--Last month, after watching a TV show about the late, great journalist **Edward R. Murrow**, I reminisced in this column about my interaction with him. Now, this month, after watching another TV show, I can reminisce about when I met the late, greatest-ever athlete, **Jim Thorpe**, a member of the Sac and Fox Native American Tribe. Track and Field, Baseball, Football, Basketball – he excelled in them all.

It was in the early 1950's, when as a high school student, a family friend who worked as a ticket taker for wrestling matches at the Baltimore Coliseum, had me sell programs to the audience. What a week it was – June 30-July 4, 2025. It started with Florida Governor Ron DeSantis on the last day of the last fiscal year signing the state's \$117.4 billion budget. Then Congress passed President Trump's "One Big Beautiful Bill," by close margins in the Senate and House, followed by his holding of a victory rally in Des Moines, Iowa on July 3. And it all culminated on July 4 Independence Day, with a nationally televised bill signing ceremony.



Regarding the Congressional legislative sessions, the Republicans were unified in support of a permanent extension of tax cuts for individuals and small businesses, but there were holdouts in both chambers who were split on whether the spending cuts in the bill went too far or not far enough.

On the other side of the aisle, every Democrat in both chambers voted in opposition. In the House, Minority Leader Hakeem Jeffries even kept control of the floor by speaking for

just shy of nine hours – unsuccessfully – in order to delay the vote. His droning-on was effective, though, in causing one of his colleagues to fall asleep – and be removed from the room.

In the Senate, where Republicans hold a three-seat majority, Vice President J.D. Vance was needed to break a 50-50 tie because three Senators – Thom Tillis of North Carolina, Rand Paul of Kentucky and Susan Collins of Maine – voted against the measure.

In the House, where Speaker Mike Johnson succeeded in pushing the bill across the finish line, the vote was 218-214, with the two Republicans in opposition being Congressmen Thomas Massie of Kentucky and Brian Fitzpatrick of Pennsylvania.

In Johnson's remarks prior to the House vote, he said, "If you're for a secure border, safer communities, and a strong military – this bill is for you."

Just some of the measures in the massive bill include no tax on tips and overtime, funding for military and illegal immigration enforcement, rollbacks in green-energy tax credits, an increase in funding for a border wall, increase in state and local tax (SALT) deductions, and new spending for shipbuilding and "Golden Dome" missile defense.

Taking a victory lap over passage of his "One Big Beautiful Bill," President Trump traveled to Des Moines, Iowa, later on July 3, to address supporters in an hour-long televised address to also kick off a yearlong celebration of America's 250<sup>th</sup> anniversary next year.

Speaking at a "Salute to America" event on the eve of Independence Day, he mused about the mutual "hate" between him and Democrats, a potential exemption for farmers to avoid the deportation of their workers who are in the country illegally, and the recent exchange of missiles between the U.S. and Iran.

"This is a declaration of independence from a really national decline. We had a national decline," Trump said. "We were a laughingstock all over the world. We had a man as president who shouldn't have been there."



Then, sitting on the White House lawn on Independence Day -- with hundreds of U.S. military personnel and their families, as well as dozens of Congressional legislators looking on – Trump, joined by his wife, Melania, officially signed his "one big beautiful bill" that Congress approved the day earlier.

Addressing the crowd, Trump said, "As we approach the 250th anniversary of America's founding exactly one year from now, we are creating an economy that delivers wealth for the middle class, a border that is sovereign and secure, and a military that is unmatched, unequaled anywhere in the world. We have made the Trump tax cuts permanent; that's the largest tax cuts in the history of this country."

The signing ceremony also included a flyover of F-22s, F-35s, and a B-2 Bomber, and the President spoke about how U.S. Air Force pilots attacking Iranian nuclear missile sites last month conducted one of the most successful military strikes in all of history.

# Governor DeSantis Signs Florida's 2025-2026 Budget

On June 30 – the last day of the last fiscal year, when the state would run out of money – **Florida Governor Ron DeSantis** signed the \$117.4 billion budget for FY 2025-26, after first vetoing \$567 million line items placed there by the State Legislature, which needed a special session after the regular 60-day session ended in order to complete the task.



Continuing DeSantis' commitment to fiscal responsibility, the budget maintains \$15.7 billion in reserves. It also includes \$830 million in funding for Florida's accelerated debt

repayment program, which will enable the state to this year pay off nearly 50 percent of Florida's tax-supported debt accrued since statehood, totaling more than \$7.3 billion retired since 2019.

Florida has achieved record economic and educational success under Governor DeSantis' tenure – ranking first in the nation for education, entrepreneurship, and new business formations – with more than 3.7 million new businesses established since 2019. These accomplishments have been realized while reducing government spending and safeguarding taxpayer dollars.

