Florida 8th District Congressman Bill Posey made the rounds of visits to Republican and other organizations in Brevard County in recent weeks, prior to returning to Washington at the end of the Congressional summer recess.

With his wife, **Katie**, and several staff members in tow, Posey attended the grand opening of the Friends of Trump Support Center in Melbourne on August 24; and a luncheon reception in Cocoa Beach and a Republican Club of Brevard meeting at Patrick Air Force Base, both on August 28.

He also held his 8th annual Federal Contracting Conference on August 14 at the Solar Energy Center in Cocoa, providing more than 170 attendees a chance to explore contracting opportunities with procurement representatives from

Washington and with local defense contractors. On August 29, he spoke to the Space Coast Chapter of ACT! For America in Viera, and both Poseys greeted visitors to the Muscle Car Museum in Melbourne on September 7.



At Republican Club of Brevard Meeting

Enthusiastic audiences applauded the Congressman at each venue, especially when he pointed out that under the Trump administration, the economy is doing great, and we have the lowest unemployment rate in 30 years. There are more jobs available than people looking for work, he said. The "unfriendly media," Posey added, is trying to talk us into a recession.



At ACT! For America Meeting

Discussing the space program, which is near and dear to his heart, Posey said that **President Trump** has authorized funding for NASA for the first time in seven years, and he noted that Space Florida is being provided a \$70 million grant from the Department of Transportation. He added that **Barry Plans**, co-chair of the Ronald Reagan Club in Brevard who now works for DOT in Washington, was instrumental in obtaining the grant. "We have to keep America first in space," Posey added.

He also said the President re-established the National Space Council, which sets policy for our space program, and that **Vice President Pence** is chairman of the council. Trump has directed NASA to go back to the Moon as a stepping stone to Mars, he said, adding that "We need to persevere in space for our national defense."

Posey lauded Trump's efforts to place federal judges on the bench -123 of them to date - "to interpret law, not make law." Regarding the open borders policy being pushed by the Democrats, Posey said he gives "100 percent support" to the effort against it, because "we do not want it." The problems at the border, of course, he said, are the cartels bringing over drugs, arms, and human trafficking.

Noting the "impeachment fever on the other side," Posey said, "You would have to be a fool not to believe there is a Deep State in Washington."

As a strong, proud member of the Freedom Caucus – which consists of nearly 40 members – he said the group "tries to hold leadership responsible," but at times it is like "trying to compete in a wind tunnel."

While Democrats say the reason why they won the majority in the House in the 2018 election was because voters do not like the way Trump is officiating, Posey said that is not the case, and the 40 Republican seats lost was because Congress – including the leadership – did not pass legislation that was promised.

But the Congressman said there still has to be a spirit of bipartisanship to accomplish things. Sharing insight into how Congress really works, Posey explained the importance of dealing with unelected staff members, who greatly influence a number of legislators. He said caucuses have been created for such topics as space and even national estuaries, where many bipartisan legislators, as well as chiefs of staff, gather to advance ideas and strive toward obtaining funding for critical need projects.

REPUBLICAN LIBERTY CAUCUS HOLDS ANNUAL CONSTITUTION DAY DINNER

To honor the U.S. Constitution, our Founders, the men and women of the Armed Forces and First Responders, the Republican Liberty Caucus of Central East Florida (RLCCEF) held its 11th annual Constitution Day Dinner in Melbourne on September 14.

RLCCEF Chair Bob White welcomed more than 240 attendees, thanking them for all they do for Liberty, and promising they would hear three outstanding speakers to go

along with their steak-andchicken dinner – KrisAnne Hall, and Erika and Byron Donalds.

Hall, president of Liberty First University and a radio and cable TV host, giving a historical perspective of the Second Amendment to the U.S. Constitution – the right to bear arms – said it is NOT a government-

given right, but rather one that is God-given. "The preservation of liberty is our individual responsibility and also a God-given right," she said.

Hall pointed out that American statesman and political philosopher Samuel Adams wrote that the colonists had such "natural rights" as "First a right to life, secondly to liberty, and thirdly to property; together with the right to defend them in the best manner they can."

