The Florida State Legislature ended its regular 60-day session on April 30, having approved a budget of \$101.5 billion for fiscal year 2021-22 – a higher amount than **Governor Ron DeSantis'** proposed \$96.6 billion. He has until the end of May to sign the budget, veto it, or line-item veto individual expenses.

While passing an annual budget is the ONLY responsibility for the State Legislature, the members go far beyond that, discussing 3,140 other bills and 2,632 amendments; taking 3,788 votes; and passing 275 bills in both chambers during 39 floor sessions.

Then, on May 17, The Legislature returned to Tallahassee for a special one-week session dealing only with a Gaming Compact with the Seminole Indian Tribe to expand gambling in the state. The House passed that measure 97-17, and the Senate vote was 38-1. DeSantis approves the measure that still has to go to the U.S. Department of Interior's Office of Indian Gaming.

Even if federal approval is given, however, a group called No Casinos plans to file a court challenge over whether it runs counter to a 2018 Florida Constitutional Amendment requiring any expansion of gambling in the state go before voters – who already have opposed any increase.



DeSantis, meanwhile, has already signed a number of measures approved in the regular session. Here's just a few of them:

- --More than \$168 million in taxpayer savings for families, including sales tax holidays for disaster preparedness, a "Freedom Week", and back-to-school purchases.
- --The "Combating Public Disorder Act" to uphold the rule of law
- -- Landmark legislation to ban vaccine passports in the state.
- --A requirement for the Department of Health to create a state public health emergency management plan.
- --An election integrity bill strengthening voter ID, prohibiting the mass mailing of ballots, and banning ballot harvesting.
- --Improving state accountability for early learning programs and identifying students that need additional support.
- -- An update to the Right to Farm Act.
- --Allowing restaurants in the state to sell to-go alcoholic beverages in unopened containers.
- -- An anti-Semitism protection measure.

Among the topics of other bills sent to the governor for signature or veto include the environment, insurance policies, and minimum wages.

# SENATOR TIM SCOTT REBUTTAL REMARKS



After President Biden delivered his non-State of the Union address to a joint session of Congress and the American people on April 28 – which included how he would give everything but the kitchen sink to illegal aliens, increasing taxes on the rich, and urging Congress to take action on gun violence and police

reform – **South Carolina Republican Senator Tim Scott** delivered the Republican Party's rebuttal remarks.

He said he was saddened that many schools were not opened in the United States, and millions of children lost a year of learning; and that regarding infrastructure, the Democrats' massive, proposed bill only calls for six percent of funding to actually be used for roads and bridges, while the rest is "a liberal wish list of big government waste." Scott also pointed out that Biden wants to fund abortions with tax payer money and to pack the Supreme Court with liberal justices.

"A president who promised to bring us together should not be pushing agendas that tear us apart. The American family deserves better," Scott said. Just before COVID struck, he said, "We had the most inclusive economy in my lifetime. The lowest unemployment rate ever recorded for African Americans, Hispanics and Asians. And a 70-year low, nearly, for women. Wages were growing faster at the bottom than at the top. The bottom 25 percent saw their wages go up faster than the top 25 percent. That happened because Republicans focus on expanding opportunity for all Americans."

Following are excerpts of Scott's speech:

(Begin excerpts)

"Our president seems like a good man. His speech was full of good words. But President Biden promised you a specific kind of leadership. He promised to unite a nation. To lower the temperature. To govern for all Americans, no matter how we voted. This was the pitch. You just heard it again. But our nation is starving for more than empty platitudes. We need policies and progress that bring us closer together. But three months in, the actions of the president and his party are pulling us further and further apart.

I won't waste your time tonight with finger-pointing or partisan bickering. You can get that on TV anytime you want. I want to have an honest conversation about common sense and common ground. About this feeling that our nation is sliding off its shared foundation, and how we move forward together....

I'm saddened that millions of kids have lost a year of learning when they could not afford to lose a single day. Locking vulnerable kids out of the classroom is locking adults out of their future. Our public schools should have reopened months ago. Other countries did. Private and religious schools did. Science has shown for months that schools are safe. But too often, powerful grown-ups set science aside. And kids like me were left behind. The clearest case I've seen for school choice in our lifetime is because we know that education is the closest thing to magic in America.

Last year, under Republican leadership, we passed five bipartisan Covid packages. Congress supported our schools, our hospitals, saved our economy, and funded Operation Warp Speed, delivering vaccines in record time. All five bills got 90 votes in the Senate. Common sense found common ground.

