"Firebrand" Congressman Matt Gaetz – that's the title of his new book and the way he acts in Congress – told the attendees at the Brevard County, Florida, Lincoln-Reagan Dinner on October 13 that "this country is worth fighting for," and the goal of the Democrats is "to create a period of uncertainty."

They want to "defame, destroy and delegitimize" us, he said, and "we need to get out and ensure that they don't steal the election."



Just shy of 500 enthusiastic Conservative Republicans were in attendance, making it the largest crowd ever for a Lincoln-Reagan Dinner in Brevard, and many of them had their picture taken with him, as a smiling Gaetz stood patiently by. And when he spoke, they hung on to Gaetz' every word.

"We want clean air and water," he said, "but we did not sign up for this New Green Deal nonsense." And he said it is regrettable that the liberal Democrats in the House of Representatives, for selfish political reasons, have voted down any attempt to build the border wall — which President Trump has said is being built anyway.

A strong supporter of Trump, Gaetz has gone on television and Conservative talk radio to defend the President's programs, pointing out that the President has revitalized the economy and the military. A major difference with the previous administration, he said, is that former President Obama went everywhere apologizing for the United States, while Trump proudly endorses America First.

"Florida will put Trump in the win column," Gaetz stressed to the dinner attendees. "Let's go get 'em."



Realizing that because of this support, he has become a target by the Democrats, Gaetz said that for his re-election campaign, he still will not accept money from any political action committee. Representing Florida District 1 in the Panhandle, he won in 2018 by a 2-1 margin over a Democrat opponent.

Gaetz also said he was proud to announce that his adoptive son – 19-year-old Nestor Galban, who came to America from Cuba at age 12 after his mother died of cancer – has just become an American citizen.

Introducing Gaetz at the dinner, his colleague – Florida 8th District Congressman Bill Posey – referred to him as "President Trump's best friend in Congress."

Brevard Republican Executive Committee Chairman Rick Lacey, who put the dinner program together, announced the winners of several awards, handing out commemorative plaques.

The Republican Business of the Year Award went to **Richard Reynolds** of Suntree Florists and Gifts.

The Republican of the Year Award went to **Ruth Waters**, a perennial figure at the BREC headquarters.

The Brevard Legislator of the Year Award went to **District 51 State Representative Tyler Sirois.**

The Brevard Republican Award for Voter Registration went to Precinct Committeewoman **Joyce Loyd.**

The Chairman's Award for Trump Volunteer of the Year went to **Public Defender Blaise Trettis**.

AMY CONEY BARRETT SWORN IN AS SUPREME COURT ASSOCIATE JUSTICE



With her hand on the family Bible held by her husband, Jesse, U.S. Appeals Court Judge Amy Coney Barrett took the oath of office from Supreme Court Justice Clarence Thomas in a White House Rose Garden ceremony on October 26, becoming the newest justice on the high court.

President Trump opened the ceremony saying, "Her impeccable credentials were unquestioned, unchallenged, and obvious to all" during her confirmation hearings.

Barrett, who clerked for the late **Justice Antonin Scalia**, made clear during her confirmation hearings that she would not impose her own ideological preferences on her legal work, and said following the brief ceremony that "It is the job of a judge to resist her policy preferences. This separation of duty from political preference is what makes the judiciary distinct among the three branches of government."

Just hours before the swearing-in ceremony, the U.S. Senate voted 52-48 to confirm her. **Maine Senator Susan Collins** — who is facing a strong re-election battle — had announced earlier that she would not vote with her Republican colleagues because she felt it was not proper to confirm anyone so close to the election.

Every Democrat in the Senate voted no, with a number of them rudely flashing a "thumbs down" and immediately leaving the Senate floor.

When he first announced Barrett as his choice to replace the late Associate Justice Ruth Bader Ginsburg, Trump said in an earlier Rose Garden ceremony on September 26 that Barrett is a woman of "towering intellect" and "unyielding loyalty to the Constitution" who would rule "based solely on the fair reading of the law."

Barrett then responded that if confirmed, she pledged to discharge her responsibilities "to the very best of my ability," and that she was "truly humbled by the prospect of serving on the Supreme Court."