Discussing the so-called Red Flag Laws being pressed by liberal Democrats in Congress and the state legislatures today – which would allow law enforcement to seize firearms from people who've committed no crime, but are believed to be a danger to themselves or others – Hall said, they not only violate our right to keep and bear arms, they are based on "reaction rather than reason."

She added, "They violate the right to self-preservation, to due process, to property, and to freedom of speech, and they enslave you."



Erika Donalds, the founder and chair of the Florida School Choice Movement and head of The Optima Foundation, a non-profit organization established to expand and support superior schools of choice in the state, said she began her "passionate mission" when she pulled her young son from his public school class, where he was doing poorly, and placed

him in a private school where he began to excel.

Donalds said that she and her husband had the finances to pay for the private school, and now she is "on a mission to help those families without the means" to utilize private schools, explaining that she is "passionate about school choice."

In 2014, Donalds won a seat on the Collier County School Board, where, she said, her vision was that public schools would become more responsive to parental feedback and students' needs, but she discovered that the Florida School Boards Association fought to stop state vouchers and limit the number of charter schools in the state.

She said she then led a fight to ensure school board members statewide need not become members of the FSBA, and with other pro-school choice elected officials around the state, she became a founding member of the rival Florida Coalition of School Board Members.

Florida is "out in front and going in the right direction," with 650 charter schools now operating in the state, she said, but added that many of its 67 counties still do not have any.

Her husband, Byron Donalds, a Collier County State Representative, in his remarks, pointed out that while he is the only Black Republican legislator, he is proud to meet the Democrats' liberal actions "with the force of liberty."

He added, "When the law is used against law-abiding citizens, those laws have to be defeated."

Donalds said that when he talks to young Democrats in his district, they want to know "where the money is coming from," and he has to explain to them that it comes from all of us, through taxes – a concept of which they were unaware.

As a supporter of legal immigration, and not open borders, Donalds noted that "the media and the left are going off the rails on this one." He added that "we are all appointed by God to be here for a reason," and our "fight for liberty will never end."

Joining his wife in the quest for better education opportunities, he serves as Chair of the PreK-12 Quality Committee and Vice Chair of the PreK-12 Appropriations Subcommittee in the Legislature. During his time in the Florida House, Donalds has focused on criminal justice reform and elder affairs, as well as striving to make sure that each child in Florida has access to a world-class education.

A highlight of the RCL-CEF Dinner each year is presentation of The Jefferson Cup to a person or persons deemed worthy by the chairman for his or her dedication to the Jeffersonian principles of limited government, lower taxes, free and fair markets, and personal freedom and responsibilities, as well as allegiance to the U.S. Constitution.

The replica cup's symbolism can be traced back to a bequest by George Wythe of two small silver cups cast in 1787. In 1810, Thomas Jefferson had them melted down along with two mugs to create eight small tumblers. Six of these cups survive today at Monticello, and the whereabouts of the other two remain a mystery.



No recipient is ever made aware in advance of his or her selection, and this year the award was presented by **RLC-CEF Vice Chair Rocket Weiler** in an emotional ceremony to **Pat Pasley**, not only for her contributions to liberty, but also those of her late husband, former **Sebastian Inlet Commissioner Dave Pasley**, who passed away a

few months ago following a courageous battle with cancer. Accepting the award, Pat Pasley said, "We were a team," and "His spirit is with all of you."

Starting a new RLC-CEF tradition, Chairman White displayed an oil painting of a colonial sailing vessel that he presented to **John and Barbara Weiler** as the "Chairman's Leadership Award." He explained that the painting will be retained by the Weilers for one year, and then be presented to someone else at the 2020 Constitution Day Dinner. The names of the recipients, White said, will be engraved on an accompanying plaque.

The presentation of the flag at the opening of the dinner was carried out by the Viera High School Junior ROTC Color Guard.

Earlier in the day, White, who is chair of the Republican Liberty Caucus of Florida, as well as that of the Central East Florida chapter, conducted the RLC-FL semi-annual convention, at which he, **Secretary Travis Christensen** of Clay County, and **Treasurer Matt Nye** of Brevard County (who also serves as RLC's National Chairman) were reelected to their current positions. **Alexandra Coe** of Sarasota County was elected the RLC-FL Vice Chair.

