For one brief, shining moment – when Florida reported its midterm election results the early evening of November 8 – it appeared that the pollsters' prediction of a "Red Wave" would occur throughout the nation.

In Florida Governor Ron DeSantis' re-election bid, he won by more than 1.5 million votes over his Democrat challenger. Florida Senator Marco Rubio won re-election by more than 1.3 million votes. All other state-wide races were either retained or won by Republican candidates — Attorney General Ashley Moody; Chief Financial Officer Jimmy Patronis; and running for Commissioner of Agriculture, Wilton Simpson.

Republicans won 20 of Florida's 28 seats in the House of Representatives – including our 8- term **Eighth District Congressman Bill Posey** – and took supermajorities in both the State Senate (28 of 40 seats) and State House (84 of 120 seats). The respective leaders of those two branches will be Senate President-designate **Kathleen Passidomo** and House Speaker-designate **Paul Renner.**

Among the successful Republicans in Brevard County races were **State Senator Tom Wright**, County Commission candidates **Tom Goodson** and **Rob Feltner**, and School Board candidate **Gene Trent**.

The conservative parental rights organization Moms for Liberty supported 67 candidates in school board races throughout Florida, and 41 of them won their races.



DeSantis, in his victory, carried a number of traditionally blue counties, plus Hispanic voters, who usually support Democrats. He already has promised more abortion restrictions and gun rights legislation in his second term and should have a Legislature eager to support the measures. Florida, he added, is where "woke" goes to die.

DeSantis boosted his stock as a potential 2024 presidential candidate, but many Floridians want him to serve four more full years as governor. Reportedly, his landslide victory is the largest win by a Republican governor in the Sunshine State in the last 150 years, and at his victory party, he said, "We have re-written the political map."

Four days before the election, DeSantis made a campaign stop in Melbourne at the Muscle Car Museum, where he spoke more about President Biden than his Democrat rival, focusing on inflation challenges, immigration policy, and coronavirus pandemic restrictions. As part of his "Don't Tread on Florida" tour of the state, DeSantis also urged the crowd to help give Republicans a majority in the U.S. Senate and House of Representatives.

But unfortunately, while pollsters had anticipated the GOP taking a 3-5 seat majority in the U.S. Senate and a 30-plus margin in the House, these goals failed to materialize – despite such factors as inflation, crime rates, illegal immigration, and the unpopularity of President Biden.

Why was that? According to political analyst **Dick Morris**, it was because many Republicans failed to take advantage of early voting, waited for Election Day itself, and then chose not to wait in long lines to cast their ballots. "This accounted for many of the defeats we had," Morris said.

At press time, Democrats held the Senate 50-49 with a runoff scheduled in Georgia on December 6 (even with a tie, the Vice President retains the tie breaker), but Republicans – with 218 seats – were projected to win the House with additional slim majorities in 5 uncalled California districts, and a close race in Colorado awaiting a recount.

Outgoing New York Congressman Lee Zeldin, who lost a close race to Democrat New York Governor Kathy Hochul in her re-election bid, said he is giving "serious consideration" to challenging incumbent Republican National Committee Chairwoman Ronna McDaniel when the RNC holds its winter meeting in January. McDaniel will be seeking her fourth two-year term. In a letter sent to the RNC members, Zeldin wrote, "It is time for our party to retool, transform, win back the presidency in 2024, expand our number of Republican-held seats in Congress, and elect the maximum number of down-ballot races across the country. The Republican Party needs to be all in to do everything in its power to save America."

In Brevard County, there were 11 amendments and referendums on the ballot, and even though the Republican Executive Committee recommended "no" votes on a number of them, the majority of Brevardians voted "yes" on all eleven. However, the three Florida Constitutional Amendments – on determination of assessed value for property taxes, abolishing the Constitution Revision Commission and property tax exemptions – all failed statewide by not reaching the 60 percent level. The other eight measures – only at the county level – just needed a simple majority to pass.

There also were questions on the Brevard County ballot concerning retention of 5 Florida Supreme Court Justices and 6 District Court of Appeal Judges. All received favorable votes, as did **Kimberly Musselman**, a candidate for a County Court Judge position who defeated **Renee Torpy** in a close race.

