



To a massive number of standing ovations, **Florida Governor Ron DeSantis** opened the current session of the Florida State Legislature in Tallahassee on March 7 with a 28-minute State of the State Address that stressed the Sunshine State ranks number one in the nation economically, in tourism, in law enforcement, in education freedom, and in protecting citizens against the "biomedical security state."



"Florida is number one and working together we will ensure that Florida remains the number one state in these United States," he said. "Florida has more people employed today than before the pandemic. Our unemployment rate is one of the lowest on record and it is significantly lower than the national average. And of course, as many of you know in this room, the last two years we've seen the largest budget surpluses in the history of the state."

if President Joe Biden had any involvement in "family business schemes," her evasive non-answer was: "So look, I've said this before and I'll say it again. House Republicans promise that fighting inflation during the midterms was going to be their number one priority, that is what they said was important to them and that's what they said they wanted to do. But instead, what they're doing, is wanting to start an investigation on the president and his family. They don't want to focus on the American people and their family, they want to focus on political division. They want to focus on something that the American people do not want to see, as we saw from the midterm elections."

--A few days later, Jean-Pierre brought a burst of laughter to the press briefing with this slip of the tongue: "So today, as you just saw an hour or so ago, President Obama announced that – pardon me, President Biden – Whoa! Ahem, that is news. I know, we're going back, not forwards. We've gotta go forwards."

Noting that Florida "stepped up in times of crisis," DeSantis reminded his legislative and television audiences that in September, "Hurricane Ian smashed into southwest Florida and barreled across our state. It left catastrophic damage in its wake, including the destruction of the Pine Island Bridge and the Sanibel Causeway. Local island residents were told it would take six months or more to restore the bridges, and so they appealed to the state for help. We took up the challenge and three days later we opened a rebuilt Pine Island bridge. And two weeks after that, we were able to reopen the Sanibel Causeway after it had been severed in three locations."

Introducing a number of special guests in the audience, DeSantis said business owner Stephen Soloway helped Pine Island residents with supplies brought in by boat; school teacher Julie Wappes continued to teach students in the wake of the hurricane; Barbara Morgan received a temporary trailer from the state while her damaged home was rehabbed; former Maryland police officer Mercedes Phillips joined the Cape Coral Police Department through the state's bonus program; Tiqkia Barrow and Melissa Matz retained their teaching positions with a salary increase; concerned parent Alicia Farrant, who was able to obtain a position on the Orange County School Board; medical professionals nurse Raeanne Champion and radiologist Dr. Tim Boyett; truck driver Kurt Corwin; Chloe Cole, who underwent a double mastectomy as a teenager and now advocates against allowing these procedures; **Kim Kelly**, who lost her son to fentanyl poisoning; and Stacy Kaszuba, who was assaulted by an illegal alien.

The Governor also said he was happy to be joined by his wife, **First Lady Casey DeSantis**, who following her successful battle against breast cancer, and is now cancer-free, has

spearheaded efforts "to help our youth avoid drugs, promote emotional resiliency in schools, and provide a pathway to prosperity for the less fortunate."

He said she also has helped launch the Cancer Connect Collaborative, which will rethink Florida's battle against cancer by breaking down longstanding silos between researchers, cancer facilities and medical providers to provide and improve research and treatment.

DeSantis praised last year's State Legislature, saying they "worked together to reduce the pain of inflation by enacting over \$1 billion in tax relief in this current year's budget, and by slashing tolls by 50 percent for Florida commuters for this calendar year. That will save some families more than \$1,000."

Regarding illegal immigration, DeSantis said, "We believe that borders matter and we have fought in the state of Florida – from banning sanctuary cities to suing the Biden Administration over its catch and release policies to transporting illegal aliens to sanctuary jurisdictions. We have put Floridians first and we will continue to do that."

He also said that "Florida has provided the strongest protections for medical freedom during the coronavirus pandemic of any state in the country. We have prohibited COVID shot mandates in schools, we have banned vaccine passports and we have protected Floridians from losing their jobs due to their personal decision about whether to take or not take the COVID jab."

November's election results, he said, "represent a vindication of our joint efforts over these past four years. The results also vest in us the responsibility to lead and provide us the opportunity to shoot for the stars. Boldness be our friend in this endeavor. We have a lot we need to accomplish."

Florida's \$2 billion tax cut package, he said, "is the largest tax cut package in Florida history. It will help many who need relief from inflation, especially our Florida families. By permanently eliminating sales tax on all baby supplies, diapers, wipes, closed cribs, strollers, we will be able to say that in Florida, having a child will be tax free. We are proud to be pro-family and we are proud to be pro-life in the state of Florida."



But while the economy has consistently outperformed the nation as a whole, DeSantis said, the legal system should be centered on achieving justice, not lining the pockets of lawyers.