This budget continues strong support for the governor's key priorities, including teacher pay increases, law enforcement bonuses and pay raises, funding for civics in schools, a record amount of per-pupil K-12 funding, \$1.4 billion for continued Everglades restoration and water quality initiatives, and over \$15 billion to continue Florida's decades-ahead-of-schedule transportation and infrastructure projects.

"Once again, Florida is spending less than the previous year," DeSantis said. "Since I took office in 2019, we have also tripled Florida's Rainy-Day Fund. With this year's additional commitment, the fund is maxed out. Additionally, under my administration, this year we will have repaid almost 50% of Florida's historic debt – and we're now requiring a repayment of \$250 million in all future budgets. This year's budget continues our commitment to repaying our debts ahead of schedule, saving money for Floridians, and delivering tax relief for Florida families.

DeSantis also strengthened Florida's fight against anti-Israel boycotts, targeting universities and cultural organizations, and forcing state institutions to cut ties with any group that discriminates against Israel, as well as blocking taxpayer funding from flowing to anti-Israel causes. Under the new law, he said, "an educational institution, a nonprofit organization, an agency, a local governmental entity or unit thereof, or a foreign government" that takes anti-Israel actions will be classified as engaging in an "academic boycott."

The budget also mandates cessation of state contracts and grants with those entities if they don't change their ways. These groups will be added to Florida's official blacklist called the "Scrutinized Companies or Other Entities that Boycott Israel List." Once they're on that list, the state cuts them off completely.

Included in the new budget are \$2 billion in tax relief, focused on permanently repealing the business rent tax, renewing and expanding several sales tax holidays, and providing additional tax holidays to help keep more money in the pockets of Florida's families.

The tax holidays will include a permanent Back-to-School sales tax one every August; a permanent sales tax exemption on event tickets, state park admissions, life jackets, sunscreen, bike helmets, and insect repellent, so families can enjoy outdoor fun; permanent exemptions for disaster preparedness

items such as batteries, portable generators, tarps, gas cans, smoke detectors, and carbon monoxide detectors; and a "Second Amendment: sales tax holiday from September 8 through December 31 for relief on purchases of bows, firearms, ammunition, tents, sleeping bags, camping stoves, fishing rods and reels, tackle boxes, and bait and tackle.

The budget builds on the state's record investments in education, providing a historic \$15.9 billion in funding for the K-12 public school system. It also will cover the costs of over 429,000 students who are projected to participate in Florida's school choice program – the Family Empowerment Scholarship.

Leading the nation in higher education, Florida's new budget will fund student enrollment for the Bright Futures Scholarship program as well as additional funding for Florida's four Historically Black Colleges and Universities.

To support state's transportation network and infrastructure, the budget invests \$15.1 billion in the Florida Department of Transportation; to help support business development, \$50 million for the Job Growth Grant Fund; to assist the rural communities, \$92.2 million for repairing infrastructure; to support workforce housing, \$163.8 million for the State Housing Initiatives Partnership program; and to enforce immigration laws, \$1.9 million for the Office of Secure Florida in the Department of Commerce.

DeSantis has always recognized the invaluable contributions made to Florida by its law enforcement and military communities. They risk their lives every day to protect Floridians and are on the front lines of combatting illegal immigration into our state.

Additional budget items for these groups include \$49 million for pay increases to more than 16,200 state law enforcement officers; \$3 million for local jails under construction that have contracted with U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement to support immigration enforcement efforts; \$20 million for the Law Enforcement Recruitment Bonus Program; and \$1.5 million for the Military Base Protection Program.

Just a few more of the massive number of programs covered in the 2025-26 budget are investing in Everglades restoration; water quality and supply; disaster response, recovery and mitigation; and investing in a healthier Florida by supporting those struggling with mental health and substance abuse, human trafficking victims, seniors, mothers and children, and research for cancer treatments.

The Governor also used his veto pen on line items valued at \$557 million.



### SOUNDS FROM THE TRUMP-ET

--Despite Elon Musk's recent falling out with President Trump over opposition to his "One Big, Beautiful Bill," the South African business entrepreneur applauded his foreign policy peace efforts, saying the President "successfully resolved several serious conflicts around the world." Musk issued a social media post giving "credit where credit is due," accompanied by a Trump Truth Social post on a ceasefire in Gaza."

But then Musk announced he was starting a new, third political party – the American Party – and that did not go over too well.

On July 9, the President announced he was naming Transportation Secretary Sean Duffy to temporarily serve as NASA Administrator in a second role. "Sean is doing a fantastic job in handling our country's transportation affairs, including creating a state-of-the-art Air Traffic Control System, while at the same time rebuilding our roads and bridges," he said. "He will be a fantastic leader of the ever more important Space Agency, even if only for a short period of time."

Earlier, Trump withdrew his original nomination of tech entrepreneur Jared Isaacman to lead NASA. Citing his past associations with Democrats, as well as being a close ally of Musk. The President said it was "inappropriate that a close friend of Elon, who was in the Space business, run NASA when it is such a big part of Elon's corporate life."