Judicial Watch President Tom Fitton said following the announcement that Barrett's nomination "is another great victory for constitutional government and a blow to politicized decision-making on the Supreme Court. Most Americans agree with Judge Barrett that the Supreme Court should apply the law as it is written and leave the legislating to the people's elected representatives."

At the beginning of her October 12-15 confirmation hearing before the Senate Judiciary Committee, Barrett noted that as a clerk for Scalia, she was shaped by his reasoning and his judicial philosophy that "A judge must apply the law as written, not as the judge wishes it were."

She said that when she writes an opinion involving a case, "I read every word from the perspective of the losing party. I ask myself how would I view the decision if one of my children was the party I was ruling against: Even though I would not like the result, would I understand that the decision was fairly reasoned and grounded in the law? That is the standard I set for myself in every case, and it is the standard I will follow as long as I am a judge on any court."

She said it would be "the honor of a lifetime to serve alongside the Chief Justice and seven associate justices. I admire them all and would consider each a valued colleague."

During several days of questioning, while Republican members of the committee expressed support for her, the Democrats stuck to their insistence that the vacancy created by Ginsburg's death should not be filled before the election. They asked how she would rule on specific issues, which she said she could not answer, but she did skillfully describe her judicial philosophy. One Democrat Senator even had the audacity to ask her if she were a sexual predator.

On October 22, the 12 members of the Senate Judiciary Committee voted to advance Barrett's Supreme Court nomination to the full Senate. No Democrat Senator voted, protesting the nomination because two years ago, the committee failed to act on the nomination of Judge Merrick Garland for a different vacancy.

TRUMP DEBATE, TOWN HALL, RADIO INTERVIEW, RALLIES

President Trump has had a very busy October after participating in a September debate with Democrat presidential candidate Joe Biden, coming down with the coronavirus, quickly recovering, conducting a two-hour radio interview with **Rush Limbaugh**, debating NBC "journalist" Savannah Guthrie at a town hall event, and facing enthusiastic crowds at rallies throughout the United States.

The September debate, arranged by the Presidential Commission on Debates, was in reality a trap for the President, since even though it was on Fox News, the debate moderator was Fox's Chris "I Wish I Were My Father"



Wallace, who debated Trump himself while shielding Biden from having to answer any tough questions.

Topics covered included mail-in voting, for which Trump warned of fraud and Biden suggested is not a concern; health care, in which Trump asserted Biden would back socialized medicine, and the former Vice President said it was the Democrat Party platform that he favored; and court packing, which Trump said his opponent would do, but Biden declined to answer. Trump threw other questions at Biden, who did not answer them, and the debate disintegrated into a shouting match.

Trump soon tested positive for the coronavirus and spent several days at Walter Reed Military Hospital, where he quickly responded to treatment and was released.

A planned second debate was cancelled after the president

refused to participate in a virtual one instead of in person. Instead, the two candidates held competing town halls at the same time – Trump in Philadelphia on NBC, and Biden in Miami on ABC. Alleged "undecided" voters and moderator George Stephanopoulos fed Biden softball questions in his town hall, while in Philadelphia, moderator Savannah Guthrie was repeatedly combative and argumentative toward the President between every question he answered from a voter.

Trump did fight back each time, and after the event, Guthrie was blasted for her biased and hostile behavior. Fox News

host **Greg Gutfeld** called it "a horrible show trial;" political commentator **Dan Bongino** called her "the worst moderator I have ever seen;" and **Logan Hall** of the Daily Caller said, "Congrats to Savannah Guthrie on her new job working for the Biden campaign."



During the third and final debate on October 22 – moderated by NBC television journalist Kristen Welker – the President was less confrontational than during their first meeting, but when Biden made the unfounded charge that former **New York City Mayor Rudy Giuliani**, a Trump supporter, was being used as an "agent" of Russia to spread disinformation, Trump saw his opportunity to speak.



He seemed relaxed and appeared more polished and prepared this time around, but got in plenty of attacks against Biden over his long record in Washington, and he confronted the former Vice President about the millions of dollars his son Hunter Biden was getting from Russia, China, Ukraine and other nations. And what about the money that was being held for "the big guy," which a former partner of his son has identified as Joe Biden?

