A record crowd of 560 enthusiasts attended the 13th annual Constitution Day Dinner by the Republican Liberty Caucus of Central East Florida in Cape Canaveral on September 11, to hear Conservative author and speaker **Candace Owens** address the challenge to them to reject the Left's "victim" narrative.



Applause for her remarks came loud and often. Her keynote address theme was: "We will never realize the true potential that this incredible country has to offer – in the land of the free and the home of the brave – if we continue to be shackled by the great myth of government deliverance."

Owens, who founded BLEXIT, an organization dedicated to driving conservative principles into urban communities, said that thinking about such events as the spread of COVID and what happened on 9/11, "you need people to be fearful and you can take away their freedom." The Left considers us a "backward, hateful and racist country," she said, "and we are losing it."

Following the 2001 attack on our country, she pointed out, everyone was united, on freedom and sacrifice. Today, no

more, but she stressed that "we have to fight to protect the American dream."

Referencing Afghanistan, Owens said the Taliban "didn't win anything," and the issue seems to be with our government "under the guise of protecting us."

Another issue with the Biden administration, she said, is over vaccine mandates. Noting that she is not anti-vaccine, she did stress to loud applause that getting one "is your choice." And there were cheers when she said that Dr. Anthony Fauci of NIH "should be in prison" for the "evil he has done in the last two years."

Since values begin at home, Owens said, what the Left is trying to do is destroy and undermine the family and denigrate Christianity.

She said the "biggest battle" we have is with what the Left is doing with our children in the classrooms. They are making sure that children "hate their country," she said, and they are being taught Black Lives Matter and Critical Race Theory instead of math and science. The schools are becoming advocates for Socialism, and this is what we are fighting, she added.

At the university level, Owens said, students are getting degrees in such areas as gender studies, and they get angry at America because then they cannot find a job. These students, she stressed, "are fed a lie."

Owens has spoken on more than 60 college campuses, insisting that students think beyond the confines of liberal orthodoxy. And as a leader among the growing youth conservative movement, she views it as her life's mission to help minority groups escape the Left's victim narrative.

Also at the dinner were members from Republican Liberty

Caucuses in other counties throughout Florida. **Bob White**, who is chairman not only of the RLC-CEF but of the RLC-FL as well, noted that while Constitution Day is celebrated on September 17 – the date in 1787 that the delegates to the Constitutional Convention in Philadelphia finalized and signed the new U.S. Constitution – having the



dinner on September 11 – the 20^{th} anniversary of the terrorist attack on our country – provided the opportunity to remember the victims and the people who contribute so much for our freedom and liberty.

"For all of our First Responders, and for all those who have fought for us in the war against terrorism, please accept our heartfelt appreciation. Be assured, we will never forget," White said.



Our September meeting opened with a silent prayer for the 13 soldiers who died in Afghanistan as well as the victims of Hurricane Ida.

We focused on this year's election of local municipal contests. The good news is that in the towns of Rockledge, Palm Shores, Melbourne Beach, Malabar and Indialantic, Republicans can claim victory since Democrats failed to file qualified candidates. However, we still need to campaign for our Conservative team in Cape Canaveral, Indian Harbor Beach, Melbourne Village and Barefoot Bay Recreation District.

An Action plan involving mailers, phone banks, door to door canvassing and Election Day coverage was presented and everyone was strongly encouraged to participate.



The guest speaker was **State Attorney Phil Archer**, who alerted BREC
members of the scams that are preying
on our community and the best way to
avoid being a victim. Either by phone
or email, he said, the scammers contact
thousands of people, hoping they do get
responses from some who will provide
them with personal and banking
information, and when they do receive

funds, that money is gone. So do NOT provide them with any information, Archer stressed, and do NOT click on any links that are provided.

A few of the types of scams that Archer said to watch out for involve reports of a family member in trouble, promises of reimbursement by cashier check for funds collected, unexpected pharmacy calls, clone attacks on Facebook, and spoofed Amazon text messages. Ignore instructions to opt out, Archer added, because this signals a working number and that will lead to even more messages. He also encouraged everyone to sign up for his newsletter updating the public about future scams.