In February, Republicans told President Biden we wanted to keep working together to finish this fight. But Democrats wanted to go it alone. They spent almost \$2 trillion on a partisan bill that the White House bragged was the most liberal bill in American history. Only 1 percent went to vaccinations. No requirement to reopen schools promptly.

Another issue that should unite us is infrastructure. Republicans support everything you think of when you think of infrastructure. Roads, bridges, ports, airports, waterways, high-speed broadband – we're in for all of that. But again, Democrats want a partisan wish list. They won't even build bridges to build bridges.

Less than 6 percent of the president's plan goes to roads and bridges. It's a liberal wish list of big-government waste, plus the biggest job-killing tax hikes in a generation. Experts say, when all is said and done, it would lower wages of the average American worker and shrink our economy....

The president is also abandoning principles he held for decades. Now, he says your tax dollars should fund abortions. He's laying groundwork to pack the Supreme Court. This is not common ground.

Nowhere do we need common ground more desperately than in our discussions of race. I have experienced the pain of discrimination. I know what it feels like to be pulled over for no reason. To be followed around a store while I'm shopping. I remember, every morning, at the kitchen table, my grandfather would open the newspaper and read it – I thought. But later, I realized he had never learned to read it. He just wanted to set the right example.

I've also experienced a different kind of intolerance. I get called 'Uncle Tom' and the n-word by progressives, by liberals. Just last week, a national newspaper suggested my family's poverty was actually privilege because a relative owned land generations before my time....

Today, kids again are being taught that the color of their skin defines them, and if they look a certain way, they're an oppressor. From colleges to corporations to our culture, people are making money and gaining power by pretending we haven't made any progress at all, by doubling down on the divisions we've worked so hard to heal. You know this stuff is wrong. Hear me clearly: America is not a racist country. It's

backwards to fight discrimination with different types of discrimination. And it's wrong to try to use our painful past to dishonestly shut down debates in the present....

This is not about civil rights or our racial past. It's about rigging elections in the future. And, no, the same filibuster that President Obama and President Biden praised when they were senators, the same filibuster that the Democrats used to kill my police reform bill last year, has not suddenly become a racist relic just because the shoe is on the other foot.

Race is not a political weapon to settle every issue the way one side wants. It's far too important. This should be a joyful springtime for our nation. This administration inherited a tide that had already turned. The coronavirus is on the run. Thanks to Operation Warp Speed and the Trump administration, our country is flooded with safe and effective vaccines. Thanks to our bipartisan work last year, job openings are rebounding....

Our best future won't come from Washington schemes or socialist dreams. It will come from you, the American people. Black, Hispanic, white and Asian. Republican and Democrat. Brave police officers and Black neighborhoods. We are not adversaries. We are family. We are all in this together.

And we get to live in the greatest country on Earth. The country where my grandfather, in his 94 years, saw his family go from cotton to Congress in one lifetime. So I am more than hopeful – I am confident – that our finest hour has yet to come. Original sin is never the end of the story. Not in our souls, and not for our nation. The real story is always redemption.

--The Biden Administration, for refusing to permit the "Rolling Thunder" motorcycle event to take place on Memorial Day to honor America's fallen heroes. The traditional event that brings together thousands of veterans from across the country has been held for the last 32 years. Patriots and some Congressional lawmakers are outraged.

--NARAL and other abortion advocate groups, for celebrating abortion "in honor of Mother's Day." Live Action News called this "inhumane and cruel to both babies and women." -0-

--Four Washington, DC, police officers in two squad cars, for deciding instead of fighting crime or patrolling their beats, to

participate in a drag race, going 60 miles an hour in a 25 mph speed limit residential area, colliding and totaling both vehicles. They received minor injuries and suspension from their jobs pending a full investigation.

--The University of North Carolina Journalism School, for hiring "1619 Project" founder Nikole Hannah-Jones for a fixed-five year term as a professor, despite criticism from other academics. Focusing on slavery, the project contends America began that year with the arrival of African slaves and challenges the notion that it was either with the arrival of the Pilgrims or the 1776 battle for independence.

--Chicago Mayor Lori Lightfoot, for announcing she will only grant interviews on her two-year anniversary in office to "journalists of color," saying it was intended as an effort "to confront the issue of a mostly white and male City Hall press corps."