Also elected at the convention were At-Large Directors John Weiler and Nick Tomboulides of Brevard County, and C.J. Gravois of Okaloosa County; and five Regional Directors: Ted Noftall of Volusia County; John Carroll of Pinellas County; John Hallman of Sumter County; John Mills of Santa Rosa County; and Bob Sutton of Broward County.

KrisAnne Hall addressed the convention attendees on everyone's "natural right to defend life, liberty and property," and that "we need to learn where we came from and who we are."

Matt Nye presented a training session on the CiviCRM computer system, and how it can be used in tracking election information.

John Hallman, who is known as the Liberty Lobbyist, and Nick Tomboulides, Executive Director of U.S. Term Limits, participated in a panel discussion on issue advocacy and lobbying before the Florida Legislature.

Two Florida State Legislators – **David Smith** of Seminole County and **Anthony Sabatini** of Lake County, who are both U.S. military veterans – gave a panel discussion on running for office, winning, and serving. The convention portion of the day closed with Erika and Byron Donalds, joined by former Lee County State Legislator **Matt Caldwell**, discussing the Big Picture of Issues and Priorities for Florida.

THIS AND THAT

POLITICAL JOTTINGS AND DOTTINGS IN WASHINGTON. Since last month's newsletter.... **President Trump** on September 18 named **Special Presidential Envoy for Hostage Affairs Robert O'Brien** as his new national security adviser, replacing **John Bolton**. The

President said he has worked "long and hard" with O'Brien, an attorney and as U.S. Alternate Representative to the U.N. General Assembly during the George W. Bush Administration. On September 10, Trump said he fired Bolton from the national security adviser post because he and several other members of the administration disagreed with many of his suggestions, but Bolton argued that he had resigned before being fired. O'Brien becomes Trump's fourth national security adviser. The first two were Army Generals Michael Flynn and H.R. McMaster.... The U.S. Senate on September 19 confirmed the nominations of businessman John Rakolta, Jr. as U.S. Ambassador to the United Arab Emirates, and entrepreneur Kenneth Howery as U.S. Ambassador to Sweden. On September 11, the Senate confirmed former Federal Labor Relations Chairwoman Dale Cabiness as Director of the Office of Personnel Management.



Michael Reagan, President Ronald Reagan's son, said in his "Reagan Reports For America" on September 13 that when **President Donald Trump** visited Baltimore the evening before to address Republican Congressional legislators at their annual retreat, they greeted him with a "four more years" chant. Trump then promised that Republican lawmakers would "fight for the future of cities like Baltimore that have been destroyed by decades of failed and corrupt rule" due to "the left-wing agenda" of regulations, crippling taxes, and "unrestricted migration" that have undermined law enforcement and devastated America's inner cities. Reagan also quoted Trump as saying his administration was working on an "inspirational" tax cut for middle-income workers, and then the President received a standing ovation when he promised to uphold the right to keep and bear arms.

PREVENTING FUTURE SCHOOL MASSACRES.



Andrew Pollack, whose daughter, Meadow, was a victim of the Parkland, Florida, high school massacre that left 17 dead, is on a mission to make sure other parents are aware of what failed in Broward County so that future school tragedies might be prevented. In his new book, "Why Meadow Died: The People and Policies That Created

The Parkland Shooter and Endanger America's Students," Pollack spells out the countless red flags that both school officials and law enforcement had regarding deranged murderer Nikolas Cruz. Policies implemented by former President Barack Obama, Pollack said, "prevented the reporting of an abundance of evidence that could have been used to stop his daughter's killer." He said a litany of events that apparently were disturbing enough for Cruz's teachers to report in their notes, were either never reported to or were dismissed by authorities. One noteworthy example, Pollack pointed out, was that Cruz's psychiatrist insisted her patient should not be admitted in to JROTC program, citing "the safety of others/himself," but he was nonetheless enrolled in the program and "literally" given "an air gun, shaped like an AR-15, and [allowed to] practice shooting." In a recent interview on Fox News, Pollack said, "Students were allowed four misdemeanors per school year without being introduced to the judicial system. And then, at the end of the year...he resets at zero, again, and is allowed another four misdemeanors per school year." The Left wants to blame "the big, old, black, scary gun," he said, "But that didn't happen in Broward." A report from RealClearInvestigations earlier this year gives an abundance of evidence supporting Pollack's claims, reiterating that the policies set forth by Obama and carried out by Broward School Superintendent Robert Runcie - a Chicagoan and Harvard graduate with close ties to Obama and his Education Department - were "behind Cruz's Florida rampage."