Duffy is not the only Cabinet official to be given multiple job titles. Secretary of State Marco Rubio also serves as interim National Security Adviser.

--Unlike the previous President, who ignored visiting disaster areas in the United States, President Trump, accompanied by his wife, Melania, traveled to Texas on July 11 to meet with Governor Greg Abbott and tour the devastation left in the state by flash flooding that killed more than 120 people, including dozens of children at a Christian summer camp. More than 170 people were still missing in the tragedy.

"In the aftermath of this really horrific and deadly flood," Trump said, "we mourn for every single life that was swept away in the flood, and we pray for the families that are left behind. It's amazing, the incredible spirit from those families." The President and the Governor met with first responders on the scene, and said he approved, and then expanded, a major disaster declaration for Texas. Abbott said the state "will continue to work with our federal and local partners to provide impacted Texans with the support they need to heal and recover."

--Trump has nominated Nick Adams, the founder of the Foundation for American Liberty and Greatness (FLAG), to be U.S. Ambassador to Malaysia.

--On July 16, Trump signed the HALT Fentanyl Act into law, permanently classifying fentanyl-related substances as a Schedule 2 drug under the Controlled Substances Act.

Families who lost loved ones to the fentanyl scourge joined the President as he said the legislation is "delivering another defeat for the savage drug smugglers and criminals and the cartels"

--White House Press Secretary Karoline Leavitt revealed on July 17 that after the President noted mild swelling in his lower legs and bruising on his hands, out of an abundance of caution, he was evaluated by the White House medical unit, which diagnosed him with chronic venous insufficiency, a blood circulation issue.

"Importantly," Leavitt said, "there was no evidence of deep vein thrombosis or arterial disease." She said an echocardiogram was performed and it "confirmed normal cardiac structure and function." Regarding the hand swelling, Leavitt said "This is consistent with minor soft tissue irritation from frequent hand shaking."

--On July 18, the President signed the GENIUS Act, the first major cryptocurrency bill that establishes a regulatory framework for dollar-backed digital tokens called stablecoins, as "a giant step to cement the American dominance of global finance and crypto technology." The measure passed 308-122 in the House of Representatives on July 17, and by a 68-30 vote in the Senate in late June.

Stablecoins are digital currencies tied to stable assets like gold or the US dollar to maintain consistent value. This allows for more stability in the cryptocurrency market.

"I pledged that we would bring back American liberty and leadership and make the United States the crypto capital of the world," he said during a signing ceremony for the bill. "And that's what we've done. And under the Trump administration, this is only going further."

Earlier in the day, the House of Representatives gave final approval to the President's requested \$9 billion rescission page by a 216-213 vote. On the previous day, the Senate voted 51-48 for the bill — which cancels about \$8 billion in foreign aid and \$1.1 billion for the Corporation for Public Broadcasting to fund National Public Radio and Public Broadcasting System over the next two years.

For Democrats, violence is the answer. More than a few elected Democrat officials have

called for blood to be spilled in an effort to stop the Trump agenda. This is Trump Derangement Syndrome at its most extreme.

During the Open Borders Policy of the Biden administration, many violent individuals and known terrorists were released into the country. Sadly, this is not the first time in recent history that this has happened under a Democrat administration.

During another time, from April to September in 1980, when Democrat President Jimmy Carter was in office, 125,000 Cubans arrived on American shores in Florida. Under Communist leader Fidel Castro, thousands of Cubans went to the Peruvian embassy seeking asylum from the oppressive regime. Castro, trying to stop the unrest, opened the port of Mariel, west of Havana, to any residents who wanted to leave.

Cuban immigrants (nicknamed "Marielitos") crossed the Straits of Florida to the United States, severely straining the capacity of U.S. immigration and resettlement facilities. (Britannica) Many of them settled in the Miami area and became legal U.S. residents under the Cuban Adjustment Act. Some were relocated to many areas of the United States.

As you may know, I was a Nassau County, New York Police Officer. My post covered Belmont Racetrack and the surrounding area. Parts of the racetrack are in New York City. Many of the Marielitos found their way to the track. Apparently, there was a code among the worst of the worst. Star tattoos were inked either behind their knees or in the web between the thumb and index fingers. At the time no one knew what they indicated. The tattoos could symbolize various things within Cuban jail subculture, including potentially representing years served in prison or even the number of killings committed in some gang contexts.

I had been in quite a few extremely dangerous situations. The last time I was shot at was during an incident involving a drug deal that had gone wrong. I could not return fire since the precinct I served in was very densely populated. I had to take into account, in a split second, what would happen if I missed. The perpetrator had no such qualms.

We eventually arrested 6 Marielitos and charged the shooter with two counts of attempted murder of a police officer.

