THOUSANDS CHEER TRUMP REMARKS AT CPAC 2022 IN ORLANDO

We must congratulate President Biden for his major accomplishment that no one else has been able to obtain in many years. He has brought together Independents and moderate Democrats



to join with Republicans – all in OPPOSITION to his proposals. -0-

After not hearing from America's "favorite scientist" – Dr. Anthony Fauci – for a while, he came back on March 18 with a vengeance – declaring on TV that there will be "more lockdowns" if Covid spreads again. A sold-out audience of thousands of enthusiastic attendees of CPAC (Conservative Political Action Conference) 2022 in Orlando at the end of February, cheered **Donald Trump**, our 45th President, as he delivered the keynote address, speaking about his administration's successes, the problems brought about by the Biden Administration, and his promise to bring back America "stronger than ever before."



Trump stressed that during his four-years in office, no country in the world was attacked by another, and no members of the U.S. military lost their lives. "Under Bush," he said, "Russia invaded Georgia. Under, Obama, Russia took Crimea. Under Biden, Russian invaded Ukraine. I stand as the only president of the 21st Century on whose watch Russia did not invade another country."

Hammering President Biden, on whose watch Russia has invaded Ukraine, and 13 members of the U.S. military were killed during the botched U.S. departure from Afghanistan, Trump said "You could take the five worst presidents in American history and put them together, and they would not have done the damage that Joe Biden and his administration has done in just a very short 13 months."

He said Biden has turned "calm into chaos, competence into incompetence, stability into anarchy, and security into catastrophe. As everyone understands, this horrific disaster would never have happened if our election was not rigged, and if I was the president."

While still not formally announcing a third White House bid, Trump did promise to return the nation to the "great again" status achieved during his administration. He still remains CPAC's top choice to run again in 2024. An unofficial straw poll of 55 percent of CPAC attendees – announced at the end of the conference – favored Trump running again. Popular Florida Governor Ron DeSantis came in second with 28 percent of the vote, and all other Republicans on the list were in single digits.

Trump's speech also blasted the Biden administration for rising crime in the country, its support of "woke" left-wing racism, and its federal funding of schools that teach critical race theory. He also promised to defend the rights of parents in the public education system, and with victory in 2022 should launch a special committee to investigate Big Tech over the censorship of the Hunter Biden laptop story and the \$417 million spent by Facebook CEO Mark Zuckerberg to

influence local elections. He also pledged to finish the southern border wall "very quickly, in a matter of weeks."

He warned that the integrity of the 2022 and 2024 elections will be in question unless the 2020 presidential election is fully investigated., and he called for new reforms that would block expanding the Supreme Court, which some Democrats support, but said he has been disappointed in how the High Court has ruled and suggested perhaps the Republicans should add seats.

Regarding Ukraine, Trump said he is a strong supporter of the country, and he argued that sanctions against Russia are not a strong enough deterrent. His comments on Ukraine veered from calling the invasion by Russia "appalling," a "catastrophic disaster" and a "travesty and assault on humanity" to declaring that "the Biden administration cares more about helping citizens of a distant foreign nation than it does about our own citizens."

Referring to illegal immigration on the U.S. Southern border, Trump also said, "I believe Americans deserve a president who will stop the invasion of our country." He added that it is "interesting that so many Democrat politicians in Washington seem to be rushing to the microphones to declare that Ukraine's borders are sacred.... even while they destroy our own borders and surrender our own sovereignty.

Following are brief synopses of remarks by just a few of the several dozen other speakers during the four-day CPAC event.



Florida Governor Ron DeSantis, in his speech, lashed out against national Democrats, COVID-19 restrictions and other attacks on freedom, fueling speculation about a potential 2024 presidential bid. His speech, in essence, was a rundown of the grievances and political victories that have helped make DeSantis a conservative superstar, both in Florida and nationally.