Meanwhile, a motion to request a forensic audit of the 2020 election was passed with the intention of insuring accurate accounts of future elections, and an Election Integrity Committee has been formed, with **State Committeeman Mike Thomas** as the Chairman.

State Committeewoman Kim Adkinson updated everyone on the Neighborhood Welcome project designed to increase Republican registration as well as upcoming Super Saturday canvassing dates.

Vice Chair Cindy Roberts swore in nine Republicans as new BREC Committee members and joined me in recognizing Fifth District Chair Norace Lindsay and Adkinson as BREC Committeeman and Committeewoman for the month of September.

Sharon Rose, our Voter Registration Chair, coordinated another event to register more Republicans. Registered Agents Rhonda Burnett, Linda Harris, Peggy Huff, Joyce Loyd, Sharon Rose, Carol Vyhonsky and Xiaoqi Wang volunteered at the Florida Gun Expo held September 11 and 12 at the Space Coast Convention Center in Cocoa. Nine new Republicans were registered, two of them changing their party affiliation!



Our September 1 luncheon was a very exciting meeting. BFRW hosted **National Committeeman Peter Feaman,** one of our state's representatives at the Republican National Committee, and one of the organization's most wise, insightful Republican leaders.

Focusing on the civil war being waged by the Democrats, Feaman explained that within a few days of President Trump taking office in 2017, they were preparing to impeach him. That Russian collusion impeachment, he said, based on Hillary Clinton's Fusion GPS hoax, politically paralyzed the nation and cost U.S. taxpayers \$40,000,000.

When that effort failed, the Democrats began the Ukraine impeachment over what turned out to be "a perfect" phone call, Feaman added, and then several States' election results changed in the dark of the night.



Feaman reiterated that on January 6, when people protested certification of the election, the Capital Police opened the doors of the Capitol Building in Washington, let them in, and then attacked them as insurrectionists.

Democrats vocally blamed Donald Trump but stood mute when social media banned him and gave the Taliban a public platform. When Democrats demanded that all Americans mask up and carry vaccine passports, while inviting untested, unvetted illegals to pour into our country, he said, "it was clear they are engaged in a war – a divisive cultural and political civil war, to take away our basic freedoms."

Feaman explained that Election Integrity, one of the RNC's top jobs, is at risk, and that while the RNC is actively pursuing election fraud lawsuits and legislation focused on eliminating illegal election activities, it is important that all Republicans keep the faith and fight to assure that "our vote counts!"

Rick Lacey, Chairman of the Brevard County Republican Party, also spoke to the group, and asked that BFRW work with BREC to help get the Republican vote out for the November Municipal elections.

AUDACITY AND IDIOCY

--President Joe Biden, for constantly glancing at his watch during the solemn ceremony bringing home in caskets the 13 U.S. military service members killed by a suicide bomber at the Kabul airport. Desperate to



move on, he could not deal with the reality of what he wrought. It was a dishonorable end to America's longest war.

- --Woke "USA Today Fact-Checker" Daniel Funke, an alumnus of the far-left "PolitiFact," for needing a major correction on an overtly-biased "fact check" while carrying water for Joe Biden. When Biden met the caskets of the military members killed in Afghanistan, and Gold Star family members said the President constantly looked at his watch during the solemn ceremony, Funke wrote a hatchet piece accusing them of lying, but he sheepishly had to "correct" his remarks later, when video showed the family members were telling the truth.
- --The Left-leaning media company Politico, for discovering that Joe Biden's ancestors owned slaves, but then burying the information away in the 35th paragraph of a fluff piece titled: "How Joe Biden Became Irish." Politico reported that a genealogist named Alexander Bannerman wrote in the journal "American Ancestors" that two of Biden's great-great-grandfathers, who lived in Maryland in the 1800s Jesse Robinett and Thomas Randle were the slave owners.
- --House Speaker Nancy Pelosi, for bragging that "Today is a great day of pride for our country and for Democrats," before railroading a \$3.5 trillion budget resolution through the House by orchestrating a roll call to avoid a direct vote by deeming it passed once a rule was adopted governing floor debate for two other measures. The "great day of pride" sham also occurred while we were witnessing the disastrous retreat of our military from Afghanistan, which Pelosi ignored.
- --Malcolm Nance, an "intelligence" analyst for the left-wing cable news channel MSNBC, for tweeting that Americans should "get over" the horrific terror attack in Kabul that killed U.S. Marines. "This ain't news. It's why we are leaving," he said. "Deal with it." Outraged respondents, of course, excoriated Nance, who then claimed that some were sending "racial insults" at him.
- --Officials of Connecticut's Quinnipiac University, for punishing students who elected not to get coronavirus vaccinations, with a separate weekly fee of up to \$2,275 per semester and loss of access to the school's Wi-Fi network, in addition to mandatory COVID-19 tests.
- --Kristin Pitzen, a teacher in the Newport Mesa School District in Orange County, California, for putting away (she "forgot" where) the American flag that made her feel "uncomfortable," and told her students they could pledge allegiance to the gay pride flag she did have flying in her