As George Santayana said, 'Those who cannot remember the past are condemned to repeat it." Unfortunately, we see that happening today.

The First Amendment does not protect violent or unlawful conduct, even if the person engaging in it intends to express an idea. The First Amendment does not protect speech that incites imminent violence or lawlessness. Threats of violence, stalking, and harassing people, whether private individuals or public officials, are not protected by the First Amendment and may violate multiple federal and state criminal laws.

- Rep. Hakeem Jeffries implored people to "fight" the Trump Administration "in the streets" and declared ICE agents "will be unsuccessful" in protecting their identities "no matter what it takes."
- Rep. Pramila Jayapal called ICE agents "deranged" and said it is "inspiring" to obstruct immigration enforcement.
- Rep. LaMonica McIver who was charged with "forcibly impeding and interfering with federal officers" incited

- her supporters to "shut down the city" because "we are at war."
- Minnesota Governor Tim Walz smeared ICE agents as the "modern-day Gestapo."
- Boston Mayor Michelle Wu compared ICE agents to the neo-Nazi group NSC-131.
- Chicago Mayor Brandon Johnson accused "secret police" of "terrorizing our communities."
- Vermont Senator Bernie Sanders asked people to "figure out a way to stop ICE from what they are doing as soon as possible."
- Representative Kweisi Mfume challenged the Trump Administration to "a street fight."
- Representative Stephen Lynch smeared ICE agents as "the Gestapo" and "nondescript thugs."
- Representative Alexandria Ocasio-Cortez said ICE "should not exist."
- Representative Becca Balint called ICE agents "vigilantes" who can't be trusted.
- Representative Eric Swalwell said it was his "priority" to ensure ICE agents "are no longer faceless," comparing them to "some 1800s bank robber or some KGB officer in Russia."
- Representative Dan Goldman compared federal agents to "secret police" who must be unmasked.
- Representative Jerry Nadler accused ICE agents of "hiding misbehavior because otherwise why would they be wearing masks?" (The White House Website)

Their rhetoric is not just inflammatory but are inciting those on the fringe of society to carry out violence and will lead to serious consequences. They are not exempt from the law and could potentially face various criminal charges, depending on the specific words used, the context of the statements, and the actions that follow. However, when the chant from the left when it came to President Trump is "no one is above the law", these same officials are saying "unless it's me". Will charges be brought? Probably not.

In Minnesota, State Representative Melissa Hortman and her husband were shot and killed, and Minnesota Senator John Hoffman and his wife were wounded.

To ensure seniors in our community are properly prepared for any potential storms,

Aging Matters in Brevard partnered with Florida Power and Light to deliver 2,200 meal kits filled with three days of nonperishable items, including water, nutritious food and snacks, and essential supplies.

Volunteers from both organizations helped assemble and deliver the kits to homebound seniors and those in areas that may be hard to reach after a significant storm.

The National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA) predicts the 2025 Atlantic hurricane season to be above average. It is critical that vulnerable seniors have a plan and access to support through local organizations, including Aging Matters in Brevard.

Insurance Commissioner Mike Yaworsky announced additional growth in Florida's insurance market with two new companies approved to write residential policies. Since historic legislative reforms, Florida's market continues to stabilize and now has 14 new companies doing business in the state.

The new insurance companies are Incline National Insurance, headquartered in Texas, and Florida Insurance and Reinsurance Company, which will primarily focus on writing coverage for condominiums and condominium associations. -0-



Brevard County officials are urging residents and visitors to be informed about the Florida Beach Warning Flag system; The five warning flag colors

are uniform throughout the state to keep travelers visiting various beaches informed of local conditions.

They are:

Green – Low hazard; calm conditions, but exercise caution

Yellow – Medium hazard; moderate surf and/or currents

Red – High hazard; strong surf and/or dangerous currents

Double Red – Water closed to the public due to extremely hazardous conditions

Purple – Dangerous marine life present, such as jellyfish or stingrays

These flags are flown daily at all lifeguarded beach locations in Brevard County. They are also posted on the Brevard County Fire Rescue Facebook page and the Cocoa Beach Fire Department's website. Many local beachside hotels and surf shops will also have updated conditions available.

"Operation Dragon Eye" was spearheaded by the U.S. Marshall's office with assistance from Florida's Office of Statewide Prosecution and 20 law enforcement agencies. The mission resulted in the rescue of 60 missing children, ages nine to 17, and the arrest of eight adult suspects. The suspects are facing multiple charges including human trafficking, child endangerment, drug trafficking, and drug possession.

"The real heroes behind this operation are the law enforcement who built and executed this mission. As your Attorney General and a father of three young kids, protecting children is my top priority," said James Uthmeier, Florida Attorney General. "If you victimize children, you're going to prison, end of story."

"Sixty kids saved. That number sends the message that Florida will never be a safe place for traffickers," said FDLE Commissioner Mark Glass. "At FDLE, we will continue to fight for those who cannot fight for themselves. And to any family still missing their child, we will never stop searching until we make sure they are brought home safely."