He mentioned rejecting the use of vaccine mandates and received a standing ovation after saying that Florida has banned the teaching of critical race theory in schools. DeSantis also criticized critical race theory, and said, "We are not going to teach our children to hate themselves and hate each other." He took aim at President Biden, whom he claimed, "hates Florida," and several shots at Anthony Fauci, Biden's chief medical adviser, saying he "refused to let this state descend into some kind of Faucian dystopia."

Florida Republican Senator Rick Scott lambasted the "militant left" in his CPAC address and exalted his new 11-point plan as the Republican Party's best defense against an "enemy within." He portrayed America as a nation under siege by socialist actors — media, academia and Hollywood, among others.



Those actors, Scott warned, "still want more." He said they are "plotting to redefine government and silence conservatives. They're also seeking to destroy religious liberty, gender identity and capitalism. They want to end the American experiment."

The blueprint for Scott's 11-point plan calls for a dramatic federal intervention. It also capitalizes on the culture war and rising political tensions.

Here are the 11 points in his Rescue America Plan: 1) Our kids will say the pledge of allegiance, salute the Flag, learn that America is a great country, and choose the school that best fits them. 2) Government will never again ask American citizens to disclose their race, ethnicity, or skin color on any government forms. 3) The soft-on-crime days of coddling criminal behavior will end. We will re-fund and respect the police. 4) We will secure our border, finish building the wall, and name it after President Donald Trump. 5) We will grow America's economy, starve Washington's economy, and stop Socialism. 6) We will eliminate all federal programs that can be done locally and enact term limits for federal bureaucrats and Congress.7) We will protect the integrity of American Democracy and stop left-wing efforts to rig elections. 8) We will protect, defend, and promote the American Family at all costs. 9) Men are men, women are women, and unborn babies are babies. 10) Americans will be free to welcome God into all aspects of our lives. And 11) We are Americans, not globalists.



Florida Senator Marco Rubio warned the CPAC Audience about the advance of Marxism in America, and he attacked "cancel culture," COVID-19 mandates and left-wing school curricula, arguing it would result in a significant loss of freedom in the U.S. unless the public rebels against it.

"I believe there are a lot of people in this country influenced by Marxism that don't even realize it," he said, "and it's infused every aspect of our lives and of our society."

Rubio has remained focused on his top Senate role on the intelligence panel and his quest for a third term.

He drew a comparison between left-wing speech codes and rewriting of school curricula with the communist Cuban regime that forced his parents to flee the country for the U.S. decades ago.

"Now imagine you're living in a country and some of the same things seem to be happening again," Rubio said. "Now

your kids are being told in schools things about history, about society and about our country that simply are untrue."



Texas Senator Ted Cruz called on the CPAC attendees to "fight power, fight big government, fight big tech." And do not ever apologize to the Woke mob, he said, "It doesn't work." Cruz said.

"The Chinese communists and Elizabeth Warren both want to control you," Cruz said. "Your assets, your

savings, your speech, your life, your children, every decision they want to control, and so we need to break up the means of controlling the citizenry.

He also blamed Joe Biden for Russia's invasion of Ukraine and made it clear that the Russian president did not invade any country while Donald Trump was in office. Biden "immediately projected weakness" once he took office, Cruz added. Unfortunately, he said, the Biden White House made a political decision to surrender to Russia and surrender to Putin."

Former Secretary of State Mike Pompeo told the attendees, "You should know that we defended the border, protecting American sovereignty. We built the Wall. We changed the course of history. If you want to come to America, the greatest nation in history sounds great. Then go back and wait.



"We provided security for the United States. We protected every human life. I couldn't be more proud of the fact that when I came into being Secretary of State, your money that was being paid in American taxes is going to foreign countries being used to promote abortion around the world," he said.

Pompeo said he has watched people who didn't even know where their school board meetings were being held saying, "I am going to run for School Board." He added that he has watched people sacrifice so much to go fight for what matters in City Council races and County Commission races, and for District Attorneys. "Let's be in the fight. Let's never give an inch. Let's never compromise. Clearly speak to America, and say humbly but boldly, "This is the greatest nation in civilization, and it's not going to change on my watch."