TRUMP ANNOUNCES A 2024 PRESIDENTIAL BID

One week to the day after the mid-term elections, former **President Donald Trump** announced in a 90-minute televised speech from his Mar-A-Lago home that "in order to make America great and glorious again, I am tonight announcing my candidacy for president of the United States."

"This will not be my campaign," he said. "This will be our campaign together because the only force strong enough to defeat the massive corruption is you, the American people."

The former President added, "Together, we will be taking on the most corrupt forces and entrenched interests imaginable.



Our country is in a horrible state. We're in grave trouble. This is not a task for a politician or a conventional candidate this is a task for a great movement that embodies the courage, confidence, and spirit of the American people."

He reminded voters how the country had improved under his leadership, and that they could afford their gasoline and groceries on the same paycheck, that their southern border was in check, and that they were safe from a nuclear Armageddon, "a concept unimaginable just two years ago."

"We will do whatever it takes to bring back honesty, confidence and trust in our elections, "Trump said. "To eliminate cheating, I will immediately demand voter ID, same day voting, and only paper ballots. We will dismantle the deep state and restore government by the people. To further drain the swamp, I will push for a constitutional amendment to propose term limits on members of Congress. It's time."

He also pledged to defend the family as "the center of American life," and parents' rights in public education, and added, "We will not let men participate in women's sports."

The 2022 midterm elections are now mostly in the books. It was disastrous for the Republicans. Finger pointing began at the close of the last polls in the country. It was the media, it was Senate Minority Leader Mitch McConnell and the Senate Campaign Fund, it was the infighting between

McConnell and Florida Senator Rick Scott, it was TRUMP!

Let me say this upfront. President Trump's policies were excellent. I felt then and feel now that if it wasn't for his ego

and twitter account he probably would have been re-elected and gone down as a great president. Inflation practically nonexistent, the border was closed, we were respected worldwide, and energy independence. But for his bellicose personality he would have been considered one of the best.

Today, the Department of Justice showed that Merrick Garland has completely politicized the Department and is using it to exact revenge on his opposition. No sooner than Donald Trump made his announcement and the Republican House said



Biden was on the top of the list for an investigation, did Garland announce yet another investigation into Trump.

Back to the elections. There was a flurry of endorsements made by Donald Trump. He had only one criterion to get his support. "Do you feel that the 2020 election was stolen?" If the candidates agreed, they received his blessings. Many of these candidates were the weakest in the field. But it was all about Trump. How did they fare?

Of 141 election deniers who ran for offices that oversee elections, only 14 won. None of those winners was in a state likely to tip the presidential election in 2024. As of press time, according to "Time Magazine," only five new election deniers have won races for statewide office.

"When it comes to the statewide positions that control our elections, Americans pretty decisively rejected the election deniers who wanted power of their votes," says Joanna Lydgate, CEO of States United Action. "Really very few of these folks have been successful."

Trump-backed candidates in key states needed in 2024 failed. They lost in states like Wisconsin, Pennsylvania, Nevada, Arizona and Kansas. According to some reports, a Trump adviser who has been in contact with Trump's inner circle said that the former president is "livid" and "screaming at everyone" after the results. "They were all bad candidates," the adviser said, critiquing many of Trump's handpicked contenders in key battleground states.

Trump's announcement was seen by many of his supporters as a great night and a new, more mellow man. But, as the old saying goes, "A tiger can't change its stripes." Trump can't change who he is. He has already derided one possible challenger for the primaries, calling him "Ron DeSanctimonious". He condemned The National Review stating, "let the National Review die peacefully!" Why? Because they didn't immediately endorse his candidacy. And this is only the beginning.

During his announcement, Trump said we must be united to win. Sounds right, unless you consider who said it. I listened to the words but heard "united behind me." He made statements later that reinforced this belief, commenting that

we Republicans can't be shooting at each other. Really, Mr. Trump? If you think I'm being a little too harsh, remember what he did to Ted Cruz, his wife and family? Then there was sleepy Jeb Bush, small feet Marco Rubio. Trump also lashed out at Republican Virginia governor Glenn Youngkin after the midterms in a bizarre statement that made reference to the governor's name sounding "Chinese." The list of epithets thrown at rivals is unlimited. At the same time, he spoke about the "big tent", and that we must stand united. Again, is that only if you, Mr. Trump, emerge as the Republican candidate in 2024?