K-9 MEDAL OF COURAGE. The Department of Defense this month honored four retired military dogs – Emmie. Troll. Yeager, and Niko – with the K-9 Medal of Courage for their service in Afghanistan. It is the highest award a canine can receive. Emmie was lauded for finding IEDs, and after returning to the U.S., she worked with staff to sniff out explosive devices at the Pentagon. Troll was responsible for finding explosive devices and saving 65 servicemen and women in 2012. He also helped clear a landing area for a helicopter after a soldier was wounded. Yeager took part in over 100 patrols in Iraq as well as Afghanistan as part of the Marine Corps. An explosion killed his handler and injured one of his ears, after which he retired and was adopted by a Marine Corps family. Niko cleaned routes and swept houses for insurgents in known hot zones, ensuring the safety of soldiers before meetings took place.



ACT! FOR AMERICA SPACE COAST CHAPTER. Investigative journalist Laura Loomer – who is Jewish, Republican, and a strong Trump supporter – told members of the Space Coast Chapter of Act! For America on September 19 that "big tech" social media has been banning

and suspending conservatives, and she is in the process of suing them for banning her critical statements about Islam.

Referring to herself as "the most banned woman in the world," Loomer said she has been banned by Twitter, Facebook, Instagram, Periscope, PayPal, Venmo, GoFundMe, Chase Bank, Lyft, Medium, TeeSpring, Uber, and Uber Eats. "I plan on suing all of the Left wing terrorists and tech tyrants who are trying to shut me down simply because I am a Conservative



Jewish woman who speaks truth about Islam," she said. "I have nothing to lose anymore, so trust me when I say I will stop at nothing to make sure justice is served for the way Silicon Valley has disenfranchised me, falsely accusing me of being a white supremacist, a Nazi, anti-Muslim, a racist, a bigot, and every other smear in the book." Regarding Twitter, Loomer said she was told her account violated its rules against "hateful conduct" after she sent a tweet criticizing Minnesota Congresswoman Ilhan Omar for being "anti-Jewish," and describing her as a member of a religion in which "homosexuals are oppressed" and women are "abused" and "forced to wear the hijab." Since social media organizations are partnering not only with Democrats, but also the Council on American-Islamic Relations (CAIR), Loomer refers to their banning as "Silicon Valley Sharia." Facebook and Instagram, she noted, have not banned Antifa or ISIS from having accounts on their platforms. "Antifa doesn't engage in violence? ISIS doesn't engage in violence and hate? Who are they kidding?," she added. Project Veritas - for whom Loomer worked for three years as an undercover journalist before launching her own company - has released several videos exposing big tech's bias against conservatives, she said. Noting that the White House has been briefed on a proposal to develop a way to identify early signs of changes in people with mental illness that could lead to violent behavior - creation of a new agency to be called the Health Advanced Research Projects Agency (HARPA), Loomer said this could be a way toward more gun control, with the idea that tech companies would be responsible for collecting data, establishing algorithms, and suggesting to the government who is mentally ill, and who shouldn't be allowed to own a gun. Loomer also showed the audience several videos. including her bringing illegal aliens to Nancy Pelosi's house in California and setting up camp on her front lawn before being chased away by police; repeating the act at the home of California Governor Gavin Newsom, where police arrested her and took her away in handcuffs; and of handcuffing herself to the front door of Twitter's New York headquarters

building. What's next for this 26-year-old who was born in Arizona but now lives in Florida? She has announced she is a Republican candidate for Florida's District 21 congressional seat. A major platform in her campaign, she said, is to go after big tech and social media. "We could lose the country if we don't break up big tech," she said. NEW MILLENNIUM CONSERVATIVE CLUB. When it