# THIS AND THAT

# REPRESENTATIVES ELISE STEFANIK AND LIZ

CHENEY. During a closed-door session voice-vote on May 12, House Republicans voted overwhelmingly to oust Nevada Representative Liz Cheney as Conference Chair, their third-ranking Republican leadership position in Congress. Two days later, Republican House members gathered again to replace Cheney, and New York Congresswoman Elise

**Stefanik** defeated **Texas Congressman Chip Roy** 134-46. Roy had criticized Stefanik for her previous record as a moderate Republican who had broken with **Donald Trump**, but she later became his defender, and she received his endorsement for the Conference Chair position. Both before and after the May 12 vote, a defiant Cheney claimed that

Trump provoked a violent attack on the Capitol on January 6 in an effort to steal the election and accused him of risking "inciting further violence." Cheney's tunnel vision fails to take into account that Trump had urged his supporters to "peacefully and patriotically make your voices heard."

Cheney also had clashed publicly with House Minority Leader Kevin McCarthy and other senior Republicans by pushing back on Trump's claims that the 2020 election had been stolen from him. She also said she wanted to do "everything she can" to keep Trump from returning to power. Republican lawmakers said her public comments put Chenev out of step with the majority of them, who wanted instead to avoid disputes and address party unity or shared conservative goals.



TUCKER CARLSON CRITICISM OF FRANK LUNTZ. Fox News host Tucker Carlson said that pollster Frank Luntz, who has been serving the Republican Party as a "message man" decades, telling for elected Republicans "what to say and precisely how to say it." The problem, Carlson

said, is that Luntz' personal views "are very different from

those of your average Republican voter. Frank Luntz is a conventional liberal. main clients are left-wing corporations like Google." Carlson criticized the Republican Party for continuing to rely on Luntz to understand the desires of the voting public. But, he said, "Year after year on issue after issue, the leadership of the



Republican Party fails to represent its voters, and we're not guessing about that." President Trump was elected in 2016, he said, because the establishment was out of touch, and they have learned no lessons about why this happened. Further expressing criticism of Luntz, Carlson said that back in 2003, when the opioid epidemic devastated entire regions of the United States, Luntz encouraged people to take more Oxycontin, and he admitted to being a "Big Pharma shill."



The latest client for First Liberty Institute, the largest legal organization in the nation dedicated exclusively to defending religious liberty for all Americans, is Army Chaplain Major Andrew Calvert, a decorated career officer based in Fort Hood, Texas, who faces career-ending punishment for

expressing his religious beliefs on his personal Facebook page. A chaplain whose duty is to provide religious and spiritual support, is facing career-ending punishment by the Army because some people found his Facebook page "offensive." Calvert is a highly decorated major, who in 16 years of service, has been deployed three times to combat zones and received the Bronze Star and three Meritorious

Service Medals. But that is unimportant to the followers of the toxic "cancel culture" infiltrating and threatening to destrov religious liberty in the military. Despite statements attesting to Chaplain Calvert's integrity and selfless military service, an Army investigator concluded that he was "guilty of discrimination" by sharing his religious views on Facebook even though he makes it clear that his posts and opinions are his own, meaning he's speaking as a private citizen and not on behalf of the military. And the religious views he expressed on his social media posts were consistent with existing Department of Defense policy at the time they were posted. But this led to Calvert being reprimanded and suspended during further investigation. First Liberty is committed to fighting these cases of anti-faith discrimination in the military - which are becoming more and more frequent. Its website is www.firstliberty.org.

Editorial Page Editor, and his goal is to make the paper "more balanced" between Liberal and Conservative thought. Noting that most newspapers – and the media in general – attract liberal writers and cater to a similar audience, he said he will



carry their information but would like to have more conservative material as well. He would like to have Letters to the Editor covering both sides of issues, Torres said. His favorite topics to write about are social and criminal justice issues, and Torres said he was proud to report on the wrongful convictions of William Dillon and Wilton Dedge and seeing both men go free. When not working, Torres said he enjoys acting in community theater productions, playing the piano and singing with a band.