How about this one: "We don't want to be critics. We don't want to be complainers. I never wanted to be a critic." And he said this with a straight face.

"Republicans are waking up to the fact that he is a net negative for their fortunes," Republican strategist Liam Donovan said of Trump. "I don't think this affects his thinking. He is immovable in that sense. The choice for Republicans is, are we really going to go down this road again?"

Here's a frightening thought: Trump loses the primary and runs as a third-party candidate throwing the election to the Democrat whoever that may be.

We have a very deep bench for candidates: Florida Governor Ron DeSantis, former Vice President **Mike Pence**, former Secretary of State **Mike Pompeo**, former U.N. Ambassador **Nicki Haley**, South Carolina Senator **Tim Scott**, and South Dakota Governor **Kristi Noem** to name a few.

I said at the beginning of this article that the elections were MOSTLY in the books. I live in a suburb of Atlanta. We have a Senate runoff vote December 8. The law here demands that candidates achieve 50% plus one to be declared the winner. Republican Herschel Walker and Democrat Senator Rafael Warnock are locked in a runoff race for Georgia's Seat.

Trump was cautioned not to make any presidential announcements before this runoff election. Regardless of this advice, he announced anyway, putting Walker between a rock and hard place. If Walker appears to support a Trump candidacy, he will lose those on the fence or who simply don't like him. Independents may stay home or vote for the Democrat. If asked, Walker is in a difficult situation where he has to choose between two equally unpleasant courses of action.

The Trump star is beginning to fade. It's time for the old establishment to step aside and begin the rebuilding of the Republican Party. So, let's close this chapter in our history and build on the future united.

FRWA IS "A CLUB OF ACTION" By Recording Secretary Carol Vyhonsky

Since its beginning in late 2018, the main project of Federated Republican Women in Action has been to bring attention and support to Republican candidates in



southern Brevard County, especially the city of Palm Bay. We chose to do that this year by having a Republican tent at 3 polling sites on Primary election day in August, as well as all 13 days of early voting in October and November, and on election day on November 8. Our members were there volunteering and answering questions of voters on the justices, amendments, and candidates. The Ron DeSantis team as well as Brevard Republican Executive Committee members also helped out at the tents.



At our November 11 meeting, there were two guest speakers: **Rick Lacey**, chairman of the Brevard Republican Executive Committee (BREC), and **Pete Filiberto**, Palm Bay City Councilman.

Lacey spoke about the "red wave" we had in Florida on November 8. He announced that the Republicans in Brevard County

actually beat the Democrats in the number of mail-in ballots for the first time ever. The numbers show that 70% of registered Republicans in the county voted in this election, as opposed to 56% of registered Democrats. He also announced that Brevard County was the 3rd best county in Florida in votes for Ron DeSantis, behind Lee County and (surprisingly) Miami-Dade County.

He also said there will be a Senate runoff election in Georgia in January, in which those of us in Brevard can do our part to make sure Republican **Herschel Walker** is successful in winning that election. A sign-up sheet was passed around for anyone willing to make phone calls to Georgia voters to get the vote out for Walker.

Lacey also mentioned his desire to work with our state-elected representatives to try to get legislation passed to eliminate non-partisan races and make every race partisan. He stated we also need to work harder to get the African American vote, and to get elected Republicans to do their part to get other local Republicans elected.

Our second guest speaker, Filiberto, spoke about his time so far serving on the Palm Bay City Council. He discussed issues such as a plan to build 1,400 houses near Heritage High School (on a road with only one way in and one way out), expressing his concerns about this and the lack of a fire and police station in this area.



Filiberto also addressed concerns from our members about the waste management company Republic not being able to pick up large piles of tree debris from Hurricane Ian in time for

Hurricane Nicole. And he spoke about the Major's Golf Course (currently closed) and noted that the City will have the golf course mowed because it is becoming overgrown and snakes and other undesirable wildlife are becoming a problem. He also mentioned that a Reverse Osmosis system will be placed at one of the water treatment facilities in Palm Bay to improve the city water.