He said new **House Speaker Paul Renner** "is stepping up to deliver much needed legal reform and I thank him for

helping Florida reach its full economic potential.

"Our state is growing. Americans are voting with their feet and we need to ensure that we're getting ahead of the population expansion by accelerating infrastructure projects. Our Moving Florida Forward infrastructure initiative will expedite 20 major interstate and roadway projects over the next four years. This will allow these projects to be completed a decade ahead of schedule and just think of how much time that will save Floridians from having to sit in the awful traffic that they sometimes have to do," he added.

He said he also wanted to thank new **Senate President Kathleen Passidomo** for tackling issues head on, "and I look forward to working with her to deliver big results."

Other projects for the state, DeSantis said, include continuing our stewardship of Florida's natural resources by supporting additional water quality and Everglades



restoration efforts; making permanent the protection against unwanted medical interventions; continuing the momentum with K through 12 education; increasing penalties for fentanyl dealers by treating them as the murderers that they are; increasing penalties for human smuggling; and ensuring that our bail system is conducive to public safety.

Saying the Chinese Communist Party represents" the greatest economic, strategic and security threat that our country faces," DeSantis said that "We in Florida long recognized this and have taken action such as banning the CCPs Confucius Institutes at our state colleges and universities."

The Governor concluded his remarks with "Together we have made Florida the nation's most desired destination and we have produced historic results. But now's not the time to rest on our laurels. We have the opportunity and indeed the responsibility to swing for the fences so that we can ensure Florida remains number one...We will stand strong. We will hold the line. We won't back down. And I can promise you this, you ain't seen nothing yet."

Passidomo, in her opening session remarks, declared that the "eyes of the nation are on Florida this year," praised Governor DeSantis, and predicted long hours and working weekends for the next 60 days as the Senate tackles such high-profile issues as permitless carry, expansion of school choice and limiting lawsuits against businesses.

Renner outlines an expansive agenda in the House, while indicating he also supports the priorities of DeSantis and Passidomo, such as eliminating diversity, equity and inclusion protocols and programs from universities, and spurring more affordable housing projects. He also called for the elimination of the public-private partnership agency Enterprise Florida, for over-promised and under-delivered projects.



### CPAC RETURNS TO D.C. AREA

After meeting in Orlando, Florida, for two years during the Coronavirus pandemic, the

Conservative Political Action Conference (CPAC) returned to National Harbor, Maryland, outside of Washington, D.C., March 1-4 for its 2023 session attended by several thousand conservative activists from throughout the United States, and once again closed with remarks from former **President Donald Trump.** 

This time, however, **Florida Governor Ron DeSantis**, who opened last year's conference, did not attend, and neither did several other politicians who are expected to challenge Trump's re-election bid in 2024.

At the unofficial straw poll at the conclusion of CPAC 2023, attendees once again showed that Trump is their presidential choice. He was selected first in 62 percent of the votes cast, while DeSantis came in second at 20 percent. In third place, with 5 percent, was Michigan businessman **Perry Johnson**, who ran a Super Bowl ad for his long-short campaign for the Republican nomination. Former **South Carolina Governor Nikki Haley** gained just three percent of the votes cast to come in fourth, and all other names on the ballot were at one percent or less.



Trump's speech, which also was televised, lasted nearly two hours, and he exclaimed that "In 2016, I declared, 'I am your voice.' Today I add: I am your warrior, I am your justice, and for those who have been wronged and betrayed, I am your retribution!"

Casting himself as "the only Republican candidate who can build on his White House legacy," he told a cheering crowd that he was engaged in his "final battle....to finish what we started."

He said his agenda for a second term as president included restrictions on gender-affirming care and transgender athletes, and he promised to "obliterate" the Deep State. "We will expel the war mongers...We will drive out the globalists, we will cast out the communists. We will throw off the political

class that hates our country. They actually hate our country," he said.

Trump also denounced the lawlessness of the Southern border and reiterated his calls for election integrity. "We will beat the Democrats. We will rout the fake news media; we will expose and appropriately deal with the RINOs. We will evict Joe Biden from the White House, and we will liberate America from these villains and scoundrels once and for all," he said.

He pledged to "fire the unelected bureaucrats and shadow forces who have upon retaking the White House and cutting funding for Ukraine and defending America's borders instead and vowed to issue full pardons and an apology to January 6 detainees." weaponized our justice system"

Republicans, Trump added, must "change our thinking" on early and mail-in voting after Republican losses in 2020 and 2022 – a dramatic reversal from past thoughts about only voting on Election Day.

"I am the only candidate who can make this promise: I will prevent World War Three," Trump said. "And I promise you this: If you put me back in the White House, America will be a free nation once again."