comes to understanding Islam, **Roger Gangitano**, president of the Space Coast Chapter of ACT! For America, told members of the New Millennium Conservative Club on September 16, "It is both a religion and a political system." ACT! is not against the Muslim religion, he said, but it does oppose jihad terrorists. Muslims who move to other countries, he said, "would rather



dominate than assimilate." The practice of jihad, Gangitano said, is obligatory for Muslims to practice, but he stressed that while "jihad" means to fight, those who do not wish to wage war can still meet their obligations by donating instead. Discussing the Council on American-Islamic Relations (CAIR), he said that while it presents itself as a civil rights organization, it actually is a terrorist group, with ties to the Muslim Brotherhood. Islam has infiltrated our education system, Gangitano added, and he recalled that several years ago, ACT! fought against school history textbooks - printed in Texas for distribution nation-wide – that devoted 36 pages to Islam but only a half-page each to Christianity and Judaism. A local committee prepared a supplement for Brevard schools to correct this, but Gangitano said he later learned that teachers were not using them, which was frustrating. "We need to teach our history," Gangitano stressed. Scholars of Islam study the Koran, he added, but an easier book to read is one that was written in the 14th century called "Reliance of the Traveller."



At the September 11 meeting of the Brevard Republican Executive Committee, **Chairman Rick Lacey** announced that according to statistics obtained that day from the Brevard Supervisor of Elections Office, the number of registered Republicans in the county is just shy of 180,000, while the figures for the Dems are under 132,000 and NPAs (No Party Affiliation) are under 112,000. Lacey also announced that **Peter Fuscass** is serving as the committee's new parliamentarian.... RONALD REAGAN CLUBS.



Trial attorney and communism expert Alexander Penalta told members of the Ronald Reagan Clubs meeting in Suntree, Florida, on August 26 that "a socialist is a communist in training." Linking this thought to today's Democrat Party, in which most, if not all, of its presidential candidates espouse socialist ideas, he said they are following the concepts of "The Art of

War," the ancient Chinese military treatise by strategist Sun Tzu in the 5th century B.C. The Soviet Union also studied this philosophy, Penalta said, focusing on ideological subversion and turning a stronger force against itself. He also showed the audience a video of a 1984 interview with one-time Soviet KGB agent Yuri Bezmenov, who defected to the West, and who outlined four steps of "a great brainwashing" that the KGB used. The first stage, "demoralization," lasts for a generation, which is the time it takes to re-educate a generation of students to change what they are thinking, and Bezmenov used examples of 1960's hippies contaminated by Marxist-Leninist values coming to positions of power in government and business in the 1980's. Once that is completed, he said in the interview, the second stage is "destabilization," during a two-to-five year period targeting a nation's essential structural elements: economy, foreign relations, and defense systems. He said the third stage would be "crisis" - taking up to only six weeks to bring a violent change of power, structure and economy – and then, the last stage, "normalization," would be when the county is basically taken over, living under a new ideology and reality. Penalta pointed out that today. Antifa enforcers help the Democrats, whose goals are to penetrate the economy, move away from traditional religion, stop teaching history and civics in the schools, and focus on community organizing. They want to take society down to where you cannot determine between good and bad, he said. Penalta noted that destabilization includes such activities as changes made to school textbooks and fabrications reported by the media, and normalization would include economic warfare - destroying business - and political warfare – a coup against President Trump.

AUDACITY AND IDIOCY

--"The New York Slimes" newspaper?, for outrageously tweeting on the 18th anniversary of 9-11 – without reference to an individual reporter or editor – that "airplanes took aim at the World Trade Center and brought them down." Airplanes! The "Slimes" was universally condemned and mocked for ignoring the fact that it was Al Qaeda terrorists who hijacked the planes filled with hundreds of innocent people and killed thousands more in the Twin Towers. Later in the day, the tweet was deleted. --CNN, which on 9/11, instead of reflecting on the terrorism that occurred and the victims involved, continued to lecture Americans on "the violence of right-wingers", and that "racist" Republicans are not treating white supremacy "seriously."