All of the rescued children are receiving physical and psychological care.

The Florida Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services is cautioning consumers to be aware of email subscription scams. FDACS stated that cybercriminals are targeting Floridians with phishing emails posing as legitimate streaming services like Netflix, Hulu, and others, to steal personal information and credit card numbers.

"These scams look real – but they're designed to trick you into taking the bait and handing over sensitive information," said Commissioner of Agriculture Wilton Simpson. "We want Floridians to recognize the red flags and protect themselves before they click."

One tip is to check the sender's email address. Scammers often use addresses that look official but aren't. If it doesn't come from the service's verified domain, don't trust it.

# AN UPDATE FROM MY OFFICE By Florida District 8 State Senator Tom Wright

On June 30th, **Governor Ron DeSantis** brought the budget process to a close by signing Florida's budget for the 2025–2026

fiscal year, a \$117.4 billion spending plan that maintains Florida's reputation for fiscal responsibility with a commitment to paying down debt, maintaining reserves, and strong investments in infrastructure, public safety, and economic development.

Since the close of the Legislative Session, I've been traveling across District 8 for post-session legislative wrap ups, community events, and planning meetings with local partners. Over the next few months, we'll be holding check presentations to mark the success of appropriation projects that are now fully funded and to highlight the teamwork that brought them across the finish line.

This year, I was proud to help secure several targeted investments for entities in Brevard County that reflect our local priorities. That includes \$700,000 for the City of Rockledge's Public Safety Regional Training Facility, which will provide enhanced capabilities for first responders throughout the region. We also secured \$350,000 for the Astronauts Memorial Foundation to support K–12 STEM outreach at Kennedy Space Center and \$300,000 for Brevard Achievement Center to expand job-training and support services for adults with disabilities.

The state budget includes \$250,000 for National Veterans Homeless Support, which provides transitional housing and wraparound care to Brevard's veterans in need. Additionally, three major projects that I sponsored for the County of Brevard itself received funding: \$1.26 million for the West Central Avenue Bridge Replacement, \$1.76 million for Indialantic Stormwater Drainage Improvements, and \$2.9 million for Indian River Lagoon Countywide Sewer Connection Expansion.

These are more than just budget wins – they're investments in safer communities, stronger families and a more resilient future for the Space Coast. In addition to these local victories, the state budget also includes funding that will benefit our region in significant ways. As Chair of the Senate Committee on Military and Veterans Affairs, Space, and Domestic

Security, I was especially proud to continue advocating for the importance of Space Florida and their funding. Space Florida has done a tremendous job supporting the growth and vitality of the space industry, not only on the Space Coast, but throughout the entire state.

The budget also provides \$49 million for state law enforcement salary increases, a 10% increase for entry level officers and a 15% raise for veteran officers with at least five years of service. Florida is also continuing its investment in public safety by dedicating \$20 million to the fourth consecutive year of the Law Enforcement Recruitment Bonus Program. This program provides a \$5,000 signing bonus to law enforcement officers transferring from another state to Florida or any newly certified law enforcement recruit. These actions send a clear message that Florida backs the men and women who wear the badge. Whether it's our veterans, economic development, or public safety, I'll continue fighting for the priorities that matter most to Brevard County, and I'm proud of the progress we're making together.

The Club had a wonderful meeting July 11 – it was our quarterly evening meeting – and we were blessed to have as our speaker **Maija Hahn**, who comes with an impressive list of credentials. She is active in Research and Education for Autistic Children's Treatment (REACT) as its Vice-President



and is the owner of Encore Speech and Wellness. Finally, she leads Children's Health Defense and has even been helping **HEW Secretary Robert Kennedy**, **Jr.** with his efforts to Make Florida Healthy Again (MAHA).

Hahn gave out some startling statistics:

- We Americans have the lowest life expectancy in the developed world at 76-78 years of age
- Forty percent of adults have 2 or more health conditions
- One in 31 children are considered autistic
- Twenty percent of our children are obese

It is now known that many toxins contribute to autism, she said, the most injurious being aluminum, which is also in our vaccines along with mercury.

Also discussed were the effects of plastics, pesticide, and electromagnetic fields (EMFs). Hahn went into great detail on the effects of EMF's on our children. Florida House of Representatives Majority Leader Tyler Sirois addressed the Space Coast Patriots on July 14 on the budget,

He was challenged hard by an audience member who felt Florida was being too harsh but firmly stood his ground by pointing out the many unseen costs associated with illegal immigrants. He also said that their entry was breaking the law in the first place.

Sirois was asked what he thought about Merritt Island incorporating, and his first comment was, "As long as I'm in my current seat, Merritt Island will not become a city." He further said, "Those who want a city, want more government." In addition, he said creating a city creates innumerable ways for officials to levy more taxes, fees and financial burdens on residents.