Here are some brief remarks from some of the other speakers at the CPAC event:

Ohio Congressman Jim Jordan, commenting on the divide in America between those who are normal and those who are crazy, said "Crazy is thinking that boys can compete against girls in sports. Crazy is thinking you should defund the police, crazy is thinking you should let non-citizens vote, which DC just passed. Crazy is letting what you know to be a Chinese spy balloon fly clear across the country for a week and then shooting it down."

Louisiana Senator John Kennedy said that while he does not hate anyone, "the Biden administration sucks" when it comes to handling the border, the Afghanistan withdrawal and COVID-19. "If you put President Biden in charge of the Sahara Desert, he would run out of sand," Kennedy added. "If the aliens landed in Washington, D.C., tomorrow and said, 'Take me to your leader,' it would be embarrassing."

**Texas Senator Ted Cruz** also criticized the President, for his response to the Ohio train derailment; Dr. Anthony Fauci for his role during the COVID-19 pandemic, saying he should be jailed over his lies and mandates; and U.S. Attorney General Merrick Garland, calling him "the most partisan and politicized attorney general our nation has ever seen."

Former **Alaska Governor Sarah Palin**, supporting former President Donald Trump's 2024 bid, stressed that "He's got to get back in there and pick up where he left off," adding that his policies "were right for America."

Former Arizona Republican gubernatorial candidate **Kari Lake**, addressing CPAC's Ronald Reagan Dinner, praised former President Donald Trump as a "bull in a China shop" and

rejected the legitimacy of her November defeat for the governorship. She contended there is a battle between "the globalists vs. we the people" and characterized Trump as "the great champion on behalf of the people."

Georgia Congresswoman Marjorie Taylor Greene announced that she would be re-introducing a bill to protect children from being chemically castrated and mutilated, which the left calls gender-affirming care.

**Ashli Babbit**'s mother received a standing ovation from attendees when it was announced from the stage that she was in attendance. Her daughter was the 35-year-old unarmed Air Force veteran who was shot and killed inside the U.S. Capitol on January 6, 2021, by a police officer who would later be cleared of any wrongdoing.

**Florida Congressman Matt Gaetz** said he is calling for Democrats to be removed from the depositions of the House Weaponization Subcommittee.

Former Deputy Presidential Assistant **Sebastian Gorka** said, "The biggest threat we face are our fellow Americans who do not believe in America, we are living in a time that no civilization ever survives."

Former **South Carolina Senator Nikki Haley**, an announced U.S. presidential candidate for 2024, declared that "wokeness is a virus more dangerous than any pandemic."

Former Trump aide **Steve Bannon**, stressing support for his former boss, said the arrival of other Republican presidential candidates is "fine," but "we don't have time for on the job training" after "a man who gave us four years of peace and prosperity. Trump is not simply the leader of a political party, but the leader of the most powerful political movement in American history."

Former **Secretary of State Mike Pompeo** implored his audience to "never give an inch" — which coincidentally happens to be the title of his new book, but when it comes to Trump himself, he never mentioned his name.

Media Research Center founder and President Brent Bozell declared that the "dishonest and corrupt news media" are no longer liberal, they are full-blown Marxists. "When we started in 1987, we went after this thing called liberal media bias. It doesn't exist anymore," Bozell explained. "They could care less about the news. They don't report the news. They're weaponized."

Those Were The Days from a show that would never be aired today, "All In The Family".

As I listen to this tune during a rainy spring in Georgia and, on days like that,

Pimple balls and Spalding. There was Jax and hopscotch, shooting marbles.

Before you went to the movies it had to be approved by Mom, the ultimate chief that you didn't cross. For a quarter you got cartoons and a double feature. As you got older there was the drive-in theaters and hiding your friends in the trunk so they could get in without paying.

There were phrases that you don't hear too much today. "Thank You", "Please", "Yes, Sir or Yes, Ma'am". You respected your teachers and if you should have a bad day in school or had detention you would be more afraid of what would happen when you got home than you were afraid of going to the principal's office. There was no opting out of saying the Pledge of Allegiance and everyone placed their hands over their hearts and STOOD FOR THE NATIONAL ANTHYM.

# RENDEZVOUS WITH REPUBLICAN WOMEN By BFRW President Jill Gentis

The speaker at our March meeting was **Bob White,** 

chairman of the Republican Liberty Caucus of Florida and the Republican Liberty Caucus of Central East Florida headquartered here in Brevard County. He defined the RLC as a grassroots membership organization working within the Republican Party to invigorate and revitalize the Republican principles of individual rights, limited government, and free markets.



White reminded us that there are two seasons in Florida: the Political or Campaign Season and the Legislative Season,

which began in earnest on March 7 and continues for the next 60 days.

He then talked about the Political Season. During the endless Campaign Season, the RLC chapters are very active, seeking to identify and endorse the most constitutional and liberty minded candidates. The RLC takes the vetting process so seriously that it will only support candidates who are committed to liberty caucus values above their commitment to the Republican Party leadership.