In his CPAC remarks, veteran Republican diplomat **Ric Grenell** blamed President Biden for Russia's invasion of Ukraine. Grenell, who previously served as U.S. ambassador to Germany and later acting Director of National Intelligence, said that Biden emboldened Russian President Vladimir Putin because he failed to use the toughest diplomatic and

economic sanctions at his disposal to deter Moscow before the invasion of Ukraine commenced.

"President Biden told us that he was going to bring diplomacy back. Instead, it's on its back. We desperately need new, creative, visionary diplomacy – muscular diplomacy to secure meaningful peace when a conflict arises," he said. "Is American diplomacy working?," he asked the CPAC audience. "Europe has seen its borders rewritten this week under Joe Biden – and in 2014 when Barack Obama was president. And yet, the Left continues to mock the successful America First diplomatic strategy.

Grennell said U.S. diplomacy under Trump was competent, effective, and unappreciated, if not outright slandered by Democrats and a compliant media that did not give the former president the credit he deserved for his successes." He added, "They pretend that Donald Trump's unpredictability was harmful. Well, I saw firsthand that having a president putting the American people first and calling out the Germans for their hypocrisy and not telling our enemies what our strategy is – that made America and Europe safer."

Sebastian Gorka, former Deputy Assistant to President Trump and a military and intelligence analyst, said the biggest threat America faces today is a lack of courage, and the Hungarian-American added that "we must fight for our country and all those who value freedom."



We have the "greatest nation on God's green earth," and this is the time for

courage, he added. Gorka pointed out that unelected bureaucrats shut down our economy over the coronavirus pandemic, "and we just let them." He said that "We are the last hope of humanity." Gorka pointed out proudly that he is a free man because his Dad was liberated in Hungary in 1956.

National Rifle Association Executive Vice President Wayne La Pierre said that the liberal media can "keep hating" him, but he is still standing "unapologetic and unflinching in defense of our individual freedom." NRA's nearly five million members and America's 100 million gun owners "will not back down – not now, not ever," he said.



La Pierre added, "The Second Amendment is not just words on a parchment, It's not some frivolous suggestion from our Founding Fathers to be interpreted by whim. It lies at the heart of what this country was founded upon. Our Founding Fathers knew that without Second Amendment freedom, all of our freedoms could be in

jeopardy." He said, "Our individual liberty is the very essence of America. It is what makes America unique. If you aren't free to protect yourself – when government puts its thumb on

that freedom – then you aren't free at all."

LaPierre also said that "we want criminals with guns prosecuted and incarcerated. We want the federal gun laws on the books right now enforced against felons with guns, drug dealers with guns, and gangs with guns. If they'd do that, those violent criminals wouldn't be on their way to the next crime. They'd be in prison." Explaining that we want our children to be safe and protected, La Pierre said that is why NRA has proposed that there be trained police and security officers in every school.

Former Democrat Congresswoman Tulsi Gabbard of

Hawaii, who has been vocal in recent months against Biden administration policies and invited to speak at CPAC, said she was going to talk about "the need for us to actually treat each other with respect and end this tribalism and divisiveness that's tearing us apart." Gabbard has blamed Biden and the NATO allies for provoking a war with Russia by not declaring that Ukraine



would never be a NATO member. Had that demand been met, she said, then Vladimir Putin would not have attempted to take back territory that he has long wanted to annex.

"The fact that we're seeing things play out as they are should not be of any surprise to anyone," Gabbard said, "because again Putin has been clear for years that this has been the red line." The main part of her remarks was the takedown of the so-called "power elite," who, she said, "think free speech is something that should only be left to those who agree with them. The latest strategy and tactic that they're using is to try to undermine our free speech by taking it upon themselves to say they've got the responsibility to protect us from so called 'misinformation'".