He generously spent almost 1-1/2 hours of his time with the Patriots and mentioned he wants to change the horrible Red Flag law to one that is just somewhat bad before it can be replaced entirely. He also said he is opposed to the LNG storage and regasification plant proposed for Merritt Island along the barge canal. Sirois was well received by the membership and was thanked for all of his efforts on behalf of the residents.

Alan Ross, the chair of "We the People" of Brevard as well as the South Beaches America First Conservative Coalition, told the Heritage Isle Republican Club on July 3 about honoring Brevard County's Grassroots Patriots in Florida's fight for political power.

Ross asked the members if they remember President Donald Trump's 2017 inaugural address, when Military Intelligence and Judge Advocate Generals came to the stage and stood behind him, and he stated what the MAGA movement was all about.



If you do not remember, here is what Trump said: "Today's ceremony, however, has very special meaning, because today we are not merely transferring power from one administration to another, or from one party to another, but we are transferring power from Washington, D.C., and giving it back to you, the people."

Still quoting the President, Ross said, "For too long, a small group in our nation's capital has reaped the rewards of government, while the people have borne the cost. Washington flourished, but the people did not share in its wealth. Politicians prospered, but the jobs left, and the factories closed. The establishment protected itself, but not the citizens of our country. Their victories have not been your victories. Their triumphs have not been your triumphs, and while they celebrated in our nation's capital, there was little to celebrate for struggling families all across our land. That all changes, starting right here and right now, because this moment is your moment --- it belongs to you. It belongs to everyone gathered here today, and everyone watching, all across America. This is your day. This is your celebration, and this, the United States of America, is your country. What truly matters is not which party controls our government, but whether our government is controlled by the people. January 20, 2017, will be remembered as the day the people became the rulers of this nation again."

Today, Ross said, Trump has done his part, and here in Brevard County, "I honor and commend with pride the Patriots in the Brevard Republican Executive Committee (BREC) and numerous conservative organizations for their efforts to reclaim power from Tallahassee and restore it to Florida's people. The Problem: Political Committees and Dark Money."

Ross pointed out that in 2013, Florida House Bill 569 removed the \$500 contribution limit for Political Committees (PCs), allowing unlimited donations. This change has undermined election integrity more than any other issue, including mail-in ballots or voting machine concerns. PCs have since funneled hundreds of millions of dollars to promote special-interest agendas, sidelining grassroots candidates and reducing accountability to Florida's citizens.

These committees, their chairs, registered agents, and treasurers appear to operate like a coordinated orchestra, he said, funded by donors prioritizing their interests over the public's. Grassroots candidates face overwhelming financial opposition, with "dark money" obscuring funding sources.

This system diminishes the people's livelihoods, incomes, and spirit.

In the 2024 Florida Republican Primary, he said, a PC sent misleading -- potentially fraudulent - mailers to high-propensity Republican voters. Patriots in seven counties, including Brevard, took notice, exposing a larger issue: organized PCs use dark money for select candidates aligned with Florida House and Senate leadership, silencing grassroots voices.

The Solution, Ross explained, is "Restoring Accountability. The path forward is clear. We must reinstate a \$1,000 contribution limit on PCs and eliminate transfers between PCs to prevent dark money flows." The people of Brevard County's elected Republican representatives serving BREC passed a resolution (95-16) supporting these reforms, as did so many other conservative organizations throughout the county. A coalition is forming across Florida to demand change in Tallahassee! Will our Brevard congressional delegation to Tallahassee support "We the People" or back "We the Money" and Tallahassee leadership with respect to this issue?


The consequences of inaction are clear, Ross said: soaring electric and insurance bills, stalled election integrity reforms, eroding county home rule, and unchecked development with underfunded infrastructure, clean water shortages, and inadequate public safety.

Reread Trump's speech, replace "Washington" with "Tallahassee," and the parallels are undeniable, he said. Join this statewide patriot movement to restore power to Florida's people. Demand reforms to end dark money's influence and put the people on an even footing by restoring a Political Committee contribution cap. "Will you stand with us and join President Trump's movement to restore power and accountability to the citizens of Florida?," Ross asked.

County School Board, who touted the accomplishments of the board over its transformation the last couple of years. Among them were:

- Replaced the Superintendent
- LGBTQ guidelines removed permanently
- Brevard County Schools are a purple star school district, only one of 6 in the state

- Reviewed 5,000 Brevard County School System policies and went through rule making
- procedures to make changes where necessary
- Suspended the book committee
- Instituted a cell phone ban throughout the district (can't be used in hallways or at lunch)
- Escalated penalty for vaping in the bathrooms
- Returned authority for running individual schools from the district back to the principles
- A district for 2 years in a row, up from 37<sup>th</sup>
- Increased pay for bus drivers in order to attract and retain drivers
- 67 percent of the schools in Brevard County are now in the A or B category
- Vacancies are down
- Instituted discipline diversion program

Trent noted that the LGBTQ guidelines not only pertained to the students, but also coaches. It was possible under the guidelines for a coach, janitor or anyone to enter the locker room of the opposite sex if they desired. "The Board passed that, and that was a shame. There were some conservatives on that board that didn't raise a stink when that was being passed," said Trent. "Right is right, wrong is wrong."