- classroom. The school district was investigating her after she posted a video of the action.
- --"Woke" Chase Bank officials, for cancelling the accounts and credit cards of former Trump national security adviser General Michael Flynn, absurdly declaring that "continuing the relationship creates possible reputational risk to our company." Speaking of the pot calling the kettle black, the "honest bankers" paid \$920 million last year to resolve criminal charges that the Justice Department brought in connection with schemes to defraud precious metals and U.S. Treasuries markets. But it only took one day of negative publicity for Chase to apologize for the cancellation letter, and claim "we made an error."
- --Duquesne University psychology professor Derek Hook, for issuing a moronic video saying that "white people should commit suicide as an ethical act. "According to the Pittsburgh professor's biography, he is a "scholar and a practitioner of psychoanalysis with expertise in the areas of Lacanian psychoanalysis, post-colonial theory, the psychology of racism and critical social psychology."
- --Aspen Laboratories co-founder Suzanna Lee, for refusing to administer a requested COVID test to conservative media personality Candace Owens and telling her: "We cannot support anyone who has pro-actively worked to make this pandemic worse by spreading misinformation, politicizing, and discouraging the wearing of masks and actively dissuading people from receiving life-saving vaccinations. My team and myself have worked overtime, to exhaustion, unpaid and underpaid this past year, spending our own capital to ensure that our community remains protected. It would be unfair to them, and to the sacrifices we have all made this year, to serve you."
- --The National Archives and Records Administration, whose catalog and web pages provide access to millions of descriptions and digital copies of the permanent records of the U.S. federal government, for stating that "some content may be harmful or difficult to view," because it "may reflect outdated, biased, offensive, and possibly violent views and opinions, and may relate to violent or graphic events." NARA said such material may "reflect racist, sexist, ableist, misogynistic/misogynoir, and xenophobic opinions and attitudes; be discriminatory towards or exclude diverse views on sexuality, gender, religion, and more; include graphic content of historical events such as violent death, medical procedures, crime, wars/terrorist acts, natural disasters and more; or demonstrate bias and exclusion in institutional collecting and digitization policies."
- --Snowflake students at the University of Florida, for responding to the question of how the events of 9/11 should be taught in the classroom, by making such ignorant comments as "keep gruesome facts out of the lesson plan" and "avoid discussion of who was responsible for the attacks, avoid placing blame."

--Another group of Florida snowflakes were asked on Constitution Day if the U.S. Constitution is still relevant today, and a number of them said no, it is outdated and needs to be replaced. Dozens of them even signed a "petition" to that effect.

--Missouri State Representative Tony Lovasco, actually a Republican, for saying that following the removal of Confederate General Robert E. Lee's statue in Richmond, Virginia, the "reprehensible" statues of former President Abraham Lincoln should be torn down in the name of "fairness."

--Crystal Duncan Lane, an instructor in Virginia Tech's Department of Human Development and Family Science, for using her instruction syllabus to apologize to students of racial minorities for being white and benefiting from privileges. Other students reportedly disagreed with her decision to include the apology in her syllabus.