Gabbard added, "So basically, they're saying that they are going to protect us from that which they claim is not true."

She said the left uses "emergencies" and "times of war" to enlarge the security state and further erode American liberty and fundamental rights. Gabbard also said the PATRIOT Act and the response to COVID-19 are both examples of the government working with Big Tech to cancel and censor what it calls "misinformation," which she says is happening again in response to the Russian invasion of Ukraine. The former Congresswoman accused the leaders of the U.S. government of "working with their mouthpieces – the mainstream media and big tech – doing exactly what our Founders rejected."

She said she's still a Democrat, despite embracing culture war issues popular among the right and criticizing President Joe Biden on foreign policy. As a four-term congresswoman from Hawaii and an Iraq war veteran, she demanded that then-President Barack Obama use the word "radical Islam" when talking terrorism. She also bucked her party in 2016 by endorsing Vermont Senator Bernie Sanders over Hillary Clinton.



Criticizing the Biden Administration, South Dakota Governor Kristi Noem said a strong American president would "restart and expedite the Keystone XL Pipeline; re-open federal lands to drilling and oil and natural gas exploration and revoke the bans on oil and gas leases in the Outer Continental Shelf; sign an executive

order to cut regulations on domestic energy production and its transport to American and European markets; work with European allies and partners to replace their supply of Russian energy with American energy; hit Putin where it actually hurts: by enacting heavy sanctions on the Russian energy sector; and lead NATO and other Western allies to cut Russia off from the Western economy, banking, financial systems – including SWIFT."

She added, "If Joe Biden can't or won't do all of those things, he should resign immediately before his weak leadership and poor decision-making drag America into another needless war." Sadly, Noem said, "Almost every major institution in our society today has been compromised against commonsense, truth, and freedom: The Democrat Party and their allies in big tech, Hollywood, and the media." She said that as Governor, she believed the best way to fight a danger to our country was through an informed and free American people who made decisions for themselves. "I refused to use unconstitutional powers," Noem said. "We never issued mask mandates. We didn't mandate vaccines. We never kept anybody from going to church. We kept kids in the classroom. I did not arrest, ticket, or fine a single individual for exercising their basic rights. South Dakota was the ONLY state that never even defined what an 'essential business' was."

Noting that the Left divides people, while Conservatives unite, she said, "The Left crushes free speech. Conservatives celebrate free expression. The Left says America is racist and evil. Conservatives know America is not the sum of her past mistakes."

and eat us. If he only has a minor incursion, he will be satisfied.

Is this Neville Chamberlain or Joe Biden? Are we referencing Hitler or Putin?

In the days leading up to Word War II, Neville Chamberlain was reluctant to challenge Nazi Germany and Adolph Hitler.

In an attempt to avoid a world-wide conflict in which Britain

was not prepared to engage, Chamberlain and his government decided to go down the path of appeasement. When Hitler annexed Austria, the governments of the west did nothing. When Hitler invaded the Sudetenland, the area of Czechoslovakia that was occupied by German speaking people, the west thought Hitler would be satisfied and stop there. When he invaded Poland, the west hoped that would be the end of Hitler's grand vision to reunite all Aryans under the Nazi flag.

History showed that it was only a bid to buy time to rearm and defend the homeland. There was debate as to whether this was a good move allowing Britain and France to be able to stop Hitler. While they geared up to confront the Nazis, the population of the annexed countries and territories suffered greatly under German control. As Hitler considered the weakness of the western governments, he became more emboldened to continue his Lebensraum eastward, eventually invading Russia and westward defeating France.

Fast forward to recent world events.

First there was Chechnya, and the world did nothing. Then came Georgia. Russia. under Putin. annexed two areas of Georgia, and the world did nothing. Crimea soon followed and was annexed Putin's Russian



Federation. Again, the world stood by and allowed this to happen without confronting Putin. Emboldened by these two relatively easy victories, Putin revised history and his propaganda machine convinced many

in Russia that Ukraine was a threat and needed to be rescued and become a part of the Russian Federation. Putin and Russia's influence can be seen in Syria. The Russian Federation has been, in the past and currently, moving to take control of a great part of the North Pole, stating that the area has great influence needed by Russia. Putin smelled victory, assuming that, once again, the world would do nothing.