"I have not taken a penny from any foreign source in my life. I have not taken a single penny from any country whatsoever ever," Joe Biden then said.

But Trump described the Biden family as a "vacuum cleaner," sucking up money from nefarious overseas business deals, which Biden denied.

Trump's campaign has pointed out the evidence that Hunter Biden's firm got \$3.5 million from Russian billionaire Elena Baturina, the wife of the former mayor of Moscow; that Hunter Biden also opened a joint bank account with a Chinese national linked to the communist government; and while "Joe

Biden advocated for legislation favored by big banks that made it harder for struggling Americans to declare bankruptcy, Biden's son Hunter was 'earning' hundreds of thousands of dollars in 'consultant fees' from one of those banks, MBNA."

"The American Spectator" called the October 22 event "Donald Trump's best presidential debate ever," noting that the President mentioned that Biden failed on H1N1, a much less devastating illness. He got in that, on the issue of taxes, he may have paid \$750 in the last phase of tax filing because he previously had paid tens of millions of dollars in advance tax payments. And Trump repeated three times that in any health insurance program that emerges, he will guarantee covering pre-existing conditions.

In a two-hour, commercial-free visit with Limbaugh on his radio show October 9 – on what was billed as "the largest virtual radio rally in history" – Trump said he is fully recovered from the coronavirus and is not taking any further medications, said he would like to see a coronavirus stimulation package bigger than even the Democrats' \$2.4 trillion plan, warned of "severe consequences" for Iran and any other nation that opposes the United States, called Black Lives Matter a "racist" and "Marxist" group, and criticized the media that has attacked him throughout his White House tenure.

Staging a vigorous return to the campaign trail on October 12, the President spoke about his coronavirus immunity as he held his first rally since his diagnosis, in Sanford, Florida. Here, as well as at subsequent rallies around the country – where he spoke at airports alongside a parked Air Force One – Trump was greeted by huge, enthusiastic crowds of sign-waving supporters who shouted, "Four More Years" and "We Love You."

The daily whirlwind of stops included rallies in Johnstown, Pennsylvania; Des Moines, Iowa; Greenville, North Carolina; Ocala, Florida; Macon, Georgia; Muskegon, Michigan; Janesville, Wisconsin; The Villages and Pensacola, Florida; Lumberton, North Carolina; Circleville, Ohio; Waukesha, Wisconsin; Londonderry, New Hampshire; Allentown, Lititz, and Martinsburg, Pennsylvania; Lansing, Michigan; Omaha, Nebraska; and Bullhead City and Phoenix, Arizona; and other cities.





On October 24, Florida's First President voted in person in Palm Beach County, Florida, for the first time as a Sunshine State resident. Asked by a reporter whom he voted for, he responded with a smile: "A man named Trump."

The "winners" for October are:

--Former Obama White House staffer and Hillary Clinton spokeswoman Zara Rahim, for



disgustingly tweeting after learning President Trump tested positive for the coronavirus that she hopes he dies.

- --Unhinged political commentator Keith Olbermann, for ranting that "the terrorist Trump must be defeated, must be destroyed, must be devoured at the ballot box and then he and his enablers and his supporters and his collaborators...must be prosecuted and convicted and removed from our society while we try to rebuild it and to rebuild the world Trump has nearly destroyed by turning it over to a virus."
- --"Washington Post" columnist Jennifer Rubin, for calling for the "defunding" of the Walter Reed National Military Medical Center after President Trump announced he would return to the White House following treatment for the coronavirus, and for calling the President a "menace to everyone around you," and blasting the doctors in charge of his recovery.
- --CNN analyst and Harvard professor Juliette Kayyem, for tweeting that she believes – without offering any evidence – that Russian intelligence agencies were spying on President Trump while he was being treated for the coronavirus at Walter Reed National Military Medical Center.
- --Leftwing University of California-Berkeley Public Policy professor and former Secretary of Labor Robert Reich, for proposing if the Democrats win the election the radical idea of establishing a Truth and Reconciliation Commission to censor speech and shame every public figure who supported President Trump. The massive censorship and blacklist campaign sounds like characteristics of dictatorial transitions of power that occur in third-world countries.
- --The Kappa Delta sorority, for deleting and apologizing for a congratulatory message posted earlier for Judge, now Justice Amy Coney Barrett, who was a member of the sorority during her time at Tennessee's Rhodes College. The sorority said it recognizes her "significant accomplishments," but acknowledges that "our members have a variety of views and a right to their own beliefs." Snowflake sisters unite.
- --Michigan Secretary of State Jocelyn Benson, for erroneously posting on a state data base an incorrect ballot for clerks to download and send to military and civilian Michigan residents overseas. The ballot which was corrected after hundreds of copies were made listed the Libertarian Party Vice Presidential candidate as being on the Republican ticket with President Trump, and Vice President Pence was left off the ballot. Voters were told to ignore that ballot in favor of a correct one. And the Dems would have us believe there would be "no problem" with massive mail-in ballots nationwide.
- --The "snowflake" Minneapolis City Council which unanimously passed a measure to disband the Police