A letter from Trump's attorney to MSNBC said, "These statements are false and defamatory, and extremely damaging. The only borrowers under these loans are Trump entities, and Mr. Trump is the only guarantor. Numerous documents for each of these loans are also recorded, publicly available and searchable online."

--Deluded "Washington Com-Post" columnist and Never-Trumper Max Boot, for lamenting that as hard as he tries, no matter how many columns or sound bites he produces, President Trump remains in office. Much of his journalism (journalism?) for the past four years, he said, "has been devoted to critiquing President Trump and opposing the spread of Trumpism."

--CNN Chief National Security Correspondent Jim Sciutto – a former Obama administration official – for absurdly claiming that the United States had to extract a Russian spy from his home country because President Trump's actions were leading to his potential arrest, and the president's handling of classified information was "scandalously irresponsible." --"Politico" reporters Natasha Bertrand and Bryan Bender, for falsely stating that President Trump has been directing U.S. Air Force planes to stop at Prestwick Airport in Scotland close to the Trump Turnberry hotel in order to earn the crews' per diem. They ignored the facts that the Air Force has been using the same airport for refueling stops going back to the Obama administration, AND that hotel is the least expensive one in the area.

--A spate of violent crimes such as rape and murder occurring in Montgomery County, Maryland – but that is not the problem. No, it's that the officials in the Democrat selfdeclared sanctuary for illegal aliens are criticizing conservative media and the Trump administration just for drawing attention to the offenses. Deep Blue Montgomery County is what the Editor frustratingly called home for 34 years before moving to red Brevard.

--The North Carolina High School Athletic Association, for suspending the entire football season for the cheerleaders of

North Stanly High School, whose "crime" was posing for a quick, pre-game photo with a banner reading, "Trump 2020 Make America Great Again." NCHSAA Commissioner Marilyn Que Tucker said an environment is needed "where people feel safe…that respect for all people participating is being shown." Responded Conservative columnist and talk-radio host Todd Starnes: "What a load of Grade-A, politically correct fertilizer."

--Dr. Allen Frances, the former head of the Psychiatry Department at Duke University, for saying on Fake News CNN that President Trump "is as destructive a person in this century as Hitler, Stalin, Mao in the last century. He may be responsible for many millions more deaths than they were." Frances also said he opposes psychiatrists diagnosing patients they had not seen, but that is exactly what he was doing, with CNN's Brian Stelter allowing him to continue ranting.

--Missouri Democrat Kelli Dunaway, who was sworn in as a St. Louis County Council member following a special election to fill a vacancy, by replacing the Bible with a copy of Dr. Seuss' "Oh the Places You'll Go!" She is a former field organizer for Obama for America.

--A group of bigoted faculty members who support sexuality and gender diversity at the University of Kansas – ironically, the former traditional sports rival of the Editor's University of Missouri before the Tigers joined the SEC – for calling for a boycott of Chick-fil-A at the campus Student Union building, because the restaurant chain's owner supports traditional marriage and believes in Christian doctrine.

--U.S. District Judge William Conley, an Obama-appointed federal "your honor", for forcing Wisconsin taxpayers to provide costly sex reassignment surgery and hormonal procedures through Medicaid for low-income transgender residents. According to the National Bureau of Economic Research, the recession began in July 1990 and ended eight months later, in March 1991 - a full 19 months before Clinton's election. Yet, as Investor's Business Daily pointed out, in October 1992, over 90% of the economic news in newspapers was negative. The next month, Clinton won the election. And that month, only 14% of the newspapers' economic news was negative. A 1992 Gallup poll found that a majority of Americans thought we were in a recession.... The media's bad-mouthing of Bush 41's economy shaped Americans' perception of it. How strong was the economy Bill Clinton inherited? On January 29, 1993, seven days after Clinton took office, a New York Times article headlined 'U.S. Says Economy Grew at Fast Pace in Fourth Quarter' said, 'The economy grew at a faster-thanexpected annual rate of 3.8 percent in the final quarter of 1992, the strongest performance in four years, the Commerce Department reported today.' Three-point-eight percent! Not bad for a 'recession.' Had Hillary Clinton won the 2016 election and presided over an economy performing this well, the media would call her an economic maestro who 'jumpstarted the economy' and whose reelection was all but a foregone conclusion."