The RLC website (rlcfl.org) contains a Legislative Action Center which identifies and tracks legislation important to the organization. A RLC sub-committee is notified whenever a bill of interest will be heard in committee. The sub-committee then enacts a Legislative Action Order by email, which provides about 3,000 RLC members with a synopsis and the RLC position on each bill. These members then send an email to each politician involved urging them to support or oppose the bill.

White said that **Florida Governor Ron DeSantis**, unlike most state leaders, is very active in following legislation. For example, when the Florida House proposal to reapportion Congressional Districts only gave the GOP a two-or-three seat advantage, DeSantis vetoed the proposal, made his own plan which gave the party an eight seat majority, and pushed it through the Legislature.

Ten significant Bills that the RLC is currently tracking, White said, are:

- 1.) "Conceal and Carry" gun bill. Although touted as a "Constitution Carry" Bill, it is not. The RLC opposes this bill because it does not go far enough and does not address open carry and other issues.
- 2.) "Sale of Firearms and Ammunition" bill. It prevents the Democrats from requiring credit card companies to assign a new category which identifies firearm or ammunition purchases specifically rather than general merchandise.
- 3.) "Campaign Finance Reform". There is a constitutional limit to donations made to a political candidate of \$1,000. However, each candidate can have political committees which can accept unlimited contributions. What's more troubling is that these political committees can make contributions to each other thus shielding all the lobbyists and interest groups that can have influence over the candidate, since only the last political committee in this long chain must be identified. These committees engage in legalized cash laundering. This bill would ban the practice of political committees from making contributions to each other but doesn't address political party committees. Party leadership uses funds collected in these accounts to control party membership by rewarding or punishing them if they don't follow the party line. For example, The Senate President political committee holds tremendous influence of members to vote for bills supported by the president.

- 4.) "District School Board Term Limits" Last year a House Bill limited District School Board members to a term of eight years, but a last-minute Senate amendment changed the term to 12 years. This bill returns the term limit to eight years.
- 5.) "County Commissioner Term Limits" This bill amends the Constitution to provide for all counties to set term limits on County Commissioners. Currently only Charter Counties can do so. Brevard is a Charter County.
- 6.) "Recall County Officers and Commissioners" is a similar bill which provides the ability to recall County Officers and Commissioners to all counties and not just the Charter Counties.
- 7.) "School Choice" Bill expands voucher program to allow students currently attending public schools to apply for scholarships to change to private schooling when funds become available.
- 8.) "Tax Rebate for Film Production and Digital Media Companies" Bill is designed to attract these industries to Florida. The RLC opposes any bill where the government gives preferential treatment or funding to private industry.
- 9.) "Government and Corporate Activists" bill outlaws government investment into WOKE Environmental and Social Government (ESG) organizations.
- 10.) "Criminal Justice Reform" bill requires that criminal records sealed at the state level must be also sealed by the county.

At the next BFRW luncheon on April 5, **Faustina Guzman-Trump**, FFRW District Representative, will speak about the Florida Federation of Republican Women activities at the upcoming "Legislative Days" in Tallahassee on April 14-16, and the activities planned by the National Federation of Republican Women for the upcoming year.

Mark your calendars for the BFRW May 3 luncheon, where we will once again "Back the Blue" by honoring two female Brevard Sheriff Deputies for their service. A Sheriff's Department representative will also discuss the problem of "Human Trafficking in Brevard County".



#### THE MAYFIELD MINUTE

Florida's January 2023 unemployment rate was 2.6 percent and remained lower than the national average for the 27<sup>th</sup> consecutive month. The state's private second employment grew by 5.3 percent

over the year in January 2023, 1.7 percent faster than the national rate of 3.6 percent over the same time period.

Florida Governor Ron DeSantis led 18 state governors in forming an alliance to push back against President Biden's environmental, social, corporate governance (ESG) agenda that is destabilizing the American economy and the global financial system. In a joint statement, these states committed to lead state-level efforts to protect individuals from the ESG movement that threatens the vitality of the American economy and Americans' economic freedom, such as removing all state pension funds and state-controlled investments from firms that follow the ESG model of "politics before fiduciary duty." -0-

Through April, Brightline will be testing trains in Brevard County at high speeds, up to 110-miles-per-hour, along a 13-mile section of track, involving multiple railroad crossings between 7 am and 4 pm daily.

The landing marked SpaceA's 177<sup>th</sup> successful booster recovery and its 32<sup>nd</sup> at Cape Canaveral.

Visitor Complex. The 20-minute show in the Universe Theatre features new puppetry, lights, laser projections, and sound effects. It portrays the Peanuts characters being called upon to assist the launch director on the Artemis human spaceflight missions for more than 50 years."

Kennedy Space Center Visitor Complex CEO Therrin Protze said, "This new show will delight guests of all ages as it features the lovable Peanuts characters who have contributed to the excitement for NASA missions."