What contributed to his decision?

Biden's administration has shown a weakness to confront our enemies. The debacle of Biden's botched Afghanistan withdrawal and the quick takeover of the country by the Taliban showed how inadequate this administration is when confronted by our adversaries.

Decisions to slow walk arming Ukraine further bolstered Putin's decision to invade a sovereign country. In January 2022, during a long and rambling "press conference," Joe Biden further encouraged Putin's ambitions by saying Russia would face "minor" consequences if they restrained themselves to a "minor" invasion of Ukraine.

Philosopher George Santayana famously said, "Those who do not learn history are doomed to repeat it." Neville Chamberlain feared antagonizing Hitler and only delayed a war while allowing much of Europe to fall under a madman's influence and control. Today we often hear that certain weapon, such as Mig fighters from Poland, would antagonize Putin. We still have many sanctions that the West can impose but the fear of antagonizing Putin weighs heavily in the decision as to whether or not to employ them.

Are we "not learning history"? Are we only delaying the inevitable or can we avoid the pitfalls of Chamberlain and stand up to the bully in the neighborhood by confronting him now?

The world has not seen such a madman in control of a vast array of weapons since Hitler, Stalin, and Japan's Tojo.

Avoiding World War III is of paramount importance, but at what cost? The answer to that is above my paygrade, but stopping Putin is a must.

and one of America's top 100 Black Business and Professional Women and chairman of the National Black Republican Association.

However, Biden's efforts for alliance backfired as Chinese officials forwarded the same to Moscow, leading up to Russia's invasion of Ukraine on February 23, 2022. Joe Biden and his administration are now being vehemently criticized for poor diplomatic foresight. Meanwhile, the POTUS himself left the White House to attend a family event in Delaware, amid growing demands for U,S, military intervention in Ukraine."

--So why did Russia invade Ukraine? Leave it to the Democratic Socialists of America (DSA) – an organization that includes in its membership New York Congresswoman Alexandria Ocasio Cortez and Vermont Senator Bernie Sanders – to blame the United States and NATO's "imperialist expansion" for helping to trigger the move. The DSA also said, "While the failures of neoliberal order are clear to everyone, the ruling class is trying to build a new world, through a dystopic transition grounded in militarism, imperialism, and war. The victim's mother, Jamie Tribbett, said the girls didn't bully her, "They tortured her, mentally, physically tortured my daughter, and it's not right. Now, for the rest of her life, she has to look over her shoulder or wonder if she can trust this person or that person."

--According to Britain's "Daily Mail", as Europe descends into war, British spies are being urged to consider their "white privilege" and declare their pronouns. This comes from a leaked report on "improving diversity" in the security services, written by Sir Stephen Lovegrove, the UK's national security adviser. It also advises against using gendered terms like "manpower" and even words like "strong" and "grip," which can "reinforce dominant cultural patterns."

--It is bad enough that leftists oppose the popular Chick-fil-A restaurants for religious reasons. Now the City Council of Santa Barbara, California, has joined the opposition. Why does the City Council consider one of the restaurant's sites "a public nuisance" that has to be shut down? Because it is so popular, the drive-through area is causing traffic congestion. One council member said the problem is not about the goodness of the company, it is that they have "outgrown their site."