University of Oklahoma history professor **Wilfred McClay**, writing on Rediscovering the Wisdom in American History in Hillsdale College's "Imprimis" publication:


"The story of America has been fractured into a thousand pieces and burdened with so much ideological baggage that studying

history actually alienates young Americans from the possibility of properly appreciating their past....To understand our nation, it's not enough to understand principles such as equality and liberty, as important as those are. We also have to understand how those principles were put into action, how they were developed, how they came to be forces in our national life. American history, to be sure, is inseparable from America's principles and ideals, but America is not simply those things. It is a place with a venerable history created by men and women to whom our veneration is owed. Think of those who lie in Arlington National Cemetery and of countless others in the long history of such sacrifices made on behalf of our country. These things bind us to the land in visceral ways that go beyond ideas or principles. Second is the theme of hope. The idea of America as a land of hope shouldn't be misinterpreted as signifying a saccharine or sentimental view of America's past, but rather as taking into account history's spiritual dimension. We are creatures with free wills and aspirations, not merely tumbleweeds at the mercy of large historical forces. Hope is a quality of soul, something that's not quantifiable or explicable in strictly material terms. It is a consistent characteristic of this country that we have always sought to rise above or move beyond the conditions that are given to us at birth-something not true of every people. To be an American is to believe that the status we are born into is never the final word. We have a spirit of striving, a spirit of hope that goes back to our very beginnings....It's harder than usual today to get young people interested in the past because they are so firmly convinced that we're living in a time so unprecedented, enjoying pocketsized technologies that are so transformative, that there's no point in looking at what went on in the eighteenth and nineteenth centuries. To them the past has been superseded just as our present world is forever in the process of being superseded."

Correspondent **Ema Gavrilovic**, writing on anti-male discrimination on college campuses for the Leadership Institute's <u>www.campusreform.org</u> website:

"A recent study of 215 universities showed that female-only

scholarships outpaced their maleonly counterparts by a ratio of more than 11 to one. This comes amid the Department of Education's investigation of antimale discrimination at dozens of premier universities.... Mark Perry, a professor at the University of Michigan-Flint and a leading scholar at the American



Enterprise Institute, addressed the situation in an interview with Campus Reform. 'The experience I had successfully challenging the single-gender, girl-only, no boys allowed GEMS program at UM-Flint led to my efforts challenging similar illegal programs at more than 50 universities around the country,' Perry told Campus Reform, suggesting a 'double standard' in how Title IX is applied. 'My goal, for both legal and ethical reasons, is to advocate for uniform enforcement of Title IX's prohibition of sex discrimination, and advance the important principles of equity, fairness, and justice for all genders, not just for some preferred genders,' the professor said. 'Civil rights are important for everybody, and right now federal civil rights laws (Title IX) are often not being enforced when sex discrimination against male student[s] and faculty is allowed and not corrected'.... A women-only lounge at Michigan State University marked the first step in Perry's crusade against gender discrimination. After Perry submitted a civil rights complaint against the university for violating Title IX, the school shut the lounge down in summer 2016 and reopened it as an all-gender area in the fall....A 2015 study by Cornell University suggested that female candidates for tenure-track assistant professorships in STEM fields were preferred by a two-to-one ratio over male applicants. These results challenge the feminist notion that females candidates receive discrimination in hiring. According to Perry, sexual discrimination takes many forms. He told Campus Reform that a school offering a girls-only STEM summer camp 'while ignoring, neglecting, and disregarding the educational interests of boys' is 'illegal, unethical, and cruel.' Perry cited Oakland University's approach as the 'gold standard' of civil rights in higher education, claiming that the school's summer camps are 'gender-neutral, gender-blind, and genderinclusive,' never mentioning 'gender,' 'boys,' or 'girls,' in eligibility rules for these events. The professor noted that, in 2018, women earned more than 57 percent of bachelor's degrees, more than 61 percent of associate degrees, and nearly 59 percent of master degrees. 'That's a remarkable story of female academic success in higher education that should be recognized, acknowledged and celebrated,' he said."