Florida First Lady Casey DeSantis has become a champion for fighting cancer in the state, helping to secure \$100 million in recurring funding for cancer research and care. Declared cancer free by doctors in February 2022 herself, she travels the state visiting with patients to draw attention to the importance of early screening and to provide support and hope to families affected by cancer. Speaking to members of the Heritage Isle Republican Club on March 2, the chairman of the Brevard Republican Executive Committee, **Rick** 

Lacey, said that while the November 2022 Mid-term Election results generally were a disappointment for Republicans, that was NOT the case in Florida. It was "great" here, he said, reminding them that Florida Governor Ron DeSantis won his re-election bid by 76,000 votes in Brevard County alone, and more than 1.5 million state-



wide. We also flipped the "non-partisan" Brevard School Board from liberal to conservative, Lacey said, and state-wide, it was a clean sweep - retaining and adding Republican seats in Tallahassee and Washington. But now, he warned, "we have a target on our backs here, so we should not get too overconfident, because 2024 will be a challenge." Lacey also pointed out that while Republicans greatly outnumber Democrats in Brevard County, there also are many registered Independents here, and we need to reach them to switch to our side so they can be eligible to vote in primary elections. One problem, he pointed out, is when residents order automobile tags for the first time, or renewal tags, the Department of Motor Vehicles automatically registers them with the Supervisor of Elections office, and when Republicans specifically do not mention their party choice (often without realizing they are supposed to), DMV automatically registers them as No Party Affiliation. Lacey also said he is working to finalize who will be the speaker at the upcoming fundraising Lincoln-Reagan Dinner, and when it will take place. He said he hopes members can ask local businesses to advertise in the dinner program. He said BREC committees have been formed to focus on election integrity, liaison with elected officials, and encourage nonvoting registered Republicans to participate in the 2024 election. Lacey closed his remarks by mentioning a project he hopes to convince other Republican committees in the state to support – a campaign to encourage businesses to stop buying and selling products made in China. It is all right to buy a shirt made in India, or Mexico, or elsewhere, he said, as long as it is not from China, which is not our friend...The speaker for the April 6 HIRC meeting will be Matt Susin, chair of the Brevard School Board.

#### POLITICAL JOTTINGS AND DOTTINGS



--After former President Donald Trump declared his decision to run again for the Oval Office in 2024, the list of Republican hopefuls expanded with announcements by former South Carolina Governor and U.S. Ambassador to the United Nations Nikki Haley, millionaire

businessman and entrepreneur Vivek Ramaswamy, and Michigan businessman Perry Johnson. Other hopefuls are expected to join the crowd at later dates.

--Florida Surgeon General Dr. Joseph Ladapo selected Brevard County Commissioner for District 5 Kristine Zonka to be the new administrator of the Florida Department of Health in Brevard, and the other County Commissioners — with her recusal — unanimously approved the appointment. Zonka, who succeeds retiring administrator Maria Stahl, is a



nurse practitioner in family practice with Health First Medical Group, and also serves at the medical group as one of two medical directors for advanced practice providers like nurse practitioners and physician assistants. Zonka left her County Commission seat early and will begin her new job – where she will have a staff of about 400 employees – next month. Under state statute and the Brevard County Charter, **Florida Governor Ron DeSantis** could appoint someone to fill the County Commission vacancy since there are less than 28 months remaining in her term.

--Chicago's leftist Mayor Lori Lightfoot is the Windy City's first one to lose a re-election bid since 1983 – no thanks to her plummeting popularity due to rising crime and COVID. On February 28, she came in third among eight candidates competing, gaining just 16.6 percent of the vote. The top two vote getters – former Chicago Public Schools CEO Paul Vallas, with 35 percent; and Cook County Commissioner Brandon Johnson, with 20.3 percent, will compete in a run-off election on April 4.

--The Republican Liberty Caucus, which each year publishes a scorecard on where members of Congress stand on being defenders of liberty, reported that in 2022, five Republican members of the House of Representatives scored perfect 100's

- Andy Biggs of Arizona, Dan Bishop of North Carolina, Thomas Massie of Kentucky, Chip Roy of Texas and Marjorie Taylor Greene of Georgia – and just one Republican U.S. Senator – Rand Paul of Kentucky. The lowest scoring Republican House voter was Adam Kinsinger of Illinois, with 20, and there was a three-way tie in the Senate at 25, among Roy Blunt of Missouri, Susan Colllins of Maine, and Lisa Murkowski of Alaska.

--Following a censure by the Medina County Republican Party, RINO Texas Congressman Tony Gonzalez received a second censure from the Republican Party of Texas over his votes in support of same-sex marriage and gun control policies, and against border security measures.