At our December meeting, our members will be voting to elect new Board members for the 2023-24 term. We will also be voting on some proposed changes to our bylaws. Our organization has donated \$200 to www.volunteerflorida.org, the Casey DeSantis disaster fund for Hurricane Ian victims. The Board has also chosen Essential Pregnancy Center in Palm Bay as our holiday charity. Members are asked to bring baby gifts and/or personal gifts for the parents to our December meeting. Money donations will also be accepted on behalf of the center.

Two Military Tribute Banners that FRWA sponsored are now on display at Palm Bay City Hall. The banners honoring **Charlie Holstein** and **Joe Kaufhold** (associate members of FRWA) are on display on poles 11 and 12 on the north side of City Hall. FRWA also participated in the Palm Bay Veterans Day parade on November 5.

It has been estimated by Visit Florida – the not-for-profit corporation created by the Legislature in 1996 – that 35.1 million people visited the state between July and September this year, marking a 6.9 percent increase from the third quarter of 2021. Ahead of Thanksgiving, the Automobile Association of America ranked Orlando and Fort Lauderdale as 3rd and 10th respectively in the nation's top ten most popular destinations for holiday travel.

AN UPDATE FROM MY OFFICE By Florida District 8 State Senator Tom Wright

On November 8, I was re-elected to another four year term as the Florida State Senator for District 8. Following the redistricting process from this past Legislative Session, District 8 will cover the majority of Volusia County



and the northern part of Brevard County down to the NASA Causeway Bridge (primarily Mims, Titusville and Scottsmoor).

Immediately following the election, I have been busy working on solutions to address critical concerns from Hurricane Ian that were exacerbated by Hurricane Nicole. While Hurricane Nicole did significantly less damage across the state when compared to Hurricane Ian, there was significant damage experienced on the beachside of Volusia County. In total, 27 condominiums or hotels had to be evacuated and were at significant risk due to broken sea walls, beach erosion and water intrusion.

Thankfully by the immediate Friday after the storm, I was able to facilitate a meeting in Volusia County with Governor DeSantis, FDEM Director **Guthrie**, FDEP Secretary **Hamilton**, FDOT Secretary **Perdue** and local County and City officials to begin the planning process of restoration through local, state and federal resources.

Outside of my work to address recovery efforts from both hurricanes, I am also spending much of my time preparing for the upcoming Legislative Session. It is likely that in early December, the Legislature will meet for a Special Session to address concerns about the rising costs of property insurance and to explore property tax rebates for areas that saw major devastation from the hurricanes. This Special Session will be critical to address the need for residents of Florida to maintain access to affordable property insurance, especially after seeing firsthand how critical quality property insurance is to the residents of our state.

Following the likely Special Session, Interim Committee Weeks will run through January and February before the start of Regular Session on March 7, 2023. This Legislative Session I am looking forward to focusing on several key areas, in an effort to make meaningful changes that will better the lives of Floridians across the state.

One specific area that I am looking to alter is the DUI laws of our state. The passion for these changes come from the loss of a local 17-year-old high school student, earlier this year, who was murdered by the carelessness of a drunk driver who was operating a motor vehicle on a suspended license due to a prior DUI conviction. It is my goal to introduce a legislative change that will reduce the number of repeat offenders when it comes to DUI's.

As we approach the 2023 Session, I look forward to sharing some in depth reviews of the legislation I will be filing. AUDACITY AND IDIOCY

Here are the month's "winners":

--Retiring Chief Medical Adviser to the President "Grouchy Fauci," -whom Fox News co-host Dagen McDowell called "a contemptible,



power-hungry, bureau-hack," and Judge Jeanine Pirro called "the Lockdown Lover" – for making a final White House press briefing appearance the day before Thanksgiving to ramp up COVID fears and urge viewers to get updated vaccine booster shots. Left out of his remarks was any mention of the number of deaths occurring from the vaccine and boosters. "The Washington Post" reported that vaccinated people comprise 58 percent of COVID deaths. Also, during lawsuit question on November 23rd, Fauci confirmed that the communist Chinese government convinced him to press for America's unprecedented, crippling lockdowns.

--Kentucky Fried Chicken in Germany, for accidentally promoting a pre-World War II Nazi atrocity as a reason to celebrate with a "tender cheese with crispy chicken." Liberty Counsel is representing Hiller in his case against the school, and he said he is "in this to protect all students, no matter what. And all students need to be protected."