THE REPUBLICAN CLUB OF BREVARD. Speaking



before The Republican Club of Brevard on May 6, Florida 6<sup>th</sup> District Congressman Michael Waltz urged members to "be engaged in the fight for our country." It is time, he said, for Americans to get back to serving again. This can be in the military, as he has been, Waltz said, or it can be in the Peace Corps, or in helping with medical

assistance in rural areas, or whatever. "It is easy to yell at the TV or go on social media," he said, "But we need to wake up." America's external threat is not radical Islam or Russia, but it is Communist China, Waltz stressed, noting that China is corrupting our universities and research facilities, and it is being funded by multinational corporations. In a "call to action," Waltz said if anyone picks up a product for sale that is marked "made in China," put it down and instead get a product marked "made in America." Regarding Afghanistan, where the Biden administration has announced a complete troop withdrawal, Waltz noted that we have Bagram Air Force Base there, that it borders China, and we still need that territory in the event of a confrontation with the Chinese. Prior to running for the Congressional seat once occupied by Florida Governor Ron DeSantis, Waltz was an Army Green Beret – the first one elected to Congress. He was a Special Forces Commander and a combat veteran with four Bronze Stars. "We need to get more veterans elected - even Democrats," he said, noting that he is living "the American Dream." And serving in Florida, he said he sees "a sense of optimism in the Sunshine State," which is "the model for America First."



# BREVARD FEDERATED REPUBLICAN WOMEN.

Discussing the recentlyended session of the Florida Legislature with the Brevard Federated Republican Women on May 5, **District** 32 State Representative

Anthony Sabatini said that among the bills passed by both

houses during the "great" 60-day session were five "really good ones" that **Florida Governor Ron DeSantis** supported. The five measures are: 1) banning social media censorship, the first state in the nation to do so; 2) a necessary anti-riot act, including a no bail provision; 3) no government-forced vaccine program, including cracking down on local government lockdown of businesses; 4) an election



bill ensuring that absentee ballot requests be made for each election, that voter ID is included on the ballot envelopes, and that there be a limitation of the number of ballot collection boxes; and 5) prohibiting transgender surgeries on children, protecting women's sports by not allowing transgendered athletes to participate, and shutting down gender clinics on university campuses. Sabatini, who announced he will be a candidate for the U.S. Congress in 2022, urged the BFRW members to contribute to individual candidates of their choice instead of sending money to party headquarters. Noting that some Republicans did not support President Trump when he was in office, Sabatini called them by their familiar name – RINOs (Republicans in Name Only) – and said they acted the way they did "because they didn't want to be called mean names by the media."

# REPUBLICAN LIBERTY CAUCUS OF CENTRAL EAST FLORIDA.

Members of the Republican Liberty Caucus of Central East Florida, at their meeting on May 5 re-elected for another two-year term **President Bob White**, **Vice President Rocket Weiler**, and



Secretary Steve Lindsley. Tracy Venerable was elected as the new club Treasurer. Directors elected to the Board were Blaise Trettis, Rik Venerable, Chandler Langevin, and Susan Lutian....Announcing to the RLC-CEF meeting that he



is a Republican candidate for the Florida U.S. Senate seat currently held by **Marco Rubio**, a former District Chairman in the St. Johns Republican Executive Committee, **Luis Miguel** of St. Augustine, said he is running because "a new generation of leaders is needed." Miguel's three main points are 1) the 2020 election was stolen, and the

country is not being governed, but occupied: 2) the goal of the

perpetrators of Covid is to steal our Constitutional rights; and 3) America is not a racist country. "We have to eradicate communism in our country, or they will eradicate us," he said, and "we need to secure the border." "What a difference a year makes," Posey said, explaining that since the January 6 "attack" on the U.S. Capitol building, and the fence that was constructed around it, the public is no longer allowed to enter it, and even Members of Congress have to go through magnetometers first. "It is all about theatrics," he said. "You (the American people) own it but you cannot get in it." Posey said he and his colleagues in the House Freedom Caucus are labeled as "insurrectionists" when they questioned voter fraud results during the 2020 election, even in states where it was "obvious." The current HB1, which the House passed and sent to the Senate, "is the worst piece of legislation ever seen," he said, because if passed by the Senate would end states handling elections (as determined in the Constitution) and federalize all of them. Posey said that as a Florida State Senator at the time of the Bush-Gore election in 2000, "I wanted every vote to count, and everybody was confident that all votes were counted." Election law, he stressed, "should be passed with bipartisan support." Hoping that Republicans regain control of the House in 2022, he also said he hoped the leadership then "does the right thing." Noting the Democrat push to give statehood to Washington, DC, he stressed that the Constitution "clearly says no" to the proposal, since the Founding Fathers only established it as a seat of government.