--Washington University in St. Louis Muslim student Fadel Alkilani, for removing 2,977 miniature U.S. flags from a 9/11 memorial on campus and being caught on video carrying them away in trash bags. Railing against "Islamaphobia," he defended what he disgustingly called his "Flag Relocation."

--An American Airlines flight attendant named Carl, for having a flight to Colorado Springs turned around and returned to the Dallas terminal so police could escort off the plane two adults and an asthmatic two-year-old who was having an attack and could not breathe with a mask. The attendant – who was heavily criticized on social media – did not care that the mother had proof of the child's negative COVID test.

--Texas abortion doctor Alan Braid, for violating the state's new law banning abortions after detection of a heartbeat, and boasting in a newspaper opinion column that he acted in a case because he had "a duty of care to this patient, as I do for all patients, and because she has a fundamental right to receive this care." He said he wanted to make sure that Texas didn't get away with its bid to prevent this "blatantly unconstitutional law" from being tested, and he presented his criminal act as "brave" and "heroic."

THIS AND THAT



U.S. SUPREME COURT. Lifting a federal ban on evictions during the coronavirus pandemic that the Centers for Disease Control issued last month, the U.S. Supreme Court on August 26 ruled 6-3 along ideological lines that the federal freeze was unconstitutional. The decision was a blow to the Biden

administration's effort to shield cash-strapped tenants from having to pay landlords thousands of dollars in rent. The eviction moratorium was instituted in 2020 but expired this past July 31. Then the CDC temporarily stepped in to try to extend the moratorium.... Two days earlier, by the same 6-3

vote, the court reinstated a Trump-era policy that requires asylum applicants to wait in Mexico while their claims are evaluated by U.S. authorities. President Biden, on his first day in office, cancelled the policy, responding to criticism that it forced migrants to wait out their cases in "violent border cities," and after lower courts ruled that the administration failed to follow proper procedures, it appealed to the high court. Its unsigned ruling, which was not supported by the court's three liberal justices, said the administration "failed to show a likelihood of success on the claim that the memorandum rescinding the Migrant Protection Protocols was not arbitrary and capricious." Republicans, especially those in Texas, the state most negatively affected by the Biden administration's open borders policies, was one of jubilance. Praising the Supreme Court for halting Biden's "skirting of immigration laws," Texas Governor Greg Abbott said the results would stem the tide of advancing illegals.

CALIFORNIA RECALL ELECTION. So, no surprise, Gavin Newsom remains in charge of the Cesspool in Biden's America. Voters in the overwhelming Democrat state kept him as Governor despite his unpopularity and with the help he received from the Deep State and the Left-wing media, which constantly attacked the leading Republican challenger – conservative attorney and radio host Larry Elder, whom they called "the black face of white supremacy." Elder was gracious in defeat, saying, "We may have lost the battle, but not the war." During the recall campaign, Elder's best quip on TV came when he discussed a woman wearing a gorilla mask who unsuccessfully threw an egg at him. The video went viral. Said a smiling Elder, "I don't know. Maybe she wasn't wearing a mask!"

SUPPORT FOR LAW ENFORCEMENT. During a

September 7 news conference in Lakeland, **Florida Governor Ron DeSantis** announced he will be asking the Florida State Legislature, when its session begins in January, to approve a three-point program in support of law enforcement in the Sunshine State. DeSantis said in order to draw officers from other states, he wants approval to offer them \$5,000 signing bonuses, to allow them to take Florida's officer



certification exam at no cost, up to \$1,000 each toward any necessary equivalent training programs for relocating officers, and to start a Law Enforcement Academy scholarship program to cover enrollment cost for new recruits who may not qualify for other financial assistance. DeSantis said he wants to help Florida "capitalize on this moment and make sure that we have the strongest core of law enforcement personnel anywhere in the country." Noting that anti-law enforcement sentiment and movements to defund the police have lowered morale for police units throughout the nation, he said that in Florida, "that is not going to fly. Officers in uniform here know they have the support of government and the people." It was pointed out during the news conference that a recruiting crew of seven officers from the Lakeland

Police Department visited New York City recently, spoke to nearly 300 officers, and hired 13 of them to move to Lakeland to join the force.