FLORIDA STATE LEGISLATURE. Completing its 2022 term on March 14, the Florida State Legislature agreed to a \$112.1 billion budget for FY 2022-23, which now goes to Florida Governor Ron DeSantis for consideration. He does have line-item veto power which could lower the budget's Over the next weeks, the governor will be considering several thousand bills passed by the state legislature on a variety of issues. Among those bills that DeSantis had signed by press time were approval of an Emergency Preparedness and Response Fund for the state, extending the length of time that health care providers receive liability protections from Covid-related claims, assistance for patients recovering from substance abuse disorder or mental illness, revising appointment criteria for executive appointments, and designating strawberry shortcake as Florida's official state dessert. At the end of the session, Senate President Wilton Simpson said his goal was "to seize our days like a farmer, with long-term vision, knowing that what we plant today is for a future harvest," and adding, "despite the unanticipated challenges of a global pandemic, we accomplished that goal with key structural changes that will benefit the people of Florida for generations to come." Florida House Speaker Chris Sprowls said he is "proud that we have no regrets and that we started and finished with a bold vision for Florida, whether that was in having the largest expansion of school choice or protecting our environment." He added that he is also "proud that we fought boldly and got to leave this Session in the Florida House with nothing left behind."



U.S. SUPREME COURT. This month, the U.S. Supreme Court reinstated the death sentence for Dzhokhar Tsarnaev, who was convicted in the 2013 Boston Marathon

bombing that killed three people and wounded hundreds more. In 2020, an appeals court had set aside the sentence, finding that the trial judge erred in excluding mitigating evidence that suggested the defendant's elder brother, Tamerlan, was more culpable for the attack and limiting the questions defense attorneys could ask prospective jurors about their exposure to news accounts

of the crime. But by a 6-3 vote, the Supreme Court found neither issue undermined the jury's decision to recommend death.

The high court, in a 7-2 decision in the case of the United States v. Zubaydah, an inmate at Guantanamo Bay, reversed and remanded the Ninth Circuit Court of Appeals with instructions to dismiss Zubaydah's current discovery application. The Court held that Section 1806(f) of the Foreign Intelligence Services Act does not displace the state's secret privilege.

RED WAVE VICTORY DINNER. Republican Party of Florida Executive Director Helene Ferre, the keynote speaker at the Brevard Federated Republican Women's first Red Wave Victory Dinner in Cocoa, Florida, on March 19,

said the upcoming 2022 election is "the most important election in decades, and that to save our country from the insane Left agenda, Republican women must come together and fight the good fight from local elections up." She emphasized the need to take control of our schools and school boards, and to stop the teaching of hate for others and our country. Ferre also stressed "the need for Republican women to protect our cities, our businesses, our veterans, our seniors, our families, and our faith, and do so we must work together to win city and county elections." And she reminded the dinner attendees that Florida Governor Ron DeSantis believes that Republican women are the reason he won in 2018, and she hoped they will return him to office in 2022. Also on the program, Florida Congressman Bill Posey and Florida State Senator Tom Wright briefly addressed the crowd, and there were video presentations from Florida Senators Marco Rubio and Rick Scott. Arizona history. Proposition 208 had sought to double the income taxes imposed on small-business owners and individuals making more than \$250,000 a year. If it had gone into effect it would have led to staggering job losses and turned Arizona from one of the lowest-taxed states in the nation to one of the highest. The Goldwater Institute had challenged the proposition for violating the state Constitution's restrictions on spending and taxation, making



the case on behalf of taxpayers and small business owners. The campaign to pass Prop. 208 was fueled by classwarfare and false information – funded by unions and out-of-state special interests. Goldwater Institute President and CEO Victor Riches said real results for liberty were accomplished by working in state

courts, legislatures and communities to advance, defend, and strengthen the freedom guaranteed by the constitutions of the United States and the fifty states. "This historic reform restored Arizona's competitive advantage as a low-tax state," Riches said, "and provided a boost for small business owners still struggling to recover from the government's response to the COVID pandemic."