'With more than 3,000 rockets having been fired into Israel by Hamas recently, the Democrat Party seems paralyzed over how to respond to the latest Middle East war. It is not just that it fears that 'The Squad,' Black Lives Matter, the shock troops of Antifa, and Woke institutions such as academia and the media are now unapologetically anti-Israel. It is also

terrified that anti-Israelism is becoming synonymous with rank anti-Semitism. And soon, the Democrat Party will end up as disdained as the British Labour Party under Jeremy Corbyn. The new core of the Democrats, as emblemized by Representatives Alexandria Ocasio-Cortez of New York, Ilhan Omar of Minnesota, and Rashida Tlaib of Michigan, has in the past questioned the patriotism of American Jews who support Israel, and occasionally has had to apologize for puerile anti-Semitic rants. Underdog Israel was not so hated from 1947 to 1967. Then, it was poorer, more socialist, and in danger of being extinguished by its many neighboring enemies. But after the victories in the 1967 and 1973 wars, the Israeli military proved unconquerable in the region, no matter how large the numbers, wealth, and armaments of its many enemies. For the Left, Israel's current strength, confidence, and success mean it cannot be seen as a victim, but only as a victimizer. As its Iron Dome missile defenses knock down the flurry of Hamas rockets, and as its planes take out the military installations that launched those rockets, the Left bizarrely believes Israel wins too easily and acts 'disproportionately.' The Left also has a strange idea of current 'imperialism' and 'colonialism.' The general rule is that Westerners cannot settle in numbers in the non-West. But the reversal is certainly not true.... Hating democratic Israel while it is under attack is not just a reflection of the new Woke and ethically bankrupt Left. It is also a symptom of a deeper pathology in the West, one of moral equivalence, amoral relativism, and self-loathing. Hating Israel has become the surrogate Western way of hating oneself."

Public Policy Research Center Battlefront Founder Christopher Rufo, writing on Critical Race Theory at Hillsdale College's "Imprimis" publication:



"Critical race theory is an academic discipline, formulated in the 1990s, built on the intellectual framework of identity-based Marxism. Relegated for

many years to universities and obscure academic journals, over the past decade it has increasingly become the default ideology in our public institutions. It has been injected into government agencies, public school systems, teacher training programs, and corporate human resources departments in the form of diversity training programs, human resources policy frameworks, public and curricula....There are a series of euphemisms deployed by its supporters to describe critical race theory, including 'equity,' 'social justice,' 'diversity and inclusion,' and 'culturally responsive teaching'....In contrast to equality, equity as defined and promoted by critical race theorists is little more than reformulated Marxism. In the name of equity, UCLA Law Professor and critical race theorist Cheryl Harris has proposed suspending private property rights, seizing land and wealth and redistributing them along racial lines. Critical race guru Ibram X. Kendi, who directs the Center for Antiracist Research at Boston University, has proposed the creation of a federal Department of Antiracism. This department would be independent of (i.e., unaccountable to) the elected branches of government, and would have the power to nullify, veto, or abolish any law at any level of government and curtail the speech of political leaders and others who are deemed insufficiently 'antiracist'....One practical result of the creation of such a department would be the overthrow of capitalism, since according to Kendi,'In order to truly be antiracist, you also have to truly be anti-capitalist.' In other words, identity is the means and Marxism is the end.... What does critical race theory look like in practice? Last year, I authored a series of reports focused on critical race theory in the federal government. The FBI was holding workshops on intersectionality theory. The Department of Homeland Security was telling white employees they were committing 'microinequities' and had been 'socialized into oppressor roles.' The Treasury Department held a training session

telling staff members that 'virtually all white people contribute to racism' and that they must convert 'everyone in the federal government' to the ideology of 'antiracism'....This year, I produced another series of reports focused on critical race theory in education. In Cupertino, California, an elementary school forced first-graders to deconstruct their racial and sexual identities and rank themselves according to their 'power and privilege.' In Springfield, Missouri, a middle school forced teachers to locate themselves on an 'oppression matrix,' based on the idea that straight, white, Englishspeaking, Christian males are members of the oppressor class and must atone for their privilege and 'covert white supremacy'. ...I'm just one investigative journalist, but I've developed a database of more than 1,000 of these stories. When I say that critical race theory is becoming the operating ideology of our public institutions, it is not an exaggeration – from the universities to bureaucracies to k-12 school systems, critical race theory has permeated the collective intelligence and decision-making process of American government, with no sign of slowing down....There are three parts to a successful strategy to defeat the forces of critical race theory: governmental action, grassroots mobilization, and an appeal to principle....Above all, we must have courage - the fundamental virtue required in our time. Courage to stand and speak the truth. Courage to withstand epithets. Courage to face the mob. Courage to shrug off the scorn of the elites. Truth and justice are on our side. If we can muster the courage, we will win."