PAWS ACT. A new bill passed by Congress and signed on August 25 by the President creates a therapeutic program – Puppies Assisting Wounded Servicemembers (PAWS) – to help veterans suffering from PTSD and other mental health struggles. The hope is that training the dogs to be paired up with veterans will reduce suicides and encourage better quality of life. Statistics indicate that an average 22 veteran deaths occur by suicide every day in the United States. The PAWS Act marks the first time the Veterans Administration will pay for service dogs. The \$10 million program will take effect on January 1, 2022, lasting for at least five years.



FOUNDATION FOR INDIVIDUAL RIGHTS IN EDUCATION. After the
University of Illinois Chicago
suspended long-time law professor

Jason Kilborn, the Foundation for Individual Rights in Education (FIRE) successfully came to his aid using its new Faculty Legal Defense Fund. Kilborn's "crime" was using a hypothetical question in a law school exam containing redacted references to two slurs. A question about employment discrimination included a plaintiff being called "a 'n___' and 'b___' (profane expressions for African Americans and women)" as evidence of the discrimination. That was enough for the Black Law Students Association to denounce him to the school and the media for an "inexcusable" act. "Undergrad teaches students to think, but law schools, medical schools – they have to teach students how to do," said Kilborn, who has taught law for 21 years. "These hypotheticals," he explained, "really force students, future lawyers, to be confronted with the messy reality they'll be faced with in the outside world." The attorney assigned to him successfully explained to school officials that Kilborn was wrongfully being punished for protected expression, and he was reinstated. FIRE Director of Communications Daniel Burnett said that "With faculty rights increasingly under threat, professors need effective, experienced legal advocates to come to their defense." The Faculty Legal Defense Fund, which is funded by the Stanton Foundation, provides free legal representation to faculty through its national network of attorneys.

AMERICAN PRINCIPLES PROJECT. Jon Schweppe,

the Director of Policy and Government Affairs for the conservative think tank American Principles Project, appeared on Fox News Channel's "Tucker Carleson Tonight" program on August 24 to report there is an "open secret" in Washington, DC, that at least 35 conservative groups are "on the take" from Silicon Valley's Big Tech



companies, such as Facebook, Amazon, Google and Apple. "And of course, you know, with that money comes the willingness to launder those company's talking points and promote their preferred policies. Obviously this has an

effect," he said. Among the groups to which conservatives donate that Schweppe identified with this "impact" on their actions, were the Heritage Foundation, the American Enterprise Institute, the Federalist Society, the National Taxpayers Union, and the Republican Governors Association. COVID VACCINATIONS. According to WND.com, a whistleblower in Hawaii reported that he had seen more people die from COVID vaccine than from the virus itself, and that "none of that is being talked about on the news because it doesn't fit their narrative." And those hundreds of students, their relatives, and staff of the American University of Afghanistan who had boarded buses on Sunday to evacuate on U.S. military flights were told after seven hours of sitting on the bus that all evacuations were permanently called off; the 'New York Times' reported that because of Biden's mandatory deadline, the military will now only be bringing its own personnel home. 'High viral loads suggest an increased risk of transmission and raised concern that, unlike with other variants, vaccinated people infected with delta can transmit the virus,' CDC Director Rochelle Walensky noted after an oubreak of mostly vaccinated people in Massachusetts....In April, YouTube censored a video featuring Kulldorf, Bhattacharya and other health experts in an exchange hosted by Florida Republican Governor Ron DeSantis. YouTube didn't like an exchange in which Kulldorff, responding to a question by DeSantis, said 'children should not wear face masks, no. They don't need it for their own protection, and they don't need it for protecting other people, either.' Bhattacharya said it is 'developmentally inappropriate' for children to wear masks and it 'just doesn't help on the disease spread. I think it's absolutely not the right thing to do.' Bhattacharya said that 'if we went back a year, a lot of experts would say that wearing masks for the general public is not evidence-based.""