Department and replace it with a "Department of Community Safety and Violence Prevention" – for then complaining about the city's insufficient policing while residents were witnessing an increase in homicides, assaults, car jackings, and other violent crimes. One of the victims of a fatal shooting was a 17-year-old volunteer on the campaign of the Republican candidate challenging Congresswoman Ilhan Omar.

- --Google executives, for using an internal company briefing to argue that due to a "variety of factors, including the election of President Trump," they no longer consider the American tradition of free speech to be "viable" on the Internet. The briefing associates Google's new role as the guarantor of "civility" with the categories of "editor" and "publisher." This is significant, given that Google, YouTube, and other tech giants publicly claim they are not publishers but rather "neutral platforms."
- --Anthea Butler, a religion and African studies professor at the University of Pennsylvania, for teaching her students that members of the Republican Party are both "craven" and "evil," while voicing approval of the Biden-Harris Democrat presidential ticket. What Bible is this radical leftist preaching from?
- --The Columbia University Marching Band, a school spirit group for more than a century, for voting "unanimously and enthusiastically" to disband due to "racism, cultural oppression, misogyny, and sexual harassment" over the years. The snowflakes said they would "take responsibility both for harm directly caused by present band members and for injuries which occurred at other times in the band's history."
- --Dean Ledford, principal of Fletcher High School in Neptune Beach, Florida, for stopping student Caelen Lavender, an offensive lineman on the team, from bringing the "Thin Blue Line" flag onto the football field an act he had been carrying out since the 2019 season to honor the memory of his father, fallen police officer Corporal Andy Lavender. Ledford said the flag "has different meaning for different people, and rather than representing the young man's personal feelings, it was being interpreted as a political statement of the team and of the school." The Jacksonville Fraternal Order of Police condemned the decision, urging game attendees to show up with a "Thin Blue Line" flag.
- --Vanderbilt University, for penalizing students who defended the U.S. Constitution in an incendiary "true or false" exam question: "Was the Constitution designed to perpetuate white supremacy and protect the institution of slavery?" Those who answered "no" were marked as incorrect.
- --Singer Lady Gaga, for making the baffling claim in a magazine interview that people who are born in the United States herself included "all drink the poison that is white supremacy," and said she is "in the process of learning and unlearning things I've been taught my whole life." Gaga added that she supports the social justice activism taking place around the country and hopes that it will continue to grow.