"The book committee was a fraud," he said. "So, we had 11 members, and if the parents had an issue with a book, it had to go to the book committee. They didn't remove the book. When it was challenged, it sat in the library until it was looked at. And my question was, when does it get looked at? And I was told there was a back log. You have to read each book cover to cover, and you can only read 50 pages a week. That would take 15 years to get through the book list."

Trent gave context to the Satellite Beach controversy in which a teacher was fired for breaking the law by calling a student by a name other than their legal name without the signed permission of the parent. "They just didn't think that we would do what we said we would do," he stated. "That's it. It wasn't many parents of kids. I would take that to heart. They were bringing in professional agitators from the Tampa area, having their own cameras. They were choreographed outside. They would never talk specific that what she did was wrong. They just said she was connecting to a student and she's a good teacher."

The next meeting for the Brevard County Republican Assembly is September 18. The speaker will be **State Representative Chase Tramont.**

#### THIS AND THAT

**FLORIDA CABINET.** With **Jimmy Patronis** resigning as Florida's Chief Financial Officer for his successful bid to become the new District 1 U.S. Congressman, **Governor Ron** 

**DeSantis** filled the Cabinet vacancy on July 16 by naming **Florida State Senator Blaise Ingoglia** to the position, calling him "a warrior" and "the most conservative Senator in the state." Ingoglia said getting the position is an honor and he vowed to be a fiscal watchdog. "I've had a history of calling out wasteful spending, whether it was Democrats or



Republicans, because I truly believe that government is accountable to the people, and our job is to make sure that we deliver that promise," he said. Ingoglia listed his priorities as property tax reform, investigating local government spending, and creating a "more vibrant" property insurance market. At his swearing-in on July 21, Ingoglia said, "You are not going to see anyone fight harder for the taxpayer, for the consumer, than I will, and I'm planning on hitting the ground running."

FLORIDA REDISTRICTING MAP. The Florida Supreme Court, in a 6-1 decision, upheld the state's 2022 congressional redistricting plan on July 17, ruling that enforcement of a state constitutional provision designed to protect minority voting strength would conflict with federal equal protection requirements. The court found that while the previous configuration of Congressional District 5 allowed Black voters in North Florida to elect candidates of their choice, the state was not required to maintain that district because doing so would amount to an unconstitutional racial gerrymander under the U.S. Constitution. The court determined that the Equal Protection Clause of the Fourteenth Amendment overrides the state's Fair Districts Amendment when the two are in conflict. Litigation stemmed from the Legislature's post-2020 census redistricting cycle. After Governor Ron DeSantis vetoed a congressional map that preserved the former District 5, the Legislature adopted a new configuration that divided the area across multiple districts in which Black voters no longer had the ability to elect preferred candidates. The decision leaves the 2022 map in place for the upcoming election cycle.

REMEMBERING ED FEULNER. The founder and



longest-serving president of the conservative think tank Heritage Foundation, Edwin Feulner – a statesman who devoted his life to the defense of our Nation's first principles – died July 18 at age 83. Numerous politicians and conservative institutions have remembered him as a courageous and wise

defender of truth. Feulner served for 37 years and Heritage's president before moving into an advisory role. Most recently, he helped organize and co-write Project 2025, the Heritage Foundation's policy recommendations for President Donald Trump's second term. Heritage's current president, Kevin Roberts, said Feulner's "unwavering love of country and his determination to safeguard the principles that made America the freest, most prosperous nation in human history shaped every fiber of the conservative movement - and still do. Whether he was bringing together the various corners of the conservative movement at meetings of the Philadelphia Society, or launching what is now the Heritage Strategy Forum, Ed championed a bold, 'big-tent conservatism." Feulner also had a lifetime association with the Delawarebased Intercollegiate Studies Institute, where he was a trustee emeritus, former chairman, and alumnus. In 2009, he received their lifetime achievement award. Believing that ISI's mission was indispensable to the future of the Republic, he said the organization "changed my whole life trajectory." He is survived by his wife, Linda, and their two children, and will be missed by conservatives nationwide.