This month's "winners" are:

--President Joe Biden, for his latest gaffe involving Jimmy Carter, who with waning

health was in hospice care but still hanging on. At a private Democrat fund-raising dinner in California, Biden referred to the former president, and said, "He asked me to do his eulogy – excuse me, I shouldn't have said that."

- --Zishan Alvi, the co-owner of Laboratory Elite in Chicago, for being charged by a federal grand jury with 10 counts of wire fraud and one count of theft of government funds through a fraudulent COVID-19 testing scheme. The indictment alleges that the tests were either not performed, or done in a way that results were unreliable, and the company received more than \$83 million in federal funding, with some of the money allegedly transferred to Alvi's personal account for buying vehicles, stocks and cryptocurrency.
- --"Proud progressive" Milwaukee County Judge Janet Protasiewicz, a candidate for a seat on the Wisconsin State Supreme Court, for issuing a get-out-of-jail-free card to a man who was charged with sexual assault of a 15-year-old girl, the daughter of his then-girlfriend, who was not at home at the time. According to court documents, Patrick McCaskill took a plea deal, and even though jail time was on the table, the soft-on-crime judge only gave him probation. And that was not the only "just probation" sentence handed down by this judge.
- --New York Attorney General Letitia James, for hosting a "Drag Story Hour" for families with children that she sponsored for the drag group "Drag Story Hour NYC." Her flyer indicated she wanted children to attend the event, which was co-sponsored by The Pride Center of Staten Island, Queens Public Library, Brooklyn Public Library, and Destination Tomorrow, a grassroots, LGBTQ organization in the Bronx.
- --Newly elected Miami City Commissioner Democrat Sabina Covo, who was attending her first meeting, after being asked by the Commission Chairwoman to open it by leading the group in the Pledge of Allegiance, declined, saying she did not know the pledge. So, she was excused. Yes, she is an immigrant from Colombia but she has lived in Miami for at least 22 years.
- --The Boca Raton, Florida, City Council, for spending close to \$300,000 of taxpayer funds to hold an unnecessary special election. The only item on the ballot was a measure to extend their terms of office, which the citizens rejected by a 3-2 margin.

#### YOU CAN'T MAKE THIS UP

--People support and oppose political candidates for numerous reasons, but here's one that ranks among the cream of the crop: "Vanity Fair" writer Bess Levin wrote that Florida Governor Ron DeSantis should be



disqualified from ever being President, because FOUR YEARS AGO on a private plane trip, he allegedly ate a chocolate pudding using three of his fingers instead of a spoon. Horrifying!

- --The Florida Department of Education issued a press release announcing that Governor Ron DeSantis would be hosting "a roundtable discussion exposing the diversity, equity and inclusion scam in higher education" in the state. Tampa-based Axios reporter Ben Montgomery then noted it by writing "this is propaganda, not a press release." That did not sit too well with Axios management, and Montgomery is now looking for a new job.
- --The self-declared "health geniuses" at CNN believe their published report that Daylight Savings Time which began again this March 12 disproportionately affects the sleep and health of minority communities. Since people of color "have a higher number of health problems than do Caucasians," CNN argues, "this means observing DST is more dangerous for them, and therefore it is racist."
- --The Hershey Chocolate Company faced a social media backlash for issuing in Canada a commercial honoring International Women's Day, but featuring a biological male dressed as a woman. On the short video promoting a limited-edition candy bar with his image on it was a "Two-Spirit, Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, Transgender, Queer and/or Questioning, Intersex, Asexual" named Fae Johnstone. That's the Her-She Company in action.
- --After Hershey's woke announcement, the Daily Wire co-CEO Jeremy Boreing said he would be rolling out his own line of chocolate bars, with two kinds: HeHim and SheHer. Guess which one contains nuts. In just the first day of sales, Boreing said more than 100,000 bars of the non-woke candy were sold.
- --In Carbon County, Montana, Elections Clerk Crystal Roascio was seen on a video obtained through the Freedom of Information Act shredding 21 piles of documents that looked like ballots. She said they were absentee ballots that had been counted, and then according to Montana and federal law they were shredded for privacy reasons, because they had the voters' names on them. The question is, though is that what actually happened?
- --The girls' basketball team from Mid Vermont Christian School was set to play the Long Tail Mountain Lions in the Green Mountain State's championship tournament, when officials at the Christian school decided on concerns for player safety and fairness instead, and to forfeit the match and withdraw from the tournament because a transgender player

was on the opposing team. "Allowing biological males to participate in women's sports sets a bad precedent for the future of women's sports in general," a Christian school senior administrator said. But in Vermont, state law permits transgenders to play in sports leagues, and prohibits discrimination based upon gender identity.

--Father and parent rights activist Shawn McBreairty is suing the Hermon, Maine School District after Superintendent Micah Grant called the police on him while he was reviewing school documents under a Freedom of Information Act request. The documents in question were superintendent-training materials and communications related to the district's Gay Sexuality Alliance Club organized by an LGBT+ group. He was watched for less than an hour while reading the documents and was refused a copy to take or be allowed to photograph it. McBreairty did agree with police to leave the premises, but said Grant never gave him a time limit to view the documents.

