a 9 to 5, Monday through Friday operation? That is all they'll have money for.' Clarke rejects the assumption at the heart of the defund-police movement of 'systemic racism' in American law enforcement while acknowledging there are bad cops. Reforming police is the 'low-hanging fruit,' Clarke said. 'They won't push back. But the police

are not the problem.' He contends 'racialist' black leaders such as Al Sharpton are largely ignoring the devastating impact of the \$22 trillion spent on welfare and poverty programs over the past 50 years that have had the unintended effect of fostering fatherless homes, with 75 percent of blacks born out of wedlock. 'The first thing we need to do is a self-examination of our black community. Leave white men out of this for now,' he said. 'Look at the cultural dysfunction, the growing underclass, the ineffective parenting, the fatherless homes, the school failure, dropping out of school early, joining gangs, drug and alcohol abuse, teenagers having kids,' he said. Clarke acknowledged he was 'blessed' to grow up in a two-parent household. He was reared by a veteran of combat in Korea and a mother who provided the love as a stay-at-home mom for most of our young life. 'My dad instilled a sense of discipline in me, and he taught me to respect authority, and it started with him,' Clarke said. 'He was my first authority figure'. David Clarke, Sr., now 89, was an airborne Army Ranger during the Korean war who served in a segregated unit.... Clarke began his law-enforcement career in 1978 with the Milwaukee Police Department. He was a patrol officer for 11 years and then a homicide detective. He became a lieutenant in 1993 and a captain in 1999. He won election four times as sheriff of Milwaukee County, Wisconsin, from 2002 to 2017. A speaker at the 2016 Republican National Convention, he later joined the super PAC America First Action as a spokesman and senior advisor, serving until February 2019. He now focuses on his consulting business, America's Sheriff LLC, and speaks nationwide, mostly to Republican and lawenforcement groups. Clarke called the actions of Minneapolis police officer Derek Chauvin in the death of George Floyd 'abhorrent' and 'bad tactics' but an 'anomaly,' noting statistics compiled by the Washington Post and studies such as one reported by the Post showing officers are three times less likely to shoot unarmed black suspects than unarmed white suspects....In contrast, he pointed out, over the last three weekends in Chicago alone, 175 black people were shot by other black people, leaving 42 dead. Clarke said there is 'too much groupthink' in the black community, quashing critical, independent thought and debate."

This is by no means as safe and easy as they make it out to be.... Despite outcry by Democrats and the media, President Trump is correct. Mass mail-in voting would jeopardize the sanctity of the 2020 election. The use of mail-in ballots on a national scale would surely encourage fraud and invite abuse of the voting system. The ease with which vote tallies can be manipulated in such a scenario is not only deeply concerning but has the potential to alter the outcome of national elections. According to ProPublica, a 2005 bipartisan commission led by former President Jimmy Carter and then-Secretary of State James Baker III found that mail-in ballots remain 'the largest source of potential voter fraud'. The Texas Tribune reported in 2017 that a controversy surrounding city-council races in Dallas ignited a legal firestorm after more than 700 ballots were sequestered following a review by the county's district attorney. This came after complaints from residents that they received an excessive number of mail-in ballots. A man was arrested for unlawfully filling out and turning in a blank ballot he was not issued. Another avenue for fraud associated with a mail-in election is 'ballot harvesting,' a popular practice in Democrat strongholds such as Orange County, California, during the 2018 elections. The Wall Street Journal points out that 27 states have laws in place that permit voters to designate an individual to return their ballot. Although such a policy may appear reasonable at first glance, there are often no restrictions on who these 'returners' are. According to the Orange County registrar, it was not uncommon to see one individual drop off 100 to 200 ballots. Can we be certain that all such returners would act fairly and in good faith under nationwide voting by mail? In May 2020, a Pennsylvania mail carrier faced federal charges of election fraud for doing just the opposite. President Trump, conservatives, and all those who advocate for fairness in our elections must continue to demand that a mail-in election not take place in November. Giving in to the power-hungry Democrats on this issue will assuredly compromise the integrity of the 2020 elections.