REMEMBERING BILL TOLLEY. Retired businessman,



author, and Republican Party enthusiast **Bill Tolley** passed away peacefully on July 13 at the age of 91. A graduate of West Virginia University, where he met and married his late wife, Patricia, Tolley subsequently moved to Melbourne, Florida, and worked for 32 years for a small company that became Harris

Semiconductor. He was very active in the Republican Party and a long-time member of the Ronald Reagan Club and twice ran for Congress. Though unsuccessful in those efforts, his passionate campaigning on key issues prompted several other candidates and elected officials to address his concerns. The first time the Editor met him was at Tolley's home, where a large crowd of people had gathered to hear then-retiring seven-term U.S. Congressman Dave Weldon introduce his choice for a replacement - then Florida State Senator Bill Posey, who went on to serve eight terms in Congress. With a small group of friends, Tolley started and served as president of Heritage Communication. He wrote a book called "Don't Say I Can't," which he said was "The American Spirit in my life." Tolley had become an expert of government procurement policy and securing government contracts, and his book is the history of a man devoted to faith, family, business and politics, showing that God and country belong hand-in-hand. Tolley is survived by his son Jim, daughter Kim, grandchildren, and great-grandchildren.

IMMIGRATION SCAM. Three Louisiana chiefs of police – Chad Doyle in Oakdale, Glynn Dixon in Forest Hill, and Tebo Onishea in Glenmora – have been arrested by federal authorities and charged with helping hundreds of illegal immigrants gain legal status during the past decade. The illegals were charged \$5,000 apiece for bogus reports that they had been victims of armed robberies and thus could apply for "U" visas to give them and their families legal status. Also indicted were Chandrakant Patel, owner of convenience stores in Oakdale, who authorities said was the coordinator who recruited the migrants and paid the chiefs for the bogus reports; and Michael Slaney, a member of the Marshal's Office in Oakdale.

IN SUPPORT OF TITLE IX ATHLETICS. Bowing to pressure from the Trump Administration and following an investigation by the Department of Education Office for Civil Rights – which found that the school violated Title IX by "allowing a male to compete in female athletic programs and occupy female-only intimate facilities" -- the University of Pennsylvania has agreed to strip transgender swimmer Lia Thomas of all of the titles won over female competitors. The university also will issue formal apologies to every biological female competitor who lost an event to Thomas. The resolution agreement signed by the university will require it to undertake a host of additional actions, including adopting "biology-based definitions for 'male' and 'female' under Title IX" and issuing a public statement that it will no longer allow biological men to compete in female athletic programs or occupy women-only locker rooms. Female athletes who were impacted by the inclusion of trans athletes in women's sports

in recent years cheered the decision. This includes outspoken former University of Kentucky swimmer Riley Gaines, who said, "It is my hope that today demonstrates to educational institutions that they will no longer be allowed to trample upon women's civil rights and renews hope in every female athlete that their country's highest leadership



will not relent until they have the dignity, safety, and fairness they deserve."

"60 MINUTES" LAWSUIT. Paramount Global, the parent company of CBS News, has agreed to settle a high-profile lawsuit brought by President Trump over a "60 Minutes" interview with former Vice President Kamala Harris that aired last fall. The agreement, worth a reported \$16 million, will be paid to Trump's future presidential library and not to him directly. As part of the agreement, Paramount said "60 Minutes" will release transcripts of future interviews with eligible U.S. presidential candidates after they air, subject to redactions as required for legal or national security concerns. In the suit, the president's attorneys argued producers for the program intentionally edited portions of the interview to cast Harris in a more positive light. "To paper over Kamala's 'word salad' weakness, CBS used its national platform on '60 Minutes' to cross the line from the exercise of judgment in

reporting to deceitful, deceptive manipulation of news," the lawsuit read. After Trump and his allies repeatedly attacked the network over the edit, "60 Minutes" released a transcript of the interview and conceded the full version of an answer Harris gave to a question on the war in Gaza did not appear during the broadcast but instead online."

--It was a too quick trip to America for Hamed Ramadan Bayoumi Aly Marie. His visit from Cairo ended very shortly after his arrival in the



Washington, D.C. area, once a Customs and Border Patrol beagle named Freddie sniffed his luggage and more than 100 pounds of undeclared and prohibited agriculture products were found inside. That led Marie to violently kick Freddie and bruise his ribs, needing veterinary care. Handcuffed and arrested, Marie soon pleaded guilty in U.S. District Court "to harming animals used in law enforcement," was ordered to pay the vet bill, had his contraband seized, was banned from remaining in the United States, and was quickly placed on a flight back to Cairo.

Your generation is now witness to a counterrevolution of sorts. Millions of Americans are asking for a reexamination of our culture and society with an eye to restoring ancient decency and looking to the good of past generations. Critical to this restoration is your optimism. Such positivity is the child of gratitude for all that we have inherited and all that we wish to enhance and pass on to others not yet born. With optimism and confidence in the citizenry, a civilization grows rather than shrinks. It becomes secure, not depressed or beset by self-loathing. It looks to the future with reverence for the past, rather than with shame or hatred.... So, you, the Class of 2025, as Hillsdale graduates, will be asked by your peers to provide guidance as never before.