--The Woke Disney Company's latest move to appease it's new "best friends" is to remove the beloved song "Zip-a-Dee-Doo-Dah" from its daily parade at Disneyland. The song – prominently featured in the 1946 classic film "Song of the South" – has brought countless joy to millions of Americans. The film is set in the post-Civil War South and explores the friendship between a white boy and an elderly black man, so woke critics called the song "racist." The songwriters were known for writing songs that included nonsensical words, including "Supercalifragilisticexpialdocious" from "Mary Poppins" and "Bibbidi-Bobbidi-Boo" from "Cinderella." Making up words was their trademark. It was gibberish -- much like the arguments from the cancel culture mob.

--When a clerk at a Fullerton, California, gas station heard cries coming from a restroom, an abandoned newborn baby was found in a trash can and transported to a hospital in critical but stable condition. After investigating the incident, Fullerton police arrested the suspected mother – 25-year-old local resident Venissa Maldonado and charged her with attempted murder and felony child abuse.

--Three Vermont cities – Burlington, Montpelier and Winooski – are allowing non-citizens living in the state to vote in local elections. And even though the Republican National Committee filed a lawsuit, arguing that it was against the state's constitution, the Vermont Supreme Court ruled that there was no constitutional violation. It seems there is nothing green about the Green Mountain State.

--Despite warnings from the Florida Department of Business and Professional Regulation to not allow young children to be exposed to sexually inappropriate content, the James L. Knight Center in Miami hosted "A Drag Queen Christmas" performance at which children were present. The Hyatt Regency Miami owns the liquor license at the facility, and now the DeSantis administration has announced the hotel's license is being revoked.

--After the "Sacramento Bee" newspaper falsely carried an article claiming that Turning Point USA founder Charlie Kirk

had "called for the murder of trans people," Antifa protesters smashed windows and doors at the University of California Davis campus and disrupted a program in which Kirk had been speaking. The protesters were arrested, and school officials said their policy does not allow the cancellation of a speaker invited by a registered campus organization, but the speaker's remarks will be closely monitored to ensure that no "danger to the campus" lines are crossed.

Utkin named the mercenary group Wagner after his GRU call name and passion for German composer Richard Wagner, who was Hitler's favorite composer. Utkin has not made a public appearance since 2016.... By being "private", the Wagner atrocities are not labeled acts of the Russian state and are, therefore, in the 'gray zone' of activities that lie between state kinetic force and normal diplomatic action. In Syria, Wagner has supported Russia in its efforts to prop up the Assad regime and protect the Russian naval base in Tartus. In February 2018, a 500-plus force of Wagner Group mercenaries and Syrian forces attempted to take out a small U.S. Marine and Special Forces outpost in the Kurdish area of Syria established to fight ISIS.... In Ukraine, the Wagner Group was deployed as locals in support of the annexation of Crimea and the Donbas region. With the Russian army's invasion of Ukraine in February 2022, the Wagner Group became part of the fighting force.... The Wagner Group is active in Africa and has stationed approximately 5,000 men across the continent, filling the void left by departing European and American forces. Wagner is expanding alliances with the Central African Republic, Chad, Sudan, Mali, Burkina Faso, Ivory Coast, Libya, and Mozambique. By forming alliances and protecting the various African country government leaders from Islamic jihadists, Wagner is gaining access and control of mines worth billions of dollars in strategic minerals.... The alliances also further Russian political objectives of undermining Western democracies - many African countries abstained or voted

against U.N. resolutions condemning the Russian invasion of Ukraine. Since 2015, Russia has signed 19 military collaboration agreements with African countries to supply arms. In South America, the Wagner Group has been active in Venezuela, supporting Russian interests. One activity is designing and implementing Nicolas Maduro's security circle along with Cuban agents. Maduro is a communist autocrat who succeeded Hugo Chavez as ruler of Venezuela. Chavez and Maduro together have taken the country down the socialist road to tyranny, poverty, and scarcity despite having the largest known oil reserves in the world.... Russia has deployed military equipment, troops, and mercenaries (Wagner Group) to train Venezuelans in equipment, espionage, and surveillance. In the resource-rich Orinoco Basin, Russians protect and control companies extracting the minerals. Recent elections in Latin America have resulted in leftists/communists winning power. Increased penetration by Russia and China is following" .... What can the United States do to counter Wagner and Russia? Continue to support Ukraine - how and with what is the subject for another day. Build and develop alliances with countries and organizations opposed to totalitarian China and Russia. Rebuild America's military, economy, and infrastructure."