- --Marshall University Biology Professor Jennifer Mosher, for commenting during a virtual class session that she wished Trump supporters would catch the coronavirus and die before the election. After a video clip of her rant went viral, pending an investigation, the school removed her from the classroom and placed her on administrative leave.
- --Democrat Colorado Secretary of State Jena Griswold, for sending postcards to deceased residents and to non-citizens encouraging them to register to vote so they can cast ballots in November.
- --Black Lives Matter activist Tyree Conyers-Page, for setting up a GoFundMe account to solicit donations to be used in the fight for George Floyd, but was arrested by the FBI and is facing federal charges of money laundering and wire fraud after he allegedly used more than \$200,000 to buy tailored clothing, a home and land lot, a home security system, and items from Walmart and Home Depot for personal use.
- --The deputy membership director for college Democrats at the University of North Texas, who identifies as Bella (she/hers), for encouraging students at the school to vandalize the 1,000 displays on campus that pro-life students from the Young Conservatives of Texas put out to memorialize the unborn. The displays were destroyed, and the University was said to be investigating the incident.
- --University of Massachusetts-Boston Associate Professor of Psychology Ester Shapiro, speaking to a Zoom class on Introduction to Human Rights, for calling the President a "Nazi," comparing him to Adolph Hitler, and stating that white supremacy is "baked" into the U.S. Constitution, and that "Republican militias with armbands" are trying to suppress voters.
- --The University of Wisconsin-Madison student government, for voting to approve a resolution supporting removal of the school's famous 111-year-old Abraham Lincoln statue, arguing it serves as a remnant "of this school's history of white supremacy."
- --Midwestern State University in Texas ethics professor Nathan Jun, for posting on Facebook that, "I want the entire world to burn until the last cop is strangled with the intestines of the last capitalist, who is strangled in turn with the intestines of the last politician." Ethics????
- --Yale University history professor David Blight, for calling for civil disobedience in order to fight President Trump's Supreme Court appointment and saying that the late Justice Ruth Bader Ginsburg "deserves no less."
- --Snowflake students at the University of Wisconsin-La Crosse, for telling the school's student newspaper that they felt "fear" because of their "marginalized identities" after the College Republicans chalked "Trump 2020" on sidewalks around campus.
- --Seattle Mayor Jenny Durkan, for praising the police-free autonomous zone in her city this past summer, calling it a

"block party" amid a "summer of love," and for supporting the cuts in the police force demanded by "peaceful protesters," but who now is "deeply concerned" as at least 118 officers have left the force, and more were considering to join the exodus.

THIS AND THAT



LARA TRUMP. Speaking to several hundred enthusiastic Trump supporters in Cocoa, Florida, on October 27 – the Editor and his wife included – the President's daughter-in-law, **Lara Trump**, stressed that "he has delivered for the American people – promises made, promises kept." Noting that every election is called the most important one ever, she said that this one is the "most

consequential" for our country, because the Democrats would make drastic changes. Quoting the President, she said, "America will never be a socialist country." Lara Trump — who has been traveling the country campaigning for her father-in-law — urged the audience to vote (many already had) and convince family members and friends to do so as well. She said that on one campaign trip she made with Trump supporters **Diamond and Silk**, they came up with the slogan to "vote RED — Remove Every Democrat." After her remarks, Lara spent time visiting with attendees and signing autographs."

VICE PRESIDENTIAL DEBATE. When Vice President Mike Pence and California Democrat Senator Kamala Harris



participated in the election campaign's only vice presidential debate in Salt Lake City, Utah, on October 7, the main topics for discussion were the coronavirus pandemic and the economy. Harris was critical of President Trump's actions on both, but Pence, pointing to his early decision to restrict travel from China, said this was evidence that he took the virus threat seriously. The Vice President also touted the record-setting progress on developing a vaccine and said millions of doses would be available by the end of the year. He also noted that the Biden-Harris team's plans to address the coronavirus with testing and developing a vaccine, "mirrored actions the administration has already taken." Pence was calm and disciplined during the 90-minute debate, and he painted the

Democrat ticket as "captive to the extreme left of the party." He linked that ticket with the Green New Deal, which Harris has endorsed. Pence also asserted that Joe Biden's vow to roll back Trump's 2017 tax cuts if elected, would translate into tax increases on Americans.

HUMAN TRUMP CHAIN. More than 1,000 Florida supporters of **President Trump** participated in a "Human Trump Chain" in Brevard County on September 27, stretching along Wickham Road from the Pineda Causeway exit to the Murrell Road entrance to the Brevard Zoo. The supporters – many of them decked out in red Trump tee shirts and hats – waved Trump signs and flags, listened to returning car horn blasts, and cheered the numerous "thumbs up" signs from occupants inside the cars. Traffic was heavy and constant throughout the scheduled afternoon hour demonstration. "Brevard County is Trump country," said Rick Lacey, chairman of the Brevard Republican Executive Committee and one of the organizers of the event. He said he's seen plenty of enthusiastic support for the President and for the Republican Party generally. "We're out here supporting the President, making sure that he knows that we love him down here and we're going to support him," Lacey added. The "Human Trump Chain" was rescheduled after being rained out the previous Sunday.