Students for Life of America President Kristan Hawkins, writing on the Texas abortion law as a victory for children, in "USA Today":

"Roe v. Wade was born in Texas, and the state's new Heartbeat Law could effectively mean the Lone Star State is where Roe dies. The first-of-its-kind law is designed to be enforced by

private citizens instead of the state, leaving the abortion industry in a conundrum: There's no one easily identified to sue to block the law. Out of more than a dozen states that have passed a 'heartbeat law,' Texas is the only one where the law is now in effect. More than 53,000 abortions were reported in the state last year, and it's estimated that the law will curtail that figure by at least 85%. Polling from Students for Life of America's Institute for Pro-Life Advancement this year found that 6 in 10 people in the millennial and Gen Z generations believe 'doctors should check for a heartbeat before performing or offering an abortion'.... The U.S. Supreme Court agreed in May to hear a case that could pose a challenge to the landmark 1973 ruling legalizing abortion nationwide. The case, involving a Mississippi law that bans most abortions after 15 weeks, will be heard during the court's fall term. The Supreme Court will revisit that outdated and out-of-touch decision later this year as it considers Dobbs v. Jackson Women's Health, centering on a Mississippi law that bans abortions at 15 weeks of pregnancy. One possible outcome is that the court could relinquish its 1973 usurpation of the abortion question and once again allow states to protect preborn children. Ahead of that decision, Texas has sent a strong signal to the courts that many Americans intend to protect our children from abortion violence.... Texas also is setting a model for federal protection of the preborn child. In July, SFLAction worked with Republican Congressman Chip Roy to spearhead the Protecting Life on College Campus Act of 2021, aimed at penalizing any taxpayer-funded university that dispenses abortion drugs on campus. With an estimated 62 million American children dead since Roe v. Wade and an untold number of mothers and families wounded by abortion, it is impossible to overstate the urgency and importance of laws like Texas' Heartbeat Law. Did you ever have a life-changing teacher? I did. My high-school history teacher would ask me tough questions and wouldn't bail me out with easy answers. He helped me see the importance of other perspectives and injected my mind with a healthy skepticism of all



ideology. Great teachers are like that. They model intellectual courage and insist on viewpoint diversity. They point their students to a lifelong quest for truth. The 1619 Project's curriculum, created by the Pulitzer Center (no relation to the prizes) for The New York Times, fails to give teachers and students a reliable resource – because instead of treating history as inquiry, it uses history for crude ideological ends. Take, for example, the curriculum's use of 'erasure' poetry, which, when applied to primary sources, can supposedly 'lay bare the real purpose of the document or transform it into something wholly new.' In this lesson, students choose a historic document and erase, or blot out, whatever content they choose, leaving behind only the words that convey their own message. Among the documents the curriculum subjects to 'erasure poetry' is the Declaration of Independence, which established equality and liberty as the twin ideals of our nation. This lesson, and nine others like it, offer a 'reframing' the 1619 Project says will 'challenge historical narratives, redefine national memory and build a better world.' But all it really does is give students prepackaged, ready-made -answers; it is history in a box. The problem with this approach is that history told from a place of omniscience – whether it is the 1619 Project or Howard Zinn's 'A People's History of the United States' – gives students no reason to ask questions themselves.... Whether done from the left or the right, this isn't history but polemic. And it's dangerous, because today's civics and history lessons form tomorrow's United States....In strong history and civic education, teachers and students confront the whole of American history, including the evil and brutality of slavery. Students should read the narratives of enslaved people, study the writings of abolitionists, and come to know why Frederick Douglass, the 19th-century escaped slave, statesman and abolitionist, called

the actions of slave owners 'an outrage upon the soul -a war upon the immortal spirit.' Douglass, whose story ought to be known to every American high-school and college student, is conspicuous in his near-absence from the 1619 Project. Yet his approach to the study of history and civic learning could have helped the 1619 Project's efforts to 'build a better world.' Even as Douglass extolled the -political liberty that came from 1776, he didn't let his fellow Americans forget the lash. He knew its effects firsthand and lamented the failure of the nation to live up to the principles of the Declaration. Yet he also sought unity around those ideals. That project – the American project – is the reason that life-changing history and civics teachers do what they do. Done well, there is no more important job in America. Instead of erasing the promise of the Declaration of Independence, we should welcome every young person to help realize it."