Fifth, Americans know that our current inflation is self-induced, not a product of a war abroad, an earthquake, or the exhaustion of gas and oil deposits. Biden ignored the natural inflationary buying spree of consumers who were released from being locked down for nearly two years unable to spend. Journalist **Bob Unruh**, writing on Biden blasts Texas for plan to protect children from surgical mutilation at WND.com:

"Joe Biden has blasted a strategy in Texas that would protect children from bodily disfigurements through transgender surgeries, accusing the state of weaponizing child protective services

to fight the agenda that claims men can become women or women can become men. "The Western Journal' reported just days ago that Governor Greg Abbott directed the Department of Family and Protective Services to begin investigating those so-called 'sex change' procedures involving minors as child abuse. Following the science, those swaps aren't possible, as being male or female is embedded in the human body down to the DNA level. The governor's ruling was based on a legal opinion from the Texas attorney general defining various sex change procedures performed on minors as unlawful. According to the letter, medical professionals are already required to report incidences of children subjected to sex change procedures under state law. 'The Daily Mail' reported Biden's reaction was to tear into the state's 'cynical and dangerous' plan and claim Abbott was 'weaponizing child

protective services against loving families.' The comments came even as a judge ordered a halt to a single investigation that had begun involving a 16-year-old child who already apparently had been put on drugs, putting the judge in the position of potentially allowing those body mutilations to continue. Biden, whose own administration has ordered people to wear masks, to take experimental shots, and stay home from church, claimed the state effort to protect children was 'government overreach at its worst.' The president argued for the politically correct position of letting children have the surgeries, saying, 'Today, the Department of Health and Human Services has announced several actions to keep transgender children in Texas and their families safe - putting the state of Texas on notice that their discriminatory actions put children's lives at risk.' Journalist and author **Matt Rosenberg**, writing on Spiraling Violence in Chicago in Hillsdale College's "Imprimis":

"For several years prior to 2020, violent crime in America's major cities was on the decline. But since the riots that summer following the death of



George Floyd, it is heading in the opposite direction. Murders nationwide in 2020 rose a stunning 29.4 percent over the previous year, the largest annual increase since the FBI began tracking that data in the 1960s. The number of murders in Chicago climbed even more sharply, rising 55 percent. It was as if a switch had been flipped. At least ten major U.S. cities hit new murder highs in 2021, but Chicago led the way with 797, the city's highest number in 25 years. Chicago's violent crime epidemic is not limited to murder. The city's 3,561 shooting incidents in 2021 were up 63 percent over 2019. Expressway shootings in Chicago-Cook County rose even more dramatically, from 51 in 2019 to 130 in 2020 to 273 in 2021. These expressway shootings pushed Chicago's actual 2021 murder total north of 800....Then there are the

carjackings, 1,836 of them in Chicago in 2021 – a 204 percent increase over 2019. One victim was a Democratic state senator. Her husband had a gun and returned fire. In another incident, a Cook County judge had to pull her three-year-old son to safety before the carjackers drove off.... Chicago reported a 53 percent rate of 'clearing' or solving murders in 2019. But that number was inflated. A misguiding technical term was applied to nearly six in ten 'cleared' murders: closed exceptionally.' The term exceptionally' means that a murder has been declared solved, but without the filing of criminal charges – usually because prosecutors decide police evidence is insufficient.... What can be done to address Chicago's violent crime epidemic? Here are some ideas for legal reform suggested by the cases cited above: Reapportion the county budget to build and operate more courtrooms with more judges for speedier trials. Stop releasing people charged with violent felony crimes including juveniles charged with armed carjacking – on lowcash or no-cash bail. Repeal state legislation that will outlaw most cash bail by 2023. Repeal the 2016 statute that severely restricts the ability of county prosecutors to charge juveniles with felony armed vehicular hijacking. Unfortunately, the last two recommendations would require action by the Illinois Legislature, which has been under one-party (Democratic) rule for decades and has shown no serious interest in stopping crime.... The Left today has badly misappropriated the word 'equity,' using it to mean equality of outcome – something to be achieved through affirmative action and economic redistribution. But real equity, in the old sense, cannot be given. Real equity requires the old fashioned virtues. It is inextricable from full ownership of your own course in life."