TRUMP SUPPORT. Two newspapers – the "New York Post" and the "Washington Examiner" – in separate op-eds on October 26, endorsed **President Trump** for re-election. The Post praised the President's purported economic success before the coronavirus reached U.S. shores in late January, and advocated against "cancel culture and censorship" in a front-page cover story. The Examiner said President Trump's "policy successes outweighs" his "failures" and praised his Middle East dealings.

1776 COMMISSION. President Trump on September 17 announced the establishment of a 1776 Commission with the goal of introducing more patriotic curriculum in schools to counter the growing radicalization of the Democrat-controlled teachers unions' lesson plans. The President said the Commission will "encourage our educators to teach our children about the miracle of American history and make



plans to honor the 250th Anniversary of our founding." The impetus for the 1776 Commission is to counter the New York Times' 1619 Project, which is aimed at teaching "critical race" theory to school-aged children, beginning with the arrival of the first slave. Conservative critics believe this is a distorted view of American history. Previously, "critical race" theory was popular only at universities. "Students in our universities are inundated with critical race theory. This is a Marxist doctrine holding that America is a wicked and racist nation, that even young children are complicit in oppression, and that our entire society must be radically transformed," Trump said. "Critical race theory is being forced into our children's schools, it's being imposed into workplace trainings, and it's being deployed to rip apart friends, neighbors and families." And the Heritage Foundation pointed out that a group of leading historians objected to the project's false information, and the Times wrote back that "historical understanding is not fixed." In other words, Heritage said, the newspaper doesn't care what historians with decades of experience think if it counters the religious narrative that critical race theory demands.

FAULTY BALLOTS. The Los Angeles County Registrar-Recorder/County Clerk's office confirmed on October 5 that more than 2,000 voters in Los Angeles County received "faulty" ballots which lacked a section to vote for the President of the United States. The massive error follows the executive order that California's Democrat Governor Gavin Newsom issued in May, requiring the state to send all registered voters' absentee ballots ahead of the November 3 election. He used the Chinese coronavirus as the primary reason to send ballots to roughly 21 million people in the Golden State. Michael Sanchez, a spokesman for the Los Angeles County Clerk's office, apologized for the "mistake" regarding the botched ballots but said that it "impacted a very small number of Los Angeles County voters." He added, "We are now in the process of alerting all affected voters in this precinct of the error by robocall and email, and tomorrow morning we will be mailing out new, corrected ballots with a letter describing the error." Meanwhile, in New York, hundreds of voters in Nassau County recently received ballots with the wrong oath envelope, attributed to a "printing error." And, the United States Postal Inspection Service is investigating after mail was stolen out of multiple collection boxes in the state. Meanwhile, swing state Pennsylvania, which President Trump narrowly won in the 2016 election, has thrown out 372,000 requests for mail-in ballots, a new report says. According to the "Philadelphia Inquirer," 90 percent of those were duplicate requests for ballots that the state denied "primarily because people who had requested mail-in ballots for the state's June 2 primary did not realize that they had checked a box to be sent ballots for the general election, too." The newspaper said one voter appeared to submit 11 duplicate requests. So, what did the President say about vote-by-mail fraud that is separate from those who did request a mail-in ballot?

HERE IS WHAT WE ARE UP AGAINST. Coming out of his basement hideout, Democrat presidential candidate Joe Biden seemingly tried to use President Trump's tactics against him, saying the real fear that Americans feel comes from the destabilization that has happened because of Trump's handling of the coronavirus pandemic, his plans to undermine Social Security programs and his relationship with leaders like Russian President Vladimir Putin. Biden said the incumbent President "makes things worse, not better," and he would be able to unite the country and foster healing, and would abandon the divisive language Trump uses and get both police and those fighting for racial justice to the table to bring about lasting change. "Never before has an American president played such a subservient role to a Russian leader. It's not only dangerous – it's humiliating and embarrassing for the rest of the world to see. It weakens us," Biden claimed....And, Democrat Vice Presidential candidate Kamala Harris said, "Nothing that we have achieved that has been about progress, in particular around civil rights, has come without a fight, and so I always am going to interpret these protests as an essential component of evolution in our country - as an essential component or mark of a real democracy." Speaking at the NAACP's national convention, she added that protests were "necessary" as "the people's voices must be heard, and it is often the people who must speak to get their government to do what it is supposed to do, but may not do naturally unless the people speak loudly – and obviously peacefully." Harris also praised the "brilliance" and "impact" of "Black Lives Matter," which has received media praise but also come under fire for promoting left-wing stances like opposing the nuclear family. "I actually believe that 'Black Lives Matter' has been the most significant agent for change within the criminal justice system," she said.