--The "Woke" Disney Company, for originally approving the performance of Florida's Venice High School Marching Band in a morning parade, but then changing its woke mind when the school refused to change the name of its band – the Indians – and cover-up its Native American logo. The school district announced it was proud of the high school band for not bowing down, and it stands behind the decision not to participate.

--Seth Dillon, the chief executive officer of "The Babylon Bee" has been disinvited from speaking at Palm Beach Atlantic University, his alma mater, because snowflakes enrolled in the school were upset



that he called Black Lives Matter a terrorist organization. "Since when do you have to support terrorist organizations that use violence and intimidation to advance their agenda to be welcome on a Christian campus," he said. "Cancel culture is a destructive disease, and Palm Beach Atlantic University is not immune to it. We need more backbone and less coddling in our Christian institutions. And we need it yesterday." Columnist Todd Starnes said it used to be a respected, conservative, Southern Baptist school, but "now it is CINO – Christian In Name Only." Noting that Dillon recently donated \$300,000 to help launch a new master's program at Palm Beach Atlantic, Starnes said he should ask the school to return his check.

--Police in New York City arrested a man with 20,000 deadly, colorful fentanyl pills. It would have been catastrophic if these "candies" had been distributed, but this is New York City of course, so within hours, the man was RELEASED FROM CUSTODY WITHOUT BAIL. What ever happened to Sinatra's classic song with the words "It's up to you, New York, New York"?

--Here's the latest from President Joe "He's a Legend in his Own Mind" Biden: He said he had a "starting" position on his college football team. But records indicate that while he briefly played football at Delaware, it was on the freshman team, not the varsity, he didn't letter, never had a "starting" job, and was forced to leave the team by his father because of his low grades.

BREVARD COUNTY SCHOOL BOARD. At the first meeting of the newly organized Brevard County School Board on November 22, Superintendent Mark Mullins was ousted by a 3-2 vote. Prior to the vote, however, Mullins volunteered to step down, agreeing to enter into separation negotiations with the board. Following the meeting, Mullins issued a statement that he was proud of his contributions to Brevard students and families over his nearly 30 years with the school district, and he admires and respects the thousands of Brevard Public Schools employees who go to work each day with the mission of serving our students with excellence as the standard. The Board also passed a requirement to segregate school rest rooms and locker rooms by biological sex.




REMEMBERING PAM LASALLE.

Addressing the Heritage Isle Republican Club on November 3, when he was still Brevard County School Board

Superintendent, Mark Mullins said the Board's mission is to

serve every student with excellence as the standard. "It is an amazing blessing to serve in Brevard and raise our children here," he said, adding that the board is proud of the "Thrive By Five" program, in which early learning is essential for lifelong development, and connects with families to support parents. The high school graduation rate, Mullins said, is one of the top in the state – in 2021, the



rate was 90.6 percent. He also talked about the dual enrollment program that Brevard High Schools have with Eastern State Florida College, which also provides students with AA degrees. Mullins pointed out that the district has 4,000 teachers, 275 bus drivers and 845 instructional assistants. Noting that Florida Governor Ron DeSantis earlier called for a salary increase for teachers that was approved by voters, he stressed that another ad valorem millage to increase



teacher pay was on the current 2022 midterm ballot as a county referendum, and he urged members to support that measure....The second speaker on the Heritage Isle program, State Representative **Randy Fine**, took the opposite position, saying he was opposed to it because it would be "temporary money for permanent

expenses." (NOTE: Brevard voters did approve the measure by a 58-42 percent margin.) Discussing his career, Fine said he retired from several businesses on his 40th birthday and chose to run for public office because – he said with a smile – his wife did not want him hanging around the house. He just won his fourth and final term in the Florida House for the District 33 seat and said to stay tuned for future decisions. Two other reasons why he wanted to serve in Tallahassee, he said, were his unhappiness with the common core math that his sons faced in public school – they are now in private school – and he did not like the world they are growing up in. Fine said he is opposed to the issue of critical race theory in the schools, and "we make sure parents are in charge and there is school choice." He said the money should follow the child, and if the parents want to move one from public school to either private or a charter school, there should be a voucher to do so. Regarding the fact that school board candidates on ballots are listed as "non-partisan," Fine said he favored legislation including the listing of party affiliation.