"The U.S.-Mexico border, at this point, is one of the most chaotic, over-trafficked and outright dangerous borders in the world. The tragic killing of two U.S. citizens in the border town of



Matamoros, Mexico, should, in a just world, refocus American attention on the glaring problem of transnational drug cartels' de facto control of large swaths of our perilously porous southern border. That the two Americans killed may have been mistaken by warring cartel clans for Haitian drug smugglers, as "The Dallas Morning News" reported, hardly ameliorates the awful situation or lessens our imperative to recalibrate attention away from faraway proxy wars of dubious national interest, and toward the very monsters in our own backyard who run the Western hemisphere's worst human trafficking rings and flood the U.S. interior with the most lethal drugs known to man. Vicious cartels, such as Sinaloa and Jalisco, engage in gang shootouts in outlaw fashion, with narv a Mexican law enforcement agent in sight – and even those in sight are more likely than not to be bribed, and in the cartels' pockets. Human trafficking rings, often working hand in hand with the cartels and opportunistic 'coyotes' who promise to smuggle vulnerable migrants into the U.S., parade hordes of Central American and Caribbean migrants through the Mexican interior and right up to the border. The humanitarian conditions on these migrant 'caravans' are typically abysmal; drugs are rampant, children are exploited and far too many women are raped. Drugs flow across the border like never before; the U.S. drug overdose crisis, which is primarily a fentanyl crisis, is nearly exclusively a phenomenon of the cartels. Drug overdose deaths in America last year reached an

unconscionable 106,000-plus, or over 290 daily. That is the functional equivalent of a mid-size commercial airliner falling out of the sky each day; and here, as is the case with fentanyl, those proverbial airliners falling out of the sky would be predominantly packed with those under the age of 35. This tragedy is America's single greatest humanitarian failing, at the present time.... One straightforward and potentially highly effective policy the Biden administration should announce would be to designate the leading drug cartels as State Department-recognized Foreign Terrorist Organizations. Doing this would allow the U.S. government to use various means to financially suffocate the cartels and deprive them of their funding sources. It would also aid law enforcement. Democrats' typical response is that such a formal designation would complicate diplomatic relations with Mexico, but that barely passes the laugh test: Mexico has just as much – if not more – of an interest in cracking down on the cartels as the U.S., but it cannot publicly say so, let alone act upon that interest, due to the cartels' successful bribery and corruption of the all-too-venal Mexican government.... From 1910 to 1919, the Mexican Border War unfolded in a series of military engagements along the border. After Pancho Villa's infamous attack on Columbus, New Mexico, in 1916, decorated U.S. Army General John J. Pershing launched the 'Punitive Expedition' (or the 'Pancho Villa Expedition') into northern Mexico. It was only partially successful, but the U.S. Army did manage to kill Villa's two top lieutenants. It is now time for another 'Punitive Expedition' into northern Mexico. With cartel violence, drug peddling and the sheer invasion of illegal aliens at the border the worst they have ever been, the U.S. has little choice but to affirmatively act."

Author **Bob Unruh**, writing on Republican president candidate p romising to fire half of federal employees at WND.com:

"It's not likely at this point that announced 2024 GOP presidential candidate **Vivek Ramaswamy** is anything but a longshot for the nomination. So maybe tens of thousands



of federal workers won't have to worry about losing their jobs. Unless, of course, other candidates pick up on the ideas of the entrepreneur, in that the Constitution doesn't allow civil service protections, or public sector unions. He says he'd fire "at least half" the federal workforce. A report at 'Just the News' explained he cited the Constitution's Article Two to support his position. 'It says the president of the United States runs the federal government, runs specifically the executive branch of the federal government. That means, I think, a lot of those civil service protections are unconstitutional,' he explained. 'If somebody works for you, and you can't fire them, then they don't actually work for you,' reasons Ramaswamy, author of 'Woke, Inc.: Inside America's Corporate Social Justice Scam.' He said, 'I actually would just proceed with firing a good portion of the federal workforce. I think it's going to be at least half of the federal workforce. And will that end up in litigation? It will. But I think this Supreme Court...shares that view. I think we use that to set judicial precedent to make sure that

never again is there a president whose gobbled up by the administrative state that supposedly works for him, but actually has the relationship the other way around.' That provision in the U.S. Constitution lets a U.S. president oversee the federal workforce. Ramaswamy said other efforts to eliminate agencies haven't succeeded, but there's a reason. 'They defer to Congress. The problem is Congress has an institutional bias...the way you run the executive branch is not the purview of Congress. It is the purview of the executive, the person who leads the executive branch of government.' He said his plans would include eliminating the Department of Education and moving other bureaucracies out of Washington.... Also, something 'new' needs to replace the FBI, he said. And those unions for government workers? 'If you're a public servant and you're unionizing, who exactly are you unionizing against? The very public you intend to serve. I don't think there needs to be any special protections for public employee unions, and I don't think we should hedge about it," Ramaswamy said."