BE PREPARED. According to "The Atlantic" magazine, if President Trump wins re-election, all hell could break loose as Democrats made a threat of Civil War. The magazine said liberal activists told Democrat Party propagandist Ronald Brownstein that if there were recounts after the election, Democrat voters would take to the streets and rampage through cities in riots the like of which the nation has never seen. And Adam Green, a co-founder of the Progressive Change Campaign Committee, said that if the President tries to stop the counting of mail-in ballots after Election Day, or otherwise tries to short-circuit the results, the scale of protests would be that of Black Lives Matter protests on steroids.



JUDICIAL WATCH. On October 2, the White House announced the appointment of Judicial Watch President Tom Fitton to the District of Columbia Commission on Judicial Disabilities and Tenure, which will give him the authority to unseat DC judges for mental or physical incapacitation, corruption or misconduct. Responding to the

announcement Fitton thanked President Trump for the appointment, and said he is "honored and humbled" by his confidence, and he "looks forward to working with my fellow commissioners to 'maintain public confidence in an independent, impartial, fair, and qualified judiciary, and to enforce the high standards of conduct judges must adhere to both on and off the bench." Our nation's capital, Fitton added, "should endeavor to have the best court system in the country." The District of Columbia Commission on Judicial Disabilities and Tenure is an independent agency established by Congress to review complaints of misconduct against judges of the District of Columbia Courts. The commission's authority includes reappointment evaluations (sent to the president) of associate judges and performance and fitness reviews of senior judges.

FAKE NEWS CNN. The network's been at war with Donald Trump for four years, and from the moment he announced he tested positive for coronavirus, the Fake News Media has been rooting for him to die. But now CNN will have to apologize to the President after what Dr. Robert Watcher said on TV about him dying. CNN host Brianna Keilar invited Watcher on her program to fantasize about Trump dying, and he said that while the President is doing well, there was still a greater than ten percent chance he could still die due to risk factors, "so it's nothing to be taken lightly." That was what Keilar and her audience wanted to hear, and she responded, "Oh, okay, I mean that's a considerable number, right?" This is a first. 
at a salon also closed due to the coronavirus pandemic. Rules, rules, rules, for whom do they apply?

PALM BAY CORRUPTION SCANDAL. Former Palm Bay, Florida, Deputy City Manager Dave Isnardi pleaded guilty to the single felony charge of criminal conspiracy (extortion) on October 2, related to his role in an ongoing corruption scandal in the city. Visiting Indian River County Judge Michael Linn sentenced him to five years of probation. As part of a plea deal, four other felony charges were dropped. Isnardi had been arrested in May 2019 on charges of racketeering, conspiracy to commit extortion and conspiracy to possess controlled substances, including oxycodone, and faced up to 75 years in prison plus \$35,000 in fines. Isnardi agreed, as part of the plea deal, to cooperate with prosecutors, complete 60 days of service at the sheriff's work farm and pay court and investigative costs related to the case. If he fails to meet all of the requirements, the judge can adjudicate Isnardi guilty, and sentence him to serve up to five years in prison and fine him \$5,000.

DAMAGED BOOKS. Conservative commentator and

author Candace Owens, whose new book "Blackout: How Black America Can Make Its Second Escape from the Democrat Plantation" is being distributed by Amazon, said about 1,000 fans have informed her that their copy of the book, was damaged



upon arrival. She informed Amazon that the readers let me know that its employees "appear to be stomping on and in this case, smearing Vaseline, on my books before mailing them." She added, "I know it must have pained you to ship out all 90,000 copies you had in stock – but this is unacceptable." She provided photos of the damaged books and retweeted others showcasing similar damage to their copy. In a follow-up, Owens wrote to Amazon: "The pettiness will do nothing to thwart sales. Let's try to get the next 100,000 that I plan to sell out of your warehouse, treated with a bit more respect by the looney lefties packing the product, please."

CATO INSTITUTE. Using statistical data to grade America's governors, the Cato Institute on October 5 issued its 15th biennial Fiscal Report Card, which examines state budget actions since 2018, and grades the governors on their tax and spending records. Governors who have restrained taxes and spending receive higher grades, while those who have substantially increased taxes and spending receive lower

grades. This year, four governors were awarded an A on the report: **Chris Sununu** of New Hampshire, **Kim Reynolds** of Iowa, **Pete Ricketts** of Nebraska, **and Mark Gordon** of Wyoming. Seven governors were awarded an F: Ralph Northam of Virginia, Andrew Cuomo of New York, Gretchen Whitmer of Michigan, Phil Murphy of New Jersey, J. B. Pritzker of Illinois, Kate Brown of Oregon, and Jay Inslee of Washington. Grades for the other 39 state governors ranged from B (including Florida's **Ron DeSantis**) to Incomplete.



PHARMACY AWARD. Florida 14th District State Senate Tom Wright accepted the Senate Champion of the Year award from Small business Pharmacies Aligned for Reform (SPAR) on September 30, and said he is "very passionate about this issue, because the patient gets left out of the conversation far too often, and we need to ensure that their medicine is affordable,

and their local pharmacy is accessible." SPAR is dedicated to lowering the cost of prescription drug prices and protecting Florida pharmacy owners from bad actors within the prescription drug supply chain. Wright said he wanted to thank his legislative colleagues for helping tackle "this issue of growing importance." In the last legislative session, he filed Senate Bill 1338: Prescription Drug Coverage in an effort to even the playing field among some of the drug supply chain's most influential parties. The bill also aimed to alleviate burdens on Florida's independent pharmacy owners that have been adversely affected by pharmacy benefit managers, positioned in the top echelons of Florida's drug supply chain. "Independent pharmacists in Florida have been taken advantage of by bad actors for years and can no longer absorb the losses they continue to incur," Wright said. "Many of our independent pharmacists have found themselves in a grim position not just due to the recent struggles brought on by COVID-19, but because they are forced to negotiate with minimally regulated entities, while lacking any kind of protection to be able to operate their business without the fear of losing everything."

Wright also issued a proclamation for **Sergeant Liborio Perez-Gorritz Day** in honor of his 100th birthday. The Ormand Beach resident – who was born on October 18, 1920 in Comerio, Puerto Rico – joined the U.S. Army in 1941 and served during World War Two and the

Korean and Vietnam wars, retiring in 1970 as a Staff Sergeant. His wife, Carmen, passed away in 2007, and he is the proud father of 5 sons, 19 grandchildren and 11 great-grandchildren.

TRANSITION INTEGRITY PROJECT. Beware of the Transition Integrity Project's ostensibly bi-partisan report "Preventing a Disrupted Presidential Election." The figure at the top of the TIP is Democrat Party senior strategist John Podesta, and his team is a collection of professional Democrat operatives and Republican 'Never Trumpers,' including former RNC Chairman Michael Steele; commentator and speechwriter David Frum; and editor and founder of the nowdefunct "Weekly Standard" Bill Kristol. 

Both are right. One of Biden's tactics was to look into the camera and address 'the American people.' Trump mostly looked at Biden, or at moderator Chris Wallace, who at times appeared like a frustrated referee in one of those wrestling matches when opponents refuse to stop punching each other. Lost in it all was a clearer distinction between the policies of the two men. Seeking to defend himself against Trump's claim that Senator Bernie Sanders and the 'far-left' wing of the party is in control, Biden claimed he is the Democrat Party. In light of his rush to embrace the left's agenda, that seems to lack credibility. In the end, these debates should focus on their ideologies. Reasonable Americans are open to discussing reforms like banning chokeholds, demilitarizing the police, and ending qualified immunity. 
